Notes from Coach Bickett:

The 14's District Cup team returned to Purdue for yet another year of terrific competition in 2017. This was my fifth year coaching the team, and I was happy to be joined by my assistant Alex Mory.

Our Team was ranked 6th entering the tournament meaning we would have an uphill battle to reach the medal round. We started off the tournament on Friday vs. Northern Indiana. After doubles we took a 2-1 lead, and never relinquished it in singles taking the match 6-3. The team was tired, but persevered in a match that suspended and quickly resumed indoors due to rain. Again Wisconsin lead 2-1 after doubles, and despite the change in scenery pulled out 4 of the 6 singles matches to win 6-3. After those wins we turned our attention to the toughest two teams we would face in the tournament Ohio Valley and Chicago.

On Saturday our first match was against the 3rd seeded team from Ohio Valley. This time our doubles success did not carry over, and we trailed 2-1 heading into singles. In the singles matches we were only able to take one of the 6

singles matches, but it certainly wasn't for lack of effort. After that loss the team looked to bounce back vs. the 2nd seed team from Chicago. Our doubles struggles continued as we trailed 1-2 heading into singles. This time though we were able to get 3 of the singles matches, but that still put us short 4-5. Even with a shot at the medal round out of reach the Wisconsin team continued to fight and play some of their best tennis of the tournament. Trailing 1-2 after doubles the Wisconsin team played some inspired singles winning 5 of the 6 matches to win 6-3. Overall, the team finished the tournament with a winning record of 3-2, good enough for a 6th place finish.
