“We’re Sorry for Saying that the Earth is Flat”

How does biblical interpretation influence our understanding of science? Consider passages such as Genesis 1-2, Job 38, Is 11:12, and Rev 7:1.

What role does science have with respect to worship? Do you (or have you) experience(d) God through the science? How?

Do you find yourself becoming angry when you hear about scientific potential/advancements (such as evolutionary finds, genetically modified organisms, etc)? If so, why do you think that you respond this way? Is this is healthy reaction?

What role (if any) should Christians play in scientific endeavours (such as stem cell research)? What do you base your opinion on?

Romans 1:20 says, “For since the creation of the world God’s invisible qualities — his eternal power and divine nature — have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made...” How do scientific advances relate to this text? What does this tell us about scientific “truth”?

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
