



The Gospel of Mark (AD 67)

Mark is known especially for his expression "immediately," External evidence indicates that Mark wrote what he had so often heard Peter preach. Eusebius wrote that the Romans [Christians] persuaded Mark to write the Scriptures called the Gospel of Mark (Nicene and Post-Nicene Fathers of the Christian Church, 1:115-116.). Justin wrote that Mark styled his Gospel, "Peter's memoirs" (Ibid, 1:116.).



Mark wrote of Jesus as a Servant. He wrote for the Roman stoic mind which thrilled at one's achieving victory through apparent defeat. There is a certain affinity between Mark's Gospel and Peter's "first epistle." Peter never forgot his denial of Christ on that tragic night when the cock crowed twice. He, perhaps more than any other man, came to understand and appreciate what a servant Jesus the Christ was and what a sacrifice he made for all humanity.

Mark's Gospel is somewhat a parallel to Peter's first epistle as well as his discourse as recorded by Luke in Acts 10, as follows:

- Mark, like Peter, introduced John the Baptist
- Mark, like Peter, wrote of both the baptism and temptation of Christ
- Mark, like Peter, set forth the Servant's defeat and final triumph.
- Mark, like Peter, wrote of how that the Christ manifested Himself to His apostles and disciples after His

To conclude, Matthew wrote of Christ as the "King," Luke wrote of Him as the "Redeemer," and Mark wrote of Him as the "Servant."
