If you are new here, **welcome!** We are so glad you've come to worship in-person or online. If you are worshipping online, you may find it helpful to prepare a worship space around you. Light a candle and gather bread and wine (or juice). If you are in the church building, here are some helpful tips:

**Bathrooms** are located out the side doors. A handicap bathroom (with a changing table) is across from the nursery.

**Children** are always welcome. Worship activity bags are in the entryway. The nursery is open but not staffed.

**Hearing-impaired**. If it is difficult to hear any of the service, please ask an usher for a personal amplifier.

**Holy Communion** is celebrated at each worship service. The table is open to all who believe in the redeeming power of Christ's love. Please ask the server if you need a gluten-free wafer.

**Livestream Worship (9:30 am).** Audio / Video are "live" on our Facebook page before and after service. A reminder that conversations may be heard on the internet.

**To protect and welcome all people** - every other pew is reserved to maintain social distancing and face coverings are *strongly recommended* for people who are not fully vaccinated.




### Second Reading: James 1:17-27 (pp. 246-247 NT)


