Authorisation is granted to
to receive and process relevant susceptible material originating from within the demarcated area subject to the
conditions listed below.

Changes to details of named individuals should be advised to the Forestry Commission.

Changes to operations within the processing site which would alter the nature of the sawmilling residues should be
advised and agreed with the Forestry Commission to retain validity of this authorisation.

See below for general and site specific conditions.

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B. TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

1. General

(a) A segregated area of hardstanding must be provided within the authorised premises for **stacking relevant susceptible** material from the demarcated area and all sawmilling residues and plant debris must be swept up from this area and kept segregated and disposed of as set out below, and;

(b) an area of hardstanding must be designated within the authorised premises at all times for **sweeping down vehicles** after unloading susceptible relevant material. All sawmilling residues and plant debris must be swept up from this area and kept segregated and disposed of as set out below, and;

(c) no vehicles delivering relevant susceptible material from the demarcated area to the premises must be allowed to leave the authorised premises until they have been swept clean, and ;

(d) all relevant susceptible material including sawmilling residues from the demarcated area , unless specified below in section 3, must be processed:

- i. within 14 days of delivery, if the processing is carried out during the period February 1st and October 31st
- ii. within 8 days of delivery, if the processing is carried out during the period November 1st to January 31st

(e) all relevant susceptible material including sawmilling residues and plant debris, unless specified below in section 3 must:

- i. Be burnt on site, or
- ii. Manufactured into products, such as panel board products, or wood pellets or briquettes, on site by means of an agreed process utilising heat and/or pressure or chemical process, or
- iii. Dried on site to a moisture content below 20%

(f) I understand that the premises may be visited by an authorised Plant Health Inspector at any reasonable time for the purpose of ensuring that these conditions are being complied with. I understand that records of all deliveries of susceptible material from the demarcated area and records of all consignments of plant debris and sawmilling residues derived from spruce material from the demarcated area shall be made available to the inspector on request.

(g) I agree to Additional site specific conditions detailed below in section 3

(h) The authorisation will be valid for **12 months** from date of approval.

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C DEFINITIONS:

For the purposes of this authority the following terms are defined:

"relevant susceptible material" shall mean

(a) any wood of the genus *Picea* A. Dietr., other than in the form of wood packaging material or dunnage, which—

(i) retains all or part of its bark; **or**

(ii) is in the form of chips, waste wood, logs, billets, twigs, faggots or is in other similar forms;

(b) any isolated bark of the genus *Picea* A. Dietr.;

(c) any trees of the genus *Picea* A. Dietr., over three metres in height, including felled or fallen trees, other than fruit, seeds, leaves or foliage.

"Sawmilling residue and plant debris" means any material, organic or otherwise, that arises as a consequence of keeping, handling and processing relevant susceptible material. It does not include material [recovered] which is bark free, or has been subject to an approved phytosanitary measure, which has not restrictions placed upon it.

"Processing site" means any part of the authorised premises where the relevant susceptible material is [stored or] processed.
