



Frequently Asked Questions



How much does Camp cost?

A \$10 non-refundable application fee is due to hold your child's spot for each camp session. The camp fee due on the first day of camp is based on income documented on the Summer Food Service Program Form that is required to be filled out by each camper. Based on the information received, your camp fee may be waived and \$5 of your \$10 application fee will be placed on a Snac Shac card for your camper. No camper will be charged more than \$10 per day. After we receive your registration packet (two forms needed to have actual signatures) you will be sent your camp fee. Your camp fee is to be brought on check in day in the form of cash or check made out to The Salvation Army. At check-in you will also be able to put money in the camp bank for your child to use while visiting the Camps Snac Shac.

How do I sign my child up for camp?

When are applications DUE?

You must sign up, fill out the online application and turn in the two required forms no later than two (2) weeks prior to your child attending camp. Turn forms in ASAP to ensure that your child gets placed in their session choices. Complete applications will take priority over incomplete applications and the **\$10 non-refundable fee is required to reserve your campers spot.**

How do I know if my child has been accepted?

You will receive a confirmation e-mail from Jamie after the two paper forms are submitted with your camp fee.

Archery, ropes course, swimming, arts & crafts, field games, chapel meetings, boating, cabin devotions, campfires, music & drama, basketball, volleyball & much more! **Activities are supervised at all times. Water activities are always supervised by lifeguards who are American Red Cross Certified. All staff are Red Cross trained in first aid & CPR. We've conducted background checks to be sure your children are with the best camp staff. During camp, we are in constant contact with staff by radio, and are immediately available to handle, as a team, any circumstance that might arise.**

Can I visit Camp?

Parents and guardians are asked to not visit their child during camp as we have found this promotes homesickness. If you would like to schedule a visit to camp prior to your child attending you may call 402-291-1912.
