PALLET TABLE

Clean up an old pallet and make yourself a new upcycled coffee table!

MATERIALS

- Old Pallet
- 60-80 grit Sandpaper
- 12 Wood screws
- 4 Large Caster Wheels or old Table Legs
- ¼ -3/8" thick Glass- cut to size (optional)
- Wood Stain (optional)
- Spray Paint (optional)

TOOLS

- Screwdriver/Drill
- Palm Sander or Sanding Block
- Paint/Stain Brush



START!

STEP 1 Begin by sanding the entire pallet, to remove any debris and splinters. It doesn't need to be perfectly smooth; a little imperfection is part of its charm. Wipe it down afterwards to remove the sanding dust.



STEP 2

If you would like to, you can stain or paint your pallet, or leave it natural. Be certain that you cover all of it, including underneath for a more professional look.



DESIGN TIP:

Try stacking 2 pallets together for extra storage.

STEP 3

Decide what you will be using for legs. The larger pallets look great with just a set of large industrial looking caster wheels that you can find at most home improvement stores. Another option is to take the legs from an old or broken table and repurpose them for use on your new table.



STEP 4

If using existing table legs, finish them however you like.

If painting, try spray paint to get a nice even finish.



STEP 5

The last step is to attach the legs. Turn your pallet upside down and attach your legs to the 4 corners. Attachment methods will vary depending on the type of legs that you're attaching.



STEP 6

Turn your new upcycled pallet table over, and if adding glass, place that on top and you're finished! Find the perfect spot for your new pallet table and enjoy.
