 - Important Contribution to the Game of Tennis

Certificates of award will be made available to park and recreation departments, schools, and professionals responsible for the design, construction, and maintenance of the facility. In addition, a one-year complimentary membership to the USTA will be awarded to each winning facility. Winners will be encouraged to attend an awards ceremony in New York City in September 2014.
