



## **Journey Group Lesson for “The Never-Ending Story” – March 28, 2010**

### **Getting Started (Everyone Answer)**

Think about some of your favorite stories or movies. How do those stories or movies end? What do you like about those endings?

If you were writing a story about your life, how would it ideally end?

When you think about the end of the world, what do you think about? What will it be like?

### **Digging Deeper**

Read Revelation 21.

How does the “The Story of Everything” end? What two destinies await mankind at the end of “The Story of Everything”?

What do you think are some common myths about heaven? What do you think heaven will be like?

What does Revelation 21 say heaven will be like?

What do you think heaven would be like if Jesus was not there? Do you think you would be happy in a heaven without Jesus there? Why or why not?

Do you think the average person on the street believes in the reality of hell? Why do you think this is so?

What is our responsibility as believers towards those who do not know him? With whom are you sharing “The Story of Jesus”?

### **Bringing It Home**

We all get to write the endings of our own story. We can choose either heaven or hell. And ultimately it’s not about the destination, it’s about a relationship with the Creator, the One who loved us so much that he gave His Son. What are you choosing? We also have an opportunity and responsibility to share God’s love with those who are far from him. How are you doing in this area?
