Welcome! Here are a few things to know...

Bathrooms are located out the side doors. A handicap bathroom (with a changing table) is located across from the nursery. An usher can direct you.

Children are full participants in a life of faith at St. John, welcome to sing, pray, and take Holy Communion. Worship activity bags are in the entryway when kids need extra activity. The nursery is open but not staffed.

Holy Communion is celebrated at each worship service. The table is open to all who believe in the redeeming power of Christ's love. Ask the server if you need a gluten-free wafer.


The communion liturgy begins with the Great Thanksgiving when, together, we offer thanks for God's saving acts.




