

2014 Caribbean Section Benchmark for USTA Junior Team Tennis Intermediate Players

The NTRP (National Tennis Rating Program) which defines the characteristics of a player's level is the official system for determining the levels of competition for the USTA's Jr. Team Tennis Leagues.

The Caribbean Section has determined that players participating in Jr. Team Tennis are to be verified with the Caribbean final combined ranking list (both singles and doubles) published at the end of each calendar year and prior to the beginning of the league. Both lists, eligible and ineligible will be taken into consideration.

For 2014- We have determined that based upon this list, a player with 250 points or more in any age group will have to play in the advanced division. Participants with fewer than 250 points on this list are eligible to play in the intermediate but may choose to move up to the advanced division.

Players moving up in age group – Placement of these players will depend upon data available.

Please note that a player ranked below these ranking guidelines may in fact be at a higher NTRP level and therefore coaches/captains must use good faith in the placement of participants in the appropriate levels. The CTA/ PRTA reserves the right to exclude or move up any player of the intermediate level if there is any indication that play level of that player exceeds 3.0, according to the guidelines.
