

The Salvation Army—Serving Sedgwick County

- **Foster Care** – Foster Care provides homes for over 70 children, ages infant to 20. Placement is required due to neglect, abandonment or abuse. The program also provides homes for children with severe emotional and behavioral problems. Foster Care provides professionally trained, licensed social workers for ongoing support for the family.
- **Homeless Services** – The Salvation Army's Homeless Services operates a seven bedroom, 28 bed emergency shelter for families and single women who are without other resources.
- **Supportive Services for Veterans and their Families (SSVF)** – Provides assistance to low-income Veterans and their families in obtaining and maintaining permanent stable housing.
- **Hiawatha Camp & Retreat Center** – The 42 acre campus provides a natural setting that is used throughout the year by various groups. The Salvation Army operates a summer day camp along with overnight camping at the site for children in first through eighth grades.
- **Disaster Services** - Provides relief to victims and emergency workers at disaster sites. The mobile canteen is equipped to serve meals and beverages.
- **Emergency Social Services** – Emergency Social Services provides services to people needing monthly assistance. This includes helping with food, clothing, and transportation.
- **Pathway of Hope** – is a 12 month program that works with families needing guidance to set goals and work toward self-sufficiency. Families work with a case manager to set weekly goals to achieve training in parenting, budgeting, and job training.
- **Corps Community Centers**— The Salvation Army has two places of worship that also serve residents in their area with Emergency Social Services and pastoral care.

Arthur C. Brooks is president of the American Enterprise Institute. He is the bestselling author of “The Conservative Heart” (Broadside Books, 2015) and a contributing New York Times opinion writer.



Arthur C. Brooks has been president of the American Enterprise Institute (AEI) since January 1, 2009. He is also the Beth and Ravenel Curry Scholar in Free Enterprise at AEI. Before joining AEI, Dr. Brooks was the Louis A. Bantle Professor of Business and Government at Syracuse University, where he taught economics and social entrepreneurship. Before pursuing his work in academia and public policy, he spent 12 years as a classical musician in the United States and Spain.

Dr. Brooks is a contributing opinion writer for The New York Times and the bestselling author of 11 books on topics including the role of government, economic opportunity, happiness, and the morality of free enterprise. His latest book is the New York Times bestseller “The Conservative Heart: How to Build a Fairer, Happier, and More Prosperous America” (Broadside Books, 2015). He has also published dozens of academic journal articles and the textbook “Social Entrepreneurship” (Prentice Hall, 2008).

Dr. Brooks has a Ph.D. and an M.Phil. in policy analysis from the Pardee RAND Graduate School. He also holds an M.A. in economics from Florida Atlantic University and a B.A. in economics from Thomas Edison State College.
