

President's Message





This past year the USTA/Midwest Section launched "Play it Forward," a campaign that highlights how USTA membership impacts individuals and the community. The campaign illustrates the goodwill that is created by supporting the USTA/Midwest Section through membership.

The USTA/Midwest Section's USTA League program hit an all-time high with 70,225 league participants in the fall of 2010. This

is a great milestone and major accomplishment for the USTA/Midwest Section, and those individuals that work, play, and volunteer for the USTA League program.

The inaugural US Open National Playoffs Midwest Sectional Qualifying Tournament was held June 5-13 at the Lindner Family Tennis Center in Cincinnati, Oh. A total of 87 participants competed in the tournament. Evangeline Repic and Eric Quigley were the winners of the event. Repic defeated Erin Routliffe 6-1, 7-5 in the women's championship match. Quigley defeated Kyle Collette 6-2, 6-2 in the men's title match. Repic, of Oakville, Ontario was the youngest player in the tournament at 15 years old. Quigley, of Pewee Valley, Ky., plays for the University of Kentucky.

David Steinbach of Brookfield, Wis., was honored as one of two winners of the 2010 USTA Starfish Award. This national award recognizes high school coaches who implement a "No-Cut" policy for their tennis teams.

During 2010 the USTA/Midwest Section inducted John Whitlinger of Stanford, Calif. (formerly of Neenah, Wis.), into the Midwest Tennis Hall of Fame. Section award winners included Doug Wenger of Fairlawn, Oh., Mel Bergman Award; Jay Hacker Family of Indianapolis, Ind., Family of the Year Award; NJTL of Indianapolis, the NJTL Chapter of the Year Award.

The Midwest Youth Tennis & Education Foundation (MYTEF), the philanthropic arm of the Association, hosted its third Charity Gala in conjunction with the USTA/Midwest Section Annual Meeting. The Charity Gala netted approximately \$75,000 with all proceeds benefiting the MYTEF whose mission is: 'to develop the life skills of youth through tennis and education'.

This year the USTA/Midwest Section will focus on the 10 and Under initiative, and has implemented the Midwest Junior Tennis Pathway which creates a true tennis pathway for junior players. The USTA/Midwest Section is also focusing on expanding Midwest Youth Team Tennis, growing the new Start/ReStart tennis program for adults, and developing an entry level adult league using modified equipment, courts, and low-compression balls. The USTA/Midwest Section is continually

working to increase and expand membership, diversity, and tennis participation.

During 2010 our Foundation held its annual Charity Gala which netted \$75,000. The Gala included an online silent auction prior to the evening festivities, a live auction and silent auction during the actual event, and a program book for individuals to show their support by purchasing ads. 



2010 Midwest Tennis Hall of Fame



Distinguished inductee John Whitlinger of Stanford, Calif. (formerly of Neenah, Wis.), was enshrined into the USTA/Midwest Section Hall of Fame on December 4, 2010, in Indianapolis, Ind. Whitlinger is the 62nd individual to be inducted into the USTA/Midwest Section Hall of Fame.

The Hall of Fame ceremony was held in conjunction with the Midwest Youth Tennis & Education Foundation Third Annual Charity Gala. The \$75,000 raised during the Charity Gala will allow the Foundation to provide more youth with grant and scholarship funding giving them the opportunity to develop their life skills through tennis. The Gala included an online silent auction prior to the evening festivities, a live auction and silent auction during the actual event, and a program book for individuals to show their support by purchasing ads. A special thank you to all donors, contributors, and attendees for your role ensuring the success of our third fundraising event.

The Hall of Fame ceremony and MYTEF Charity Gala were held during the 117th USTA/Midwest Section Annual Meeting scheduled from December 3-5 in Indianapolis. Several USTA/ Midwest Section awards were also presented during the weekend meeting.

The 2011 Midwest Tennis Hall of Fame Induction & Charity Gala (benefitting the MYTEF) will be held December 3 in Indianapolis.

John Whitlinger has served as the Stanford University Head Men's Tennis coach for the past six years. Whitlinger has led Stanford to a 93-52 career record and five NCAA tournament appearances.



He was named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 2006. Prior to his current position, Whitlinger was an associate coach at Stanford for 18 years. Whitlinger received the inaugural National ITA Assistant Coach of the Year Award in 1997.

Whitlinger has received the following honors: induction into the ITA Collegiate Hall of Fame in 1999, member of Stanford's Athletic Hall of

Fame, and induction into the Fox River Valley Tennis Hall of Fame in 1998. Also, the extended Whitlinger family was named the 1986 USTA Tennis Family of the Year.

Whitlinger competed on the Association of Tennis Professionals (ATP) Tour for six years. He was ranked in the Top 50 in singles, and ranked in the Top 40 in doubles. Whitlinger was a member of U.S. Junior Davis Cup Teams from 1970-1974. He played for the Indiana Loves of the World Team Tennis League.

During his collegiate career, Whitlinger led Stanford to its first two NCAA Championships in 1973 and 1974. He won the NCAA Singles Championship in 1974 and NCAA Doubles Championship with Jim Delaney in 1974. Whitlinger was named All-American in 1974 and 1975.

During his high school tennis career in Neenah, Whitlinger won 109 consecutive matches and captured four WIAA State High School Singles Championships from 1969-1972. He owns 11 National Junior Titles including the International Orange Bowl in 1969 and 1970.

Creek as part of the World's Longest Breakfast Table event.






NJTL of Indianapolis in Indianapolis, Ind., focused on healthy lifestyles during 2010. The NJTL partnered with the Out Run the Sun organization which educates youth and their families about the dangers

of melanoma. To combat youth obesity, NJTL not only serves as a venue for physical activity, but also teaches youth healthy lifestyle choices. With the American Heart Association, NJTL of Indianapolis educates youth on healthy decisions through fun activities and learning materials.

In addition to healthy living and life skills, NJTL also promotes education through the National Arthur Ashe Essay and Art Contest and a summer reading contest. In 2010, NJTL submitted 295 participant entries to USTA for the contest. As a result, NJTL had a National Art Contest winner and four USTA/Midwest Section Art Contest winners. NJTL's summer reading contest helps fight summer learning loss by providing youth with incentive prizes to keep reading during their summer vacation. This past summer 126 kids read 165,325 pages!

NJTL has a long-standing partnership with Indianapolis Parks and Recreation (Indy Parks). NJTL's roots can actually be traced back to Indianapolis' Riverside Park in 1969. In 1969, the program was known as the Riverside Upswing before it officially became NJTL of Indianapolis in 1973. Now 37 years later, NJTL and IndyParks still work together to provide over 1,200 Indianapolis youth with summer tennis and 200 children with Winter QuickStart tennis during March-April and October-November. For NJTL's Summer Program, Indy Parks provides in-kind tennis court usage at 12 park locations, promotes the program in print through the Indy Parks Summer FunGuide, and also assists with recruitment of participants.

Diversity & Inclusion Initiatives Help Grow the Game



Junior Excellence Campers have a ball

The USTA/Midwest Section Diversity & Inclusion initiatives continue to be a top priority. The USTA/Midwest Section aims to serve traditional minority committees as well as broaden the reach to other underserved communities across the Midwest. Highlights from 2010 include the Coaches' Workshop, numerous grants distributed, an Hispanic partnership, and the Junior Excellence Camp.

Coaches' Workshop

The Coaches' Workshop was held from May 1-3 in Indianapolis, Ind., and brought together 47 diverse coaches with 14 new attendees. The morning session started with a panel discussion featuring Kennedy Wells of the Black Coaches and Administrators and Kevin Clayton, the Chief Diversity Operator of the USTA. J. Webb Horton, Head Men's Tennis Coach and Assistant Athletic Director of Florida Gulf Coast University spoke about the college recruitment process. The coaches then moved to the tennis, court and participated in an afternoon of oncourt drills. Julie Fritz of the Indianapolis Community Tennis Association showcased wheelchair tennis and encouraged coaches to experience playing tennis in a chair. Joe White from Gary, Ind., demonstrated a private lesson for kids under the age of ten. J. Webb Horton and Troy Toole from Chicago each offered on-court sessions geared toward top level juniors. The Spring Meeting for ATA's Mid-TAC community was held on the last day of the workshop.

Program and Individual Grants

Diversity Program Grants were awarded to 24 diverse programs which supported either Midwest Youth Team Tennis, USTA Jr. Team Tennis, or USTA League programs. Diversity Individual Player Grants were awarded to 27 youth between the ages of 10 and 14 to help with tournament, program, travel, and equipment costs.

Diversity Partnerships

The USTA/Midwest Section Community Development Division was awarded \$7,500 from the USTA Diversity Department to develop partnerships with Hispanic organizations that serve Hispanic populations, expand diversity junior excellence player camps, and create a strategic focus to increase diversity within the USTA/Midwest Section workplace.

Junior Excellence Camp

The Junior Excellence Camp was held from October 1-3 at the Barbara S. Wynne Tennis Center and University of Indianapolis Tennis Center in

Indianapolis, Ind. The event brought together 49 of the most talented, diverse junior players within the USTA/Midwest Section. Lead Coach Troy Toole, Midwest Coaches Commission member from Chicago, Ill., provided a lesson plan similar to ones used by coaches at USTA High Performance Camps during Saturday's two training sessions. Special guest speaker Sheri Watts, CEO-The Watts Connection, Inc, provided a motivational presentation to the group on life "after the diploma and degree." Players implemented the skills they learned during the camp during a round robin team tennis competition.

Officiating Opportunities



In 2010, the USTA/Midwest Section continued to offer numerous official training opportunities to the general membership. The number of national training schools located in the USTA/Midwest Section increased in 2010, and schools were held in Indianapolis, Ind., Chicago, Ill., and Toledo, Ohio.

For the third year in a row, the USTA/Midwest Section increased the number of officials assigned to work the US Open. Twenty-seven officials represented the USTA/Midwest Section at the 2010 event. Greg Allensworth of Canton, Ohio, received the Jack Stahr award honoring a line umpire in his or her first three years at the US Open, and Keith Crossland of Chicago, Ill., received the McGovern award recognizing him for his body of work in officiating for over 25 years. In addition, Midwest Officials worked at the Western & Southern Financial Group Masters & Women's Open in Cincinnati, Ohio, USTA Circuit tournaments, and USTA/Midwest Section adult and junior championships.

Jerri Banks, of Ada, Ohio, won the 2010 Frank Dowling Award which recognizes an individual who has displayed outstanding attributes as a tennis official in the USTA/Midwest Section for at least five years. Banks has been officiating tennis matches for the past decade, and has served as a roving official, referee and line judge for numerous tournaments throughout the USTA/Midwest Section, and across the country.

National Playoffs Championships I am going to keep training hard and continue to play matches. If I was to qualify for the US Open it would be an awesome experience of a lifetime, but I have to just take one match at a time and hopefully it will pay off.

Quigley was also excited about his win:

It feels amazing to win such a great and well run tournament like this one! I feel honored to be able to represent the Midwest in Atlanta for the final 16! He plans to prepare by practicing in Boca Raton, Fla. at the USTA Training Center, and also play in some futures tournaments across the US. Quigley shared, I would be really happy if I could get the wild card into the Qualifying. Just to be able to get the chance to play with great players, and get the chance to play in Flushing Meadows would be an amazing experience!

Quigley advanced to the US Open National Playoffs – Men's Championships at the Atlanta Athletic Club in Atlanta, July 22-25, held during the Atlanta Tennis Championships, the first event of the 2010 Olympus US Open Series. Repic advanced to the US Open National Playoffs – Women's Championships at the Taube Family Tennis Stadium at Stanford University in Stanford, Calif., July 29-August 1, during the Bank of the West Classic, the first Olympus US Open Series women's event.

The men's and women's winners of the US Open National Playoffs – Men's and Women's Championships earn a wild card into the 2010 US Open Qualifying Tournament from August 24-27 in Flushing, N.Y.







USTA Player Development





Introducing Kids to Tennis through USTA School Tennis and USTA NJTL



USTA School Tennis

The USTA School Tennis program was introduced across the country in 1985 as a way to introduce kids to tennis through physical education classes. Whether it is in the classroom, or through afterschool programming, the USTA/Midwest Section continues to develop resources and tools that make offering tennis to kids accessible and fun.

The USTA/Midwest Section School Tennis program trained 247 teachers in 22 in-services, reached over 30,000 students and generated about 200 organization memberships in 2010.

Participating schools receive:

- Professionally conducted teacher training workshops
- · USTA School Tennis Curriculum Guide
- · Assistance with equipment needs
- · Access to after-school and intramural program grants
- Student eligibility for scholarships

One-day Teacher In-Service Workshops help physical education teachers use large group management skills and demonstrate how to quickly transform a school gym or playground into a dynamic tennisplaying environment that allows students to experience instant success in a fun and safe manner. The USTA/Midwest Section has created a school package, and upon completion of an in-service, physical education teachers receive 20 racquets, two dozen foam balls, a discount equipment order form, a curriculum guide, and a one-year USTA organization membership.

There are also USTA/Midwest Section USTA School Tennis Grants and After School Program Grants available. The school grant is awarded to physical educators who need help purchasing equipment to deliver tennis in their curriculum. An after-school program grant provides funds for tennis organizer stipends, and to offset expenses incurred in launching or expanding a program.

Tennis exhibitions and convocations are also a great way to get students excited about learning and playing tennis. In addition, No-Cut tennis teams are a great way to encourage students to participate in the

sport. High school tennis coach David Steinbach from Brookfield Central High School in Brookfield, Wis., was selected as one of two 2010 USTA Starfish Award winners. This national award recognizes high school coaches who implement a "No-Cut" policy for their tennis teams.



2011 USTA/Midwest Section Adult and Senior Ranking Requirements and Regulations



1. Adult and Senior ranking divisions and minimum qualifying requirements.

Official USTA/Midwest Section rankings shall be made annually in each of the divisions listed below. Also listed are the minimum requirements for a player or team to qualify for consideration for a ranking.

Required number of USTA Sanctioned Tournaments:

Adult and Senior Singles and Doubles. Players in all divisions will be required to participate in only one USTA/Midwest Section Championship in the age division in which the player seeks to obtain a ranking.

2. Events Considered for USTA/Midwest Section Ranking.

- a. Adult and Senior USTA/Midwest Section rankings will be established, provided there are sufficient events for the following divisions: Men's and Women's Open, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65, 70, 75, 80 singles and doubles, Father and Son doubles, Mother and Daughter doubles, Husband and Wife doubles, Mixed doubles and 35 Mixed doubles. In those cases where sufficient events were not available, rankings will be at the discretion of the Ranking Committee.
- b. Ranking data for all adult categories shall be obtained from all sanctioned tournaments that begin play during the ranking year (January 1, 2011, through December 31, 2011). Inputting the results from all sanctioned tournaments into a computerized ranking program will derive adult USTA/Midwest Section Rankings. Divisions that may not have sufficient play to render a fair computer ranking will be ranked manually.
- c. If a player defaults a scheduled match in a tournament FOR ANY REASON (including scheduled consolations or playoffs), that tournament will not count toward meeting the minimum tournament requirements for ranking consideration.
- d. All matches between players in the ranking populations started or completed in any USTA sanctioned tournament in the age group for which a ranking is sought are counted in the ranking procedure regardless of whether or not the tournament is counted toward the minimum tournament requirements. A default which occurs before the first serve of a match is not considered for ranking purposes.
- All match results from a USTA-sanctioned event shall be used for USTA/Midwest Section Adult and Senior Rankings.

3. How to apply for a USTA/Midwest Section ranking.

- a. Procedures and Deadlines for Adults and Seniors All Adult and Senior Singles and Doubles Divisions. Players need not submit their singles and doubles records to initiate the ranking process, but it is the player's responsibility to keep track of additional tournament play. The results of USTA/Midwest Section Singles Championships will be entered into the computer-ranking program at the USTA/Midwest Section office. Player records and tentative rankings are no longer sent via mail during the month of January following the current ranking year. Each adult and senior player who participated in a USTA/Midwest Section Championship is responsible for verifying his/her player record on the Internet at www.midwest.usta.com. A player who is unable to access their player record through the Internet may receive a copy of their player record by submitting a written request to the USTA/Midwest Section. This request must be received at the Section office by January 3, 2012. The ranked list shall be determined from among those eligible for ranking consideration.
- b. Submission of Ranking Data Adults and Seniors. Players submitting inaccurate, incomplete, or illegible data (omission of losses, no names for opponents, defaults reported as wins, etc.) may suffer ranking penalties (including ranking denial) at the discretion of the Ranking Committee.

4. Adult/Senior Competition Ranking Sub-committees.

- a. Ranking Committees shall be established to rank each of the above categories. The USTA/Midwest Section President shall determine the appropriate number of sub-committees and the categories for which they are responsible, and also appoint the chairman. The chairman shall then select the committee members, subject to the approval of the USTA/Midwest Section President.
- All ranking lists, except men's and women's open divisions, shall show the date
 of birth of each player as officially recorded on the USTA Membership Cards.

5. Adult and Senior player eligibility.

- a. Only players who are permanent residents of the USTA/Midwest Section shall be eligible for rankings. If one member of a doubles team is ineligible for ranking, the team cannot qualify for ranking. Players who change their legal residence from one section to another will only be considered for USTA/Midwest Section ranking if their legal residence is in the USTA/Midwest Section as of June 1 of the year under consideration.
- b. Only persons enrolled with the USTA and in good standing at the close of the ranking year shall be considered for a ranking.
- c. Adult 30 events, and Senior 35, 40, 45, 50, 55, 60, 65, 70, 75 and 80 events shall be open to players who have reached or will reach the minimum age limit of the division on or before the last day of the ranking period.
- d. A player or team may be ranked in more than one age group provided the individual or team qualified in each age group in which the individual or team is to be ranked.
- e. If, in the ranking chairman's judgment, a player does not have sufficient data for a numerical ranking but does show that said player would warrant a placement in the top ten of his/her ranking age group, that player may be placed in the insufficient data category.

6. Ranking considerations - Adults and Seniors.

- a. Players shall be ranked based upon the round they reach in the tournaments they play within the USTA/Midwest Section. Points shall be awarded based on the tournaments played and the currently published and applicable tournament base points tables. Points shall be computed from a specifically determined number of the player's best tournament results as follows:
 - 4 tournaments All Men's age divisions at and below 65;
 - 3 tournaments All Men's age divisions at and above 70;
 - 3 tournaments All Women's (all).
- b. A minimum of one (1) win over another player in the ranking population is required.
- c. If, in the judgment of the Ranking Committee, there is not sufficient data available from which to rank any players in a division listed under Numeral 2a, the committee shall not recommend any ranking for that division.
- d. Deadline for withdrawal from ranking consideration is January 7, 2012.
- e. It is the player's responsibility to keep an accurate, complete and legible player record, and to regularly check it online for errors.

7. Procedure for ranking appeals - Adults and Seniors

- a. Positional Appeals. An appeal of a ranking position will be considered only if the match results used in compiling the rankings are in error. If the player record accessed via the Internet at www.midwest.usta.com is not correct, you must submit your corrections to the USTA/Midwest Section office by January 7, 2012. Your corrections must include opponent's name, city and state, match scores, tournament name, location, and date.
- b. Administrative Appeals. If a player or team was omitted from the tentative rankings due to not meeting (or appearing to not meet) any of the ranking eligibility requirements (i.e., minimum tournament requirements), an appeal may be registered with the USTA/Midwest Section Ranking Review Board. The appeal must be submitted, in writing, to the USTA/Midwest Section Ranking Review Board and sent to the USTA/Midwest Section office so that it is received no later than January 18, 2012. The USTA/Midwest Section Ranking Review Board does not consider positional appeals. Decisions of the USTA/Midwest Section Ranking Review Board are final and are not subject to appeal.
- c. Deadline for withdrawal from ranking consideration is January 7, 2012.

2011 USTA/Midwest Section Adult Standing and Ranking Lists; Domicile Rules

The USTA/Midwest Section Standing Lists for adults will be published at least bi-weekly, and may be obtained on the USTA/Midwest Section website at www.midwest.usta.com. These lists will be calculated using all match results from the previous 12 months that have been entered into the ranking database at the time of publishing in the age division that is being calculated.

These lists are not ranking lists. The requirements for being included on these lists are less rigorous than for an actual ranking. Corrections or inquiries regarding the Standing List must be submitted by mail, fax or e-mail only to the USTA/Midwest Section. Positions may not be appealed. Corrections will be researched, and changes will be made when appropriate.

Results Considered for USTA/Midwest Section Standing List: All matches started or completed in any USTA-sanctioned tournament involving Midwest players will be used.

Minimum Requirement: To be eligible to be listed on the USTA/Midwest Section Adult/ Senior Standing List in singles or doubles, a player must play in one Midwest Adult/Senior Championship in the age division in which the player seeks to be listed.

Points-Per-Round System: This system ranks players based upon the round they reach in tournaments they play within the USTA/Midwest Section. Points will be awarded based on the tournament played and the currently published and applicable tournament base points table (see below). Points shall be computed from a specifically determined number of the player's best tournament results as follows:

- 4 tournaments All Men's age divisions at and below 65
- 3 tournaments All Men's age divisions at and above 70
- 3 tournaments All Women's (all)

The tournaments that count for the USTA/Midwest Section Tier II tournaments are: all Category II USTA National Championships held within the USTA/Midwest Section; all USTA National Championships held within the USTA/Midwest Section; and the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Championship.

This table applies to single elimination tournaments, first match consolation tournaments, and round robin tournaments. In a round robin event, a player must win a match in order to receive points. Complete match wins, retirement wins and default wins all count as matches won. Byes do not count as matches won.

2010 USTA/Midwest Section Adult Domicile Rules

Adult Eligibility

The USTA/Midwest Section Adult Domicile Rules will pertain to the following USTA/

USTA/Midwest Section Adult Closed Championship

USTA/Midwest Section Intersectional Teams

District Teams for the USTA/Midwest Section Senior Team Doubles Championships

District Adult Closed Championships

(For purposes of these Domicile Rules, the above listed tournament will hereafter be referred to as "Sectional/District Adult Events")

Questions pertaining to eligibility consideration for all "Sectional/District Adult Events" must be addressed to the USTA/Midwest Section office. This Domicile Policy does not apply to USTA/Midwest Section Players actively serving in the United States Armed Forces.

Proof of Domicile

A player's domicile shall be the domicile of that player. Domicile is hereby defined as the bonafide, true and permanent home of the player. In the event of a dispute as to the eligibility of a player under this section, the following factors shall be used to determine domicile:

- A photocopy of the player's most recent state income tax return or a printed copy of the electronic file form.
- A photocopy of the player's most recent federal income tax return or a printed copy of the electronic file form.
- A copy of a Declaration of Domicile, signed by the player proving that the player lives in the USTA/Midwest Section. The document must be notarized.
- 4. Affidavit of domicile executed by the head of the household.
- Photocopies of player's (when applicable) driver's license and automobile registration(s).
- 6. Notarized copy of player's voter registration.
- Photocopy of Homestead Tax Credit (all states except Ohio, unless the player meets the special requirements in Ohio)

The above list is not intended to be definitive or all inclusive and other factors may be considered by the USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee or the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors, or may be submitted by the player, to assist in determining the players' domicile. The USTA/Midwest Section office staff may request any documents reasonably believed to be necessary in the determination of a players' eligibility. The player has the burden of proof.

A District, or player may submit a request for reconsideration of a domicile ruling to the USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee or to the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors. The decision of the USTA/Midwest Section USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee, the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors or its appointed subcommittee on the reconsideration request may be appealed to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors. The decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors shall be final on the issue of domicile. All requests for reconsideration must be filed with the USTA/Midwest Section Office at least 30 days, prior to the entry deadline of any closed tournament in which the player wishes to enter. Any additional documents requested by the USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee or the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors shall be submitted within five (5) business days after their request. The player may submit any additional documents at anytime prior to the reconsideration review by the USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee, the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors or its appointed subcommittee.

The reconsideration shall be considered based upon all documents submitted to the USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee or to the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors. Any falsification of information will result in a minimum one-year revocation of adult tennis privileges in the USTA/Midwest Section. A player suspended for falsification of information may apply for reinstatement 30 days prior to the effective suspension one-year anniversary date. Failure to apply for reinstatement will cause the suspension to continue until such time as re-application/re-instatement request is approved for said player by the USTA/Midwest Section Adult Competition Sub-Committee or the appropriate committee as directed by the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors, or its appointed subcommittee.

2011 USTA/Midwest Section Junior Ranking and Standing List Requirements and Regulations



1. Ranking Divisions and Minimum Requirements.

- a. Official USTA/Midwest Section rankings shall be made annually in each of the divisions listed below. Also listed are the minimum requirements for a player or team to qualify for
 - Boys' and Girls' 18, 16, 14, 12, 10 Singles. Ranking data for all junior categories shall be obtained from all USTA sanctioned tournaments that begin play during the calendar year (January 1 through December 31). Inputting the results from all USTA sanctioned tournaments into a computerized ranking program will derive USTA/Midwest Section
 - USTA/Midwest Section Singles Ranking. Each player's singles ranking will be based on the accumulation of points for winning rounds at USTA, USTA/Midwest Section and USTA/Midwest Section District junior tournaments during the calendar year in the boys' and girls' 18,16,14,12,10 age divisions. Players must accumulate at least 200 ranking points during the calendar year in order to earn a USTA/Midwest Section year
 - end ranking. This ranking will be based on points a player earns at a player's best six (6) tournaments during the calendar year.

 USTA/Midwest Section Doubles Rankings. Each player's doubles ranking will be individually based on the accumulation of points for winning rounds at USTA, USTA/ Midwest Section, and USTA/Midwest Section District junior tournaments during the calendar year in the boys' and girls' 18,16,14,12,10 age divisions. This ranking will
 - calendar year in the boys and girls 18,16,14,12,10 age divisions. This ranking will be based on points a player earns playing with various partners in the best three (3) tournaments during the calendar year.

 USTA/Midwest Section Ranking Points Needed to Appear on the Standing List. In order to appear on the USTA/Midwest Section Standing List, a player must accumulate at least 50 ranking points in the age division being calculated. The USTA/ Midwest Section Standing List will include the previous 12 months of data based on the Points Per Round Ranking. Points earned in higher age divisions will count towards a player's standing in one or more younger age divisions.
- b. Official USTA/Midwest Section QuickStart Recognition List shall be made annually in each of the divisions listed below. Also listed are the minimum requirements for a player(s) to qualify for consideration.
 - Boys' and Girls' 8 and 10 Singles. Ranking data shall be obtained from all USTA-sanctioned QuickStart formatted junior tournaments that begin play during the calendar year (January 1 through December 31). Results shall be included from all USTA-sanctioned QuickStart formatted junior tournaments into a computerized ranking program.

2. Additional Regulations for USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Ranking and Standing List.

- If a player defaults a scheduled match in a tournament FOR ANY REASON (including scheduled consolations or playoffs), that tournament will not count toward meeting the minimum tournament requirements for ranking consideration. Those points will count for the current standing list only.
- b. All matches between players in the ranking population started or completed in any USTA sanctioned tournament in the age group for which a ranking is sought are counted in the ranking procedure, regardless of whether or not the tournament is counted toward the minimum tournament requirements. A default which occurs before the first serve of a match is not considered for ranking purposes.

 A player must win a round to receive any points for the tournament.
- Byes do not qualify as wins.
- Withdrawals and walkovers qualify as wins for the advancing player and earn Points Per
- Retirements qualify as wins for the advancing player and earn Points Per Round
- A player who advances because of a default that takes place before the commencement of the first point in the match or because the opponent is disqualified shall receive Points Per Round for advancing.

 A player who is defaulted from a tournament for code violations under the USTA/Midwest
- Section Point Penalty System forfeits any points accumulated during the tournament for ranking and standing purposes Players defaulted in singles only lose points accumulated
- for play in the singles main and feed-in championship draws.

 The final rankings for a junior age division shall include all players who have been age eligible for play in the division at any time during the calendar year and who have accumulated at least 200 points in the division. Only points earned in the division will
- count towards ranking in that division.

 Players may be ranked in more than one age division if they have been age eligible in more than one division during the year and have met the minimum point requirement for
- Events that are closed to "Member Only" specific facilities or clubs will not be used. Each District may only host two "Closed" district events besides the District Qualifier for the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Closed Outdoor Championships during the calendar year. Only match results taking place in the "main" District Qualifier for the USTA/Midwest
- Section Junior Closed Outdoor Championships will be used.
- m. Draws of four or more players must use a standard tournament format.
- Draws of three players must use Round Robin formats. All draws with two players will not be included in the ranking or Standing population.
 Matches played using the QuickStart Tennis format in the 8 and 10 under age divisions will only be used for the USTA/Midwest Section QuickStart Recognition List. All QuickStart Tennis format tournaments must use the specified requirements found in the USTA Friend at Court.
- p. USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Level 7 tournaments are aimed to provide an appropriate level of play for junior players that are just getting started into the game. Players in the 12,14,16 and 18 under age divisions are only eligible to participate in USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Level 7 tournaments if they have USTA/ Midwest Section Standing List points of 100 or less in the age division of the tournament. Seeding and Selection Criteria for Level 7 tournaments in the 12,14,16 and 18 under age divisions will be based on the most current USTA/Midwest Section Standing List as of the

- entry deadline to the tournament.
- Tournaments and match results held outside the United States and its territories do not
- count toward ranking.

 All matches played in the Junior Davis Cup and Junior Wightman Cup will count toward a ranking in the appropriate titled age group (18,14,12). If two 16-year-old or two 10-year-old players compete against each other, those matches will also count for ranking in the appropriate age group. The events will continue to be sanctioned as 18, 14, 12 -andunder tournaments. Therefore, the tournaments will count toward meeting the minimum
- Matches using approved alternative scoring formats for the USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Level 7 tournaments, USTA Competition Training Center Regional Championships and the USTA Jr. Team Tennis Sectional Championships will be considered for sectional ranking. All other matches using conventional scoring that are at least two-out-of-three sets in length and matches which use a tiebreak in lieu of a third set will be considered for sectional ranking. Either format may use tiebreaks and/or no-ad scoring. Please note: Matches that use a tiebreak in lieu of a third set will be considered for a national ranking. (For more information, please refer to the National Junior Tournament Schedule.) Please refer to the USTA Friend at Court for additional approved Match Formats.

3. USTA/Midwest Section Event Levels.

The USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee shall evaluate and recommend annually the appropriate levels of the events considered for the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Ranking and Standing Lists. The event levels for 2011 are as follows:

- 5. How to Apply for a USTA/Midwest Section Ranking.

 a. Boys' and Girls' 18, 16, 14, 12, 10 Singles and Doubles. Player records and tentative rankings are no longer sent via mail during the month of January following the current ranking year. All junior players are responsible for verifying his/her player record on the Internet at www.midwest.usta.com. A player who is unable to access their player record through the Internet may receive a copy of their player record by submitting a written request to the USTA/Midwest Section. This request must be received at the Section office by January 3, 2012.
 - Submission of Ranking Data Juniors. Players submitting inaccurate, incomplete, or illegible data (omission of losses, no names for opponents, defaults reported as wins, etc.) may suffer ranking penalties (including ranking denial) at the discretion of the Ranking Sub-Committee.

6. Junior Competition Ranking Sub-committees.

USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Ranking Sub-committees shall be established to rank, evaluate and make appropriate administrative changes to the Event Levels and Point Tables for each of the above categories. The USTA/Midwest Section President shall determine the appropriate number of sub-committees and the categories for which they are responsible, and also appoint the chairman. The chairman shall then select the committee members, subject to the approval of the USTA/Midwest Section President.

7. Player Eligibility.

- a. Only players who are permanent residents of the USTA/Midwest Section shall be eligible for rankings. If one member of a doubles team is ineligible for ranking, the team cannot qualify for ranking. Players who change their legal residence from one section to another will only be considered for USTA/Midwest Section ranking if their legal residence is in the USTA/Midwest Section as of June 1 of the year under consideration
- Only persons enrolled with the USTA and in good standing at the close of the ranking year shall be considered for a ranking.
- All 18, 16, 14, 12, 10 events shall be open to players as set forth below in the USTA Age Division Eligibility for 2011:

 If, in the ranking chairman's judgment, a player does not have sufficient data for a numerical

- her ranking age group, that player may be placed in the insufficient data category. f. The USTA/Midwest Section Ranking Sub-committee will rank all players who are eligible and have met the USTA/Midwest Section ranking requirements for that age division.

Endorsement procedure: How to gain entry to the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships

Players interested in participating in the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships should be aware of the following items:

Players must be domiciled (see third section in next column) within the boundaries of the USTA/Midwest Section

Players must be endorsed by their District's Endorser. This normally requires participating in the tournament designated by the district as the one used for endorsement purposes (commonly referred to as the District Qualifier). For the District Qualifier, players in the 12,14,16, and 18 age divisions may only participate and be endorsed in the age division they wish to participate in the USTA/Midwest Closed Junior Outdoor Championships.

Due to the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships BG10 being conducted at a later date, those players may participate and be endorsed in the 10 and 12 and under age division.

The USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships and the District Qualifiers are open to citizens of the U.S., permanent resident aliens in possession of a valid alien registration card, individuals who are applicants for adjustment to lawful permanent resident status and who can present a USCIS receipt for a pending unadjudicated form I-485, aliens who have resided continuously in the U.S. for more than one year and who are members of families of persons in the diplomatic or consular corps and aliens who have been granted Refugee Status, Asylee Status or Temporary Protected Status

The USTA/Midwest Section has established district boundaries as defined in the Section's Bylaws. Players may seek endorsement only from the district in which they are domiciled. In the event of a dispute over a domicile ruling by the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee, an appeal may be made to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors. If the dispute cannot be resolved by the parties involved, the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors shall have the authority to grant an exemption into the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships utilizing one of the alternate positions. A player may be endorsed by the USTA/Midwest Section only if the player has not applied for endorsement in another section.

To be admitted into the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships, players must be endorsed as part of their district's quota of entries, or have been granted a wild card entry by the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee. This guota is determined by the USTA/Midwest Section based on the percentage of USTA/Midwest Section Junior memberships in the USTA who reside in the district. Any granted wild card entries will not affect district quotas. The endorsed players must register on the Internet via TennisLink. The District Endorser will then send the forms to the USTA/Midwest Section office by the application deadline. District Endorsers will also submit an ordered list of alternates to the USTA/Midwest Section office. This endorsed list of alternates will be used for the purposes of filling available spots if district players withdraw from the quota prior to the entry deadline to the event. Specific details on the districts' quota procedures should be directed to the appropriate District Endorser and/or District President.

All endorsed district alternates will be considered for entry into the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships. The remaining positions in the draw will be filled from the alternate lists in order of record strength as determined using the USTA/Midwest Section Standing List.

The records of district alternates will be compared so that the strongest players will be accepted into the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships regardless of their district affiliation or district order. After the available positions are filled, the remaining alternates will be placed on a stand-by list in order of strength.

Wild Card Application for the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships

In order to be considered for a wild card entry to the USTA/Midwest Section Closed

- Junior Outdoor Championships, a player must satisfy the following:

 Be competing in the main draw of any ATP/WTA pro event that precludes playing in their District Qualifier prior to the USTA/Midwest Closed Junior Outdoor Championships; or
- Be invited by the USTA Player Development Headquarters to compete in an International Tennis Federation (ITF) Tournament that precludes playing in their District Qualifier prior to the USTA/Midwest Closed Junior Outdoor Championships; and
- The player must appear in the top 100 of the most current USTA/Midwest Section Standing List in the age division seeking the wild card entry.

Requests for a Wild Card Application to the **USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championship**

At least two weeks prior to the tournament entry deadline for the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships, a player shall submit his/her request for a wild card entry to the USTA/Midwest Section office. This request shall be accompanied by the appropriate written permissions from the District Association.

The request is subject to approval by a committee composed of the USTA/Midwest Sectional Endorser for the appropriate age group, the Endorser Chairman and the Junior Competition Committee Chairman, and is subject to appeal to the USTA/ Midwest Section Board of Directors. This decision shall be made and communicated to the applicant at least two days before the draw is made.

Junior Eligibility

These Domicile Rules will pertain to the following:

- All USTA/Midwest Section Junior Closed Championships;
- All USTA/Midwest Section Junior Designated Events

(Note: For purposes of these Domicile Rules, the above listed tournaments will hereafter be referred to as "Sectional Junior Events")

Also included in the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Eligibility Requirements will be the following events:

- USTA/Midwest Section District Team Cup Events BG12,14,B18;
- USTA/Midwest Section Marian Wood Baird Cup G18;
- All District/Area Qualifiers to the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Closed Outdoor Championships:

(Note: For purposes of these Domicile Rules, the above listed tournaments will hereafter be referred to as "District Junior Events")

(Note: For purposes of these Domicile Rules, parent(s), custodial parent(s) or guardian(s) will hereafter be referred to as "parents").

For the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Outdoor Junior Championship sectional tournament players may only qualify in the district where their "parents" are domiciled. A player may attempt to qualify from only one district. Boundaries for determining domicile shall be as defined in the USTA/Midwest Section Bylaws, Article III Members: Section 2: District Associations.

The "Sectional Junior Events and District Junior Events" are open to:

- Citizens of the U.S.,
- Permanent resident aliens in possession of a valid alien registration card.
- Individuals who are applicants for adjustment to lawful permanent resident status and who can present a USCIS receipt for a pending unadjudicated form I-485,
- Aliens who have resided continuously in the US for more than one year and who are members of families of persons in the diplomatic or consular corps, and
- Aliens who have been granted Refugee Status, Asylee Status or Temporary Protected Status.

Questions pertaining to eligibility consideration for all "Sectional Junior Events", must be addressed to the USTA/Midwest Section office. Questions pertaining to eligibility consideration for all "District Junior Events", must be addressed to the appropriate District Association

Non-US citizens who question their eligibility determination may submit for reconsideration to the USTA/Midwest Section office. The USTA/Midwest Section office staff may request any documents reasonably believed to be necessary in the determination of a player's eligibility. The player has the burden of proof.

Proof of Domicile

A player's domicile shall be the domicile of that player's "parents". Domicile is hereby defined as the bonafide, true and permanent home of the player's "parents". In the event that the player's parents are divorced or legally separated, the custodial parent or the legal custodian who in fact resides with the player, shall be presumed to be the player's parent for determining domicile.

In the event of a dispute as to the eligibility of a player under this section, the following factors shall be used to determine domicile:

- 1. A photocopy of the "parents" most recent state income tax return or a printed copy of the electronic file form.
- 2. A photocopy of the "parents" most recent federal income tax return or a printed copy of the electronic file form.
- A copy of a Declaration of Domicile, signed by the "parents" proving that the player's "parents" live in the USTA/Midwest Section. The document must be notarized.
- Affidavit of domicile executed by the head of the household.

The above list is not intended to be definitive or all inclusive and other factors may be considered by the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee, or may be submitted by the player's parent, to assist in determining the players' domicile. The USTA/Midwest Section office staff may request any documents reasonably believed to be necessary in the determination of a player's eligibility. The player has the burden

A District, player or parent may submit a request for reconsideration of a domicile ruling to the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee. The decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee or its appointed subcommittee on the reconsideration request may be appealed to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors. The decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors shall be final on the issue of domicile. All requests for reconsideration must be filled with the USTA/Midwest Section Office at least 30 days, prior to the entry deadline of any closed tournament in which the player wishes to enter. Any additional documents requested by the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee shall be submitted within five (5) business days after their request. The "parents" may submit any additional documents at anytime prior to the reconsideration review by the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee or its appointed subcommittee.

The reconsideration shall be considered based upon all documents submitted to the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee. Any falsification of information will result in a minimum one-year revocation of junior tennis privileges in the USTA/ Midwest Section. A player suspended for falsification of information may apply for re-instatement. The player may apply 30 days prior to the effective suspension one-year anniversary date. Failure to apply for reinstatement will cause the suspension to continue until such time as re-application/re-instatement request is approved for said player by the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Competition Committee or its appointed

Endorsement of USTA/Midwest Section's Quota and Alternates for USTA National Junior Events

The following criteria apply for all USTA National Junior events: A player may request endorsement in only one age division.

Minimum Requirements for Inclusion on the **USTA National Clay Court Championships Endorsement List**

All players that appear on the USTA/Midwest Section Standing List at the conclusion of all District Qualifiers and prior to the USTA/Midwest Section District Team Cup BG12. 14, 18 and the USTA/Midwest Section Marian Wood Baird Cup, will be endorsed to the event. Please see "Endorsement Grid" on page 56 for additional information.

Minimum Requirements for Inclusion on the **USTA National Championships Endorsement List**

All players that appear on the USTA/Midwest Section Standing List which will be generated after the completion of the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships will be endorsed to the event.

The winners of each of the three Designated tournaments taking place in the preceding January, February and March shall be automatically included in the Sectional quota. In addition, the top six finishers at the USTA/Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships (main draw semifinalists and FIC finalists) shall automatically be included in the Sectional quota.

Any remaining spots in the Sectional quota and all alternate spots shall be filled in the order of the endorsement list, which will be generated after the conclusion of the USTA/ Midwest Section Closed Junior Outdoor Championships.

USTA Zone Team Championships for 16-, 14-, and 12-and-under Players

The USTA Zone Team Championships are non-elimination team events providing intersectional competition for players selected to the Zonal teams. The USTAV Midwest Section will endorse players in the 12, 14 and 16 age divisions. Players may be endorsed to ANY or ALL USTA Zone Team Championships if they meet the endorsement requirements.

The emphasis of the team events will be on a combination of competition and development. Limited coaching by designated coaches during play will be permitted. Team matches will include singles, doubles and mixed doubles. Instructional, informational and social activities will be an important part of the USTA Zone Team Championships.

Chaperones

Team coaches will provide direction for the players at team competitions and at team activities, but will not be expected to be chaperones for players. The primary responsibility of caring for the needs of the players, as in other competitions, is borne by the parents of the participants. Since the team competition is a non-elimination event, all players will be involved for the full duration of the competition.

Player selection will be based on the most current USTA/Midwest Section Standing List in the age division being endorsed as of the USTA/Midwest Section entry deadline. No entry fee will be refunded within seven days of the start of the event.

If the number of vacant team positions exceeds the number of alternate players who applied on time, the Sectional Endorser will fill all vacant positions by the following procedure:

The highest listed player on the selection list who has not applied shall be contacted and given an opportunity to play. This procedure will be used until all vacant positions are filled for that event. In the event the Sectional Endorser is unable to contact a player, the endorser may proceed to the next listed player.

USTA/Midwest Section Open Junior Championships

A player does not need to be endorsed to the USTA/Midwest Section Open Junior Championships. Each player is responsible to enter through the TennisLink registration system (www.usta.com). Draws may be limited.

USTA National Open Championships

Aplayer is not required to be endorsed to the USTA National Open Junior Championships. Each player is responsible to enter the tournament through the TennisLink registration system (www.usta.com). Acceptance of entry will be based on the USTA National Standing List.

Tournaments Requiring USTA/Midwest Section Endorsement

Players must obtain endorsement through the USTA/Midwest Section Endorsers (Zone Team Championships) or USTA/Midwest Section Coach (Intersectionals, USTA Boys' and Girls' 18 National Team Championships) for the following Championships:

- USTA Girls' 18 National Team Championships

For those individuals unable to register on the Internet, write to or call the tournament director for entry forms for tournaments that are registered via TennisLink.

All players who have accepted an endorsement and appear in the Midwest quota to a USTA National Championship are obligated to inform their Sectional Endorsers immediately if they decide not to participate. Alternates must contact their Endorser when their intention changes (family vacation, other tournaments, etc.) and they would not be able to attend a National event if selected. All unacceptable or untimely withdrawals will be forwarded to the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee for appropriate action.

Please Note: Some players may progress through the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Tennis Pathway faster than other players.

2011 Junior Tennis Pathway Updates



The USTA/Midwest Section has implemented a new Junior Tennis Pathway for 2011. The QuickStart Tennis play format is a key component of the progression for 10 and under players. The Junior Tennis Pathway provides developmental stages featuring age appropriate balls, racquets, and court sizes. In the past, children have tried the game of tennis using a yellow ball, and an adult-sized racquet on a full (78') court. As a result, many of these children lose interest due to lack of success because the equipment does not correlate with the size of the player. The QuickStart Tennis play format scales the game down to the size of the child through the use of age appropriate balls, racquets and courts. Utilizing these specifications, the QuickStart Tennis play format allows the child to learn the game faster and have greater success. For many years, countries around the world have been training their 10 and under players using program formats similar to QuickStart Tennis. These program formats have produced some of the world's top professionals including Roger Federer, Justine Henin, Kim Clijsters and others. The success of these programs demonstrates why QuickStart Tennis is such a vital part of the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Tennis Pathway.

Through the Junior Tennis Pathway, a club, school, park and recreation department and other public facility can host a QuickStart Tennis play format junior tennis event. Your participation is vital to the future of the game in the USTA/Midwest Section. The following is information pertaining to the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Tennis Pathway for 10 and Under players. 2011 Junior Tennis Pathway Update:

In an effort to create a true Junior Tennis Pathway, several changes will be implemented for 2011. The following are highlights of those changes:

I. Boys' and Girls' 8 Division: Midwest PPR Level 7 (RED)

All USTA/Midwest Section sanctioned 8 and under tournaments must use the QuickStart Tennis format. Please refer to the Junior Tennis Pathway and the USTA/Midwest Section website for more information. (www. midwest.usta.com). In addition to tournament play, it is recommended that players participate in the Midwest Youth Team Tennis Program (www.midwestteamtennis.com).

II. Boys' and Girls' 10 Division QuickStart Tournaments: Midwest PPR Level 7: (ORANGE)

All USTA/Midwest Section sanctioned 10 and under tournaments that use the QuickStart Tennis format will be used for Midwest PPR Level 7 events. Please refer to the Junior Tennis Pathway and the USTA/ Midwest Section website for more information (www.midwest.usta.com).

In addition to tournament play, it is recommended that players participate in the Midwest Youth Team Tennis Program (www.midwestteamtennis.com).

III. Boys and Girls 10 Divisions (New): (GREEN)

All USTA/Midwest Section sanctioned 10 and under tournaments for 2011 that are designated in the USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Ranking Program as a Level 1,2,3,4,5,6 will be held using the following requirements:

- a. Court: The court shall be a 78-foot court;
- b. Ball: The ball shall be stage 1 (green) ball;
- c. Racket: The racket shall not exceed 29.0 inches (73.7 cm) in overall length, including the handle;
- d. Scoring: The following scoring will be used: two out of three sets with match tie-break for the third;
- e. Draw Format: The draw format will remain as indicated in the USTA Friend at Court:
- f. Results will be used for USTA/Midwest Section Points per Round Ranking Program.

In addition to tournament play, it is recommended that players participate in the USTA Jr. Team Tennis Program (www.midwestteamtennis.com)

IV. Boys and Girls 12, 14, 16, 18 Level 7 Events (New): (YELLOW)

USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Level 7 tournaments are aimed to provide an appropriate level of play for junior players that are just getting started into the game. Players in the 12,14,16 and 18 under age divisions are only eligible to participate in USTA/Midwest Section Points Per Round Level 7 tournaments if they have USTA/Midwest Section Standing List points of 100 or less in the age division of the tournament. Seeding and Selection Criteria for Level 7 tournaments in the 12, 14, 16 and 18 under age divisions will be based on the most current USTA/Midwest Section Standing List as of the entry deadline to the tournament.

I. PRE-TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS

A. Applicability of USTA Regulations

- Use in USTA sanctioned tournaments. The USTA Regulations and the ITF Rules of Tennis shall be observed throughout all sanctioned tournaments and sanctioned matches.
- Definition of tournaments. Tournaments refer to all forms of competition including, but not limited to, tournaments, championships, team championships,matches, exhibitions, events, intersectionals, international competitions, and zonals. Tournaments are classified as amateur, professional, or open.
- 3. Regulations for USTA tournaments that are part of WTA, ATP, or ITF circuits. In any USTA sanctioned tournament in which a division is a part of the WTA or the ATP or is sanctioned by the ITF, that division shall use the WTA, ATP, or ITF tournament regulations. FAC Comment I.A-1: Officials may be administering tournaments under the auspices of ATP,WTA, or ITF organizations whose regulationsmay be at variance with USTA Regulations in some respects. In such situations, officials should reach a clear understanding of these differences before the tournament begins. Each division must be played entirely under USTA Regulations or entirely under the WTA, ATP, or ITF tournament regulations. In tournaments played under ITF tournament regulations, all USTA Regulations not inconsistent with the ITF tournament regulations apply.
- 4. Regulations for professional circuits. Organized circuits of professional tournaments may adopt special tournament regulations to be uniformly applied throughout each tournament in the circuit, provided that notice thereof is published with the information for the circuit.
- Regulations for amateur circuits. Organized circuits of amateur tournaments
 may adopt special tournament regulations to be uniformly applied throughout each tournament in the circuit, provided that the regulations are not
 inconsistent with USTA Regulations and that notice thereof is published with
 the information for the circuit.

B. Application for Sanction and Appointment of Tournament Committee

Before the start of a tournament, the Organization Member conducting the tournament shall apply for a sanction (see USTA Regulation XVII) and shall appoint a Tournament Committee of at least three persons. The Tournament Chairperson, the Tournament Director, and the Referee shall be members of the Committee. Neither the Tournament Chairperson nor the Tournament Director may serve as or assume the responsibilities of the Referee or Deputy Referee, except that the Tournament Director may serve as the Referee of a tournament that uses a QuickStart Tennis format.

C. Tournament Committee

See USTA Friend at Court (p. 53).

D. Tournament Appeals Committee

See USTA Friend at Court (p. 57).

E. Match Formats and Scoring

Most matches use the scoring system specifically described in **Rules 5**, **6**, **and 7** of the **ITF Rules of Tennis**, and are the best of three sets. In interscholastic, state, Sectional, and National championships in the Boys' 18 and Girls' 18 Divisions, the final round may be the best of five sets. In the Men's Open, 25, and 30 Divisions,matches in any roundmay be the best of five sets. Other match formats may be used. Results of matches using other formats shall be used for rankings

unless prohibited by applicable National, Sectional, or District ranking regulations. Commonly used formats include no-ad scoring, matches consisting of the best of three sets with a 10-Point Match Tiebreak in lieu of the third set, pro sets, matches consisting of one set only, QuickStart Tennis formats, and short sets. The tournament entry form shall specify the format being used.

1. Tiebreaks

- a. 7-Point Set Tiebreak (first to 7 by a margin of 2). The 7-Point Set Tiebreak (first to 7 by a margin of 2) is the tiebreak game described USTA REGULATIONS I.E. (Match Formats and Scoring) 57 58 USTA REGULATIONS I.E. (Match Formats and Scoring) in Rule 5(b) of the ITF Rules of Tennis and determines the winner of any set in which it is used. Use of the 7-Point Set Tiebreak is mandatory in all sets of any sanctioned tournament except pro sets (See USTA Regulation I.E.4.)
- b. 10-Point Match Tiebreak in lieu of deciding final set. The 10-Point Match Tiebreak (first to 10 by amargin of 2) is described in Appendix IV of the ITF Rules of Tennis and determines the winner of anymatch in which it is used. The match tiebreak used in USTA sanctioned tournaments shall be the 10-Point Match Tiebreak.
- Any tournament electing to use the 10-PointMatch Tiebreak in lieu of a deciding final set shall announce the election on the entry form. See **Table 17** for when the 10-Point Match Tiebreak in lieu of the deciding final set may be used in USTA Junior National Championships and USTA Regional Tournaments; **USTA Regulation X.A.2.d. and USTA Regulation X.F.5.** for when the 10-Point Match Tiebreak in lieu of the deciding final set may be used in Category I USTA, Adult, Senior, and Family National Championships; and USTA Regulation XIII.A.3.d. for when the 10-Point Match Tiebreak in lieu of the deciding final set may be used in Category I USTA Wheelchair National Championships.
- c. Coman Tiebreak Procedure. The Coman Tiebreak Procedure is the same as the procedure described above except that ends are changed after the first point, then after every four points, and at the conclusion of the tiebreak. See Appendix IV to the ITF Rules of Tennis. A Sectional Association may authorize any tournament below the National Championship level to use the Coman Tiebreak Procedure. The appropriate USTA Competition Committeemay authorize the use of the Coman Tiebreak Procedure for any other tournament. Any tournament electing to use the Coman Tiebreak Procedure must announce the election before the start of tournament play. The Coman Tiebreak Procedure may be used with any tiebreak.
- d. Recording the tiebreak score. When a 7-Point Set Tiebreak is played, the score of the set shall be written 7-6(x) or 6-7(x), with (x) being the number of points won by the loser of the tiebreak. For example, 7-6(4) means the tiebreak score was 7-4, and 6-7(14) means the tiebreak score was 14-16. If a 10-Point Match Tiebreak is played in lieu of the deciding final set, the score is recorded 1-0(x) with x being the number of points won by the loser.
- e. Ball changes. If a ball change is due at the start of a tiebreak, it shall be deferred until the start of the second game of the next set. A tiebreak counts as one game in determining ball changes. If a ball change is due at the start of a tiebreak that is being played in lieu of the deciding final set, there shall be no ball change.
- 2. No-Ad scoring. The no-ad scoring systemis described in Appendix IV of the ITF Rules of Tennis. A tournament electing to use no-ad scoring must announce the election before the start of tournament play except as set forth in USTA Regulation III.G.1. See also USTA Regulation IX.A.6., which prohibits no-ad scoring in USTA Junior National Championships and USTA Regional Tournaments.
- Short Sets. A tournament electing to use "short" sets must announce the election on the entry form. See Appendix IV of the ITF Rules of Tennis.
- 4. Pro Sets. A match may consist of a pro set. Unless otherwise specified, a pro set is one set in which a player or team must win eight games by a margin of two games to win the match. If the score reaches 8-all, a 7-Point Tiebreak (first to 7 by a margin of 2) is played, with the winner of the tiebreak winning the match by a score of 9-8(x) where x is the number of points won by the player or team who lost. The Tournament Committee may instead use a 10-Point Tiebreak (first to 10 by a margin of 2) to



decide the winner of a pro set if the Committee includes this information on the entry form and website. Any tournament electing to use the pro set shall announce its use on the entry form and website. If a pro set other than the 8-game pro set is used, the Tournament Committee shall specify the format on the entry form and website.

5. QuickStart Tennis formats. See USTA Regulation VI.

F. Balls and Ball Change Pattern

See USTA Friend at Court (p. 59).

G. Player Eligibility

See USTA Friend at Court (p. 60).

H. Entry Process

- Means of entry. The Tournament Committee shall determine the means of entering the tournament, which may be by its own entry form, by a standard entry form, or by electronic means.
- 2. Entry form. The Tournament Committee shall specify in the title if a tournament is limited to amateurs, except that that is not required for junior tournaments. If only some events in the tournament are limited to amateurs, then the entry form shall indicate which events are limited to amateurs and which events are open to professionals and amateurs. As soon as the Tournament Committee is prepared to receive entries, it shall place the following information on its written entry form and its website (if any):
 - The specific events and the eligibility requirements;
 - · Any limit on the size of the draws;
 - The locations and dates of play (including rain dates, if any);
 - The sanctioning bodies;
 - The entry fee;
 - The draw format and whether any consolation is mandatory;
 - The time and place of the draw;
 - The match format for the main draw, consolation, and doubles;
 - When applicable, a statement specifying whether the tournament will
 use the All Factors Method of seeding or a Computerized List Method
 of seeding. If a Computerized List Method is used, then the Tournament
 Committee shall reference (for example, National, Sectional, or District
 criteria) or publish the applicable seeding criteria;
 - When applicable, a statement that the tournament will use the 10-Point Match Tiebreak in lieu of the deciding final set;
 - The entry deadline (the date by which entries must be received by the Tournament Committee);
 - The mailing or electronic address where the entry form should be sent;
 - · Any clothing or shoe restrictions;
 - The time and place of any player meeting and how to notify the tournament if a player is unable to attend;
 - The ball type (brand name not required) that will be used;
 - The number of balls for play and the ball change policy;
 - · The type of court surface; and
 - When applicable, a statement that the tournament will use a QuickStart Tennis format (including the specific court dimensions and racket size allowed).

It is recommended that the Tournament Committee include additional information, such as how first match information may be obtained, the names of the Referee and other members of the Tournament Committee, and the requirement for a player to deliver written verification or description of the reasons for a withdrawal.

- Acceptance of entries in tournaments with unlimited size draws. The Tournament Committee is responsible for accepting the entries. It shall furnish the Referee with a complete list of entrants. The Committee may accept late entries.
- 4. Acceptance of entries in tournaments with limited size draws. If the number of entrants exceeds the draw limit, the Tournament Committee shall accept players and alternates into the draw based on their records. It may also accept players of established ability who do not have current records, or

whose records are affected by illness, injury, or lack of recent play. If the Tournament Committee is unable to determine the record of some players with timely entries, then it shall accept these players into the draw and onto the alternate list by lot and never by the date of receipt of entries.

The Tournament Committee may accept late entries, *provided that* late entries shall be placed on the alternate list after the timely entries in the received. Late entries received at the same time shall be ordered by lot.

The Tournament Committee shall furnish the Referee with a list of alternates listed in priority order.

- No discrimination in acceptance of entries. Entries may not be refused on the basis of race, creed, sexual orientation, color, or national origin.
- Voluntary submission of seeding information. A player who wants to be seeded should submit a player record and ranking.
- Electronic service fee. Players who enter tournaments may be charged a non-refundable fee for the receipt of electronic entries.
- Withdrawal from tournament and refund of entry fee. The Tournament Committee shall refund a player's entire entry fee if the entry is not accepted. In all tournaments except tournaments listed on the National Junior Tournament Schedule, the Tournament Committee shall refund a player's entire entry fee if the player withdraws no later than seven days before the start date of the tournament; no refund is required beginning six days before the start date of the tournament. The fee for electronic entries is not considered a part of the entry fee and is non-refundable. See USTA Regulation IX.A.8. for entry fee refunds in the USTA Junior National Championships and USTA Regional Tournaments. The Tournament Committee shall not charge any fee (such as a processing, service, or handling fee) for refunding the entry fee. A player shall not withdraw from a tournament except for illness, injury, personal emergency, or previously authorized entry into another tournament (see USTA Regulation IV.C.16.).
- Request for special scheduling. A player may submit a request for special scheduling with the player's entry. See USTA Regulation II.D.4. for how the Referee handles these requests.

II. DRAW REGULATIONS

A. Seeding

While there is no requirement that every tournament have seedings, most tournaments of the elimination and compass draw types, as distinguished from round robins, use seedings to ensure that players of recognized outstanding ability do not confront each other in the early rounds.

- Responsibility for seeding. The Tournament Committee shall determine the seedings, except that pursuant to USTA Regulation IX.A.4. the Director of USTA Junior Competition or the Director's designee shall seed the USTA National Championships, USTA National Opens, and USTA Regional Tournaments after consulting with the Tournament Committee.
- 2. Number of seeds. The number of players seeded shall equal a power of two (for example, 2, 4, 8, 16, or 32). The maximum ratio of players seeded shall be one in three, except that any draw may have two seeds.
- 3. Listing seeds. The Referee shall list the seeded players in the draw in numerical order to the extent that the Referee has information available to do so, and then the Referee shall list all other seeded players in groups. For example, if the first 5 seeds are numerically seeded, seeds 6 through 8 could be grouped.
- 4. Seeding methods
 - a. All Factors Method. The All Factors Method of seeding is based on the players' chances of winning the tournament as determined by the Tournament Committee. The Tournament Committee shall consider all reasonably available information, including ranking lists, standing lists, recent records, types of surface, and particularly head-to-head encounters.
 - b. Computerized List Method. A Computerized List Method of seeding is based on a computerized system of rankings or standings.
- 5. Seeding in National tournaments.
 - a. Juniors. USTA National Championships, USTA National Opens, and USTA Regional Tournaments, shall use a Computerized List Method and shall follow the seeding criteria in Table 16.



- Adult, Senior, and Family. Seeding for Category I USTA Adult, Senior, and Family National Championships shall use the All Factors Method of seeding.
- c. Wheelchair. The tournament committees of Category I USTA Wheelchair National Championships may choose to use either the All Factors Method of seeding or a Computerized List Method of seeding. The Wheelchair Committee shall establish and publish the seeding criteria to be followed when using a Computerized List Method of seeding. See USTA Regulation XIII.A.3.c.
- 6. Seeding in tournaments other than National tournaments. Sectional Associations may require all or some of their tournaments to use the All Factors Method of seeding or a Computerized List Method of seeding. If a Sectional Association requires the use of a Computerized List Method of seeding, it shall publish its seeding criteria. The Sectional Associations may also allow their District Associations or subdivisions to make this decision. In this case, the District or subdivision shall publish its seeding criteria.
- Publication of method of seeding and seeding criteria. All tournaments shall publish the method of seeding and the seeding criteria.
- 8. Seeding Groups. Seeding groups refer to 1, 2, 3-4, 5-8, 9-16, and 17-32. A seeding group is treated separately in that players within that group are drawn to lines in the draw that are specifically designated for that group. The concept of seeding groups is important when the draw needs to be changed. Changes may be required if a:
 - Player in the draw was not seeded but should have been seeded. See USTA Regulation II.C.4);
 - Player who should have been seeded was omitted from the draw (See USTA Regulation II.C.2.b.); or
- Seeded player withdraws (See USTA Regulation II.C.1.a.).
- 9. Placing is prohibited. Placing occurs, for example, when the Committee in a 16-draw tournament seeds four and "places" four. The practice of placing is an attempt to hide the fact that in reality eight players have been seeded instead of the permissible maximum of four. The rule of "one in three" was established to provide some matches between strong players in the first round, to increase the variety of a player's opponents, and to get away from the "strong-weak-strong-weak" pattern in the draw, thereby giving players who are usually first-round losers an occasional opportunity to meet each other and advance to the second or third round.
- 10. Block seeding. Block seeding refers to the practice of advancing the seeded player several rounds into the tournament. The unseeded players play matches to reach the round where the seeded players have already been stationed. The purpose of this practice is to allow the unseeded players to play several matches before playing a seeded player. Block seeding is authorized in tournaments at the level of sectional championships and below.

- tournaments above the sectional championship level and are recommended for use to start a match at the sectional championship level.
- 4. Make arrangements to finish tournament. The Tournament Committee shall arrange for enough courts so that under normal conditions the tournament can be completed on time and so that the Referee can schedule matches in each division on the specified surface. When a tournament cannot be finished on the specified surface, the Committee may use available courts of any type. However, USTA Regulation X.A.2.f. requires that the semifinals and finals of Category I USTA Adult, Senior, and Family National Championships normally be played on the surface specified in the title; USTA Regulation XIII.A.3.f. requires all Category I USTA Wheelchair National Championships normally be played on the surface specified in the title.

If there is no practical way to finish on schedule, the Committee shall either make arrangements mutually agreeable to the players involved to finish at a later date, unless prohibited by applicable national section or district regulations, or in the absence of such arrangements, declare the tournament unfinished and distribute the prizes equitably among the still involved players.

B. Referee Responsibilities After Draw Has Been Made

- 1. Generally supervise all aspects of play. The Referee (or in the Referee's absence the Deputy Referee) shall be present during play. The Referee exercises general supervision over all aspects of play, including, but not limited to, the conduct and actions of players, coaches, parents, spectators, officials, ballpersons, groundskeepers, and the administrative crew. The Referee shall use judgment in all situations not specifically covered by the ITF Rules of Tennis or USTA Regulations.
- 2. Schedule matches. The Referee is responsible for scheduling matches and assigning courts (including moving a match in progress to another court at any time). Normally a player's singles match will precede the player's doubles match, but this is not mandatory. A player's request for information as to the scheduled time of the player's first match shall be honored. (See USTA Regulation II.D.6.) The Referee shall not schedule any division to play on more than one surface type, except that the Referee may do so when necessary to complete the tournament on time.
 - a. In junior tournaments when evening matches are planned, the younger age groups should be scheduled before the older age groups.
 - b. Players may not be required to play more than two singles matches per day in any event in all USTA/Midwest Section sanctioned junior tournaments, except when a tiebreaker is used in lieu of a third set, in which case a player would be allowed to play three (3) singles matches in one day.
 - c. Players may participate in more than one age group in the event in the same tournament, if permitted by the tournament committee. If due to rain or other unforeseen circumstances, dual participation results in the delay of the tournament, in the opinion of the Referee, the player may be defaulted from one of the events.
 - d. A player may: Not be required to start the day's matches before 8:00 a.m.; Not be placed on the court after 9:00 p.m. in 12's and 14's; 10:00 p.m. in 16 and 18 age group events. Additionally, any junior or senior player involved in a match commencing at 8:00 p.m. or later must be allowed a minimum of 12 hours between the beginning of that evening's match and the beginning of the first match scheduled for the following day. (This does not apply to a player who enters more than one singles age division.) See USTA Regulation II.D. For additional information on scheduling matches, refer to the USTA Friend at Court.

III. CONDUCTING THE TOURNAMENT

A. Tournament Committee Responsibilities Once Tournament Starts

- 1. Keep order. The Tournament Committee shall keep order on the grounds.
- Provide supplies including singles sticks. The Tournament Committee shall assure that each court is provided with singles sticks for singles matches using a doubles net and all supplies that it deems necessary for a match.
- 3. Provide balls. At least three new balls shall be used to start a match at

IV. PLAYER RESPONSIBILITIES AND CONDUCT

A. Checking in at Tournament

1. Prove USTA membership. A player shall provide the Tournament Committee with proof of USTA membership or deposit sufficient funds with the Committee to purchase a membership. A foreign nonresident player who has proof that the player is a member of the player's National Association is exempt from this requirement. The Committee may delegate this duty to the Referee.



- 2. Check-in at tournament desk. A player shall check in at the tournament desk before the scheduled time of each match. The Referee shall designate a place at which players shall check in. A player is not deemed to have arrived until the player checks in at the designated place and the player is properly clothed, equipped, and ready to play. The Referee may penalize a player who is on site for lateness if a court is available and the player has failed to check in at the tournament desk by the scheduled match time. See FAC Comment IV.D-1.
- Obtain time of next match. The player is responsible for obtaining the time of the player's matches from the Referee, rather than vice versa. Unless specifically authorized by the Referee, schedules of play carried in newspapers or other media are not official, and a player utilizes them at the player's own risk.

D. Point Penalty System

- Mandatory use in any sanctioned tournament. The Point Penalty System
 applies to violations occurring during the warm-up and the match in any
 sanctioned tournament except that it does not apply to tournaments that use
 a QuickStart Tennis format.
- 2. Purposes of the System. The purposes of the System are to: a. deter unsportsmanlike conduct;
 - b. ensure compliance with the continuous-play rule; and
 - c. ensure on-time appearance for matches.
 - The objective of the Point Penalty System is not to punish, but to secure compliance with the ITF Rules of Tennis and USTA Regulations.
- Code violations for misconduct. Misconduct shall be penalized pursuant to Table 12.
- 4. Time violations. Time violations shall be penalized pursuant to Table 13.
- 5. Delay between points. When practical in tournaments using a certified official in direct observation of thematch, the time that shall elapse from the moment the ball goes out of play until the ball is struck shall not exceed 20 seconds.
- 6. Officials authorized to impose penalties.
 - a. Referee. A Referee may impose a penalty only if the Referee has seen or heard enough to be able to determine with reasonable certainty that a violation has occurred. A Referee may also impose a penalty based on the report of what a Court Monitor or official has seen or heard or an admission from a player whose conduct is in question.
 - b. Chair Umpire. The Chair Umpire is primarily responsible for imposing penalties in a chaired match. If a Line Umpire observes a conduct violation or is the object of unsportsmanlike conduct by a player, the Line Umpire shall, as soon as possible and without disrupting play, Inform the Chair Umpire. The Chair Umpire shall then make a decision under the Point Penalty System.
 - c. Roving Umpire. Roving Umpires are primarily responsible for imposing penalties in matches without Chair Umpires. Roving Umpires may impose a penalty only if they have seen, heard, or otherwise observed enough to be able to determine with reasonable certainty that a violation has occurred.
- 7. Flagrant violations. While the imposition of penalties normally follows the progression of penalties from point to game to default found in **Table 12**, any flagrantly unsportsmanlike act may result in immediate default. If an Umpire imposes the default, the player may appeal to the Referee. If the Referee imposes the default, the player may appeal to the Tournament Appeals Committee.
- Appeal of penalty to Referee. A player has the right to appeal a penalty, but the appeal is limited to questions of law. See Appendix V, ITF Rules of Tennis.

- Penalties to be imposed on a doubles team. A penalty on a member of a doubles team is considered to have been imposed on the team.
- 10. Penalties treated as if points actually played. All penalties under the Point Penalty System are treated as though the penalty points or penalty games actually had been played so far as serving order, court occupancy, and ball change are concerned. One exception, as Table 14 indicates, is that a player penalized for lateness also shall be deemed to have lost the toss provided for in Rule 9 of the ITF Rules of Tennis. The penalized player is allowed to choose an option, but only after the opponent has chosen. A second exception is that the first ball change shall be calculated from the first game played. The choice to serve or receive shall apply to the first game played.
- 11. Time delays when each side is responsible. If both players or teams are equally responsible for delay during a match, any penalty will be imposed upon the server.
- 12. Penalties after medical condition develops. Except during the warm-up, a player suffering from a medical condition may buy time with a penalty.
- 13. Penalties imposed between games or before match. A penalty imposed between games or before the start of a match shall apply to the first point of the next game scheduled to be played.
- 14. Point penalties. A point penalty is scored as though the player had played and lost what would have been the next point.
- 15. Player may not decline penalty. A player who is the beneficiary of a penalty imposed upon the opponent may not decline to accept it. A player who disobeys the instructions of an official in such a case is liable to being defaulted.
- 16. Reporting penalties to Referee. When feasible, a Roving Umpire should promptly notify the Referee that a code violation has been assessed. After a match, officials shall report to the Referee each code violation imposed.
- 17. Other disciplinary action. Nothing in the Point Penalty System rules out a subsequent imposition of monetary fines, suspensions, or other disciplinary actions by whatever governing body has jurisdiction.
- 18. Announcing score after penalty. After a point or game penalty, the new score should be announced. After assessing a penalty that ends the match, the official should delay announcing the score until the official determines whether the penalized player will appeal.
- 19. Lateness. Lateness for a match, lateness for resumption of a suspended match, and lateness after a rest period shall be penalized pursuant to **Table 14**.
- 20. Default for failure to arrive on time.
 - a. Discretion of Referee. The Referee is responsible for issuing defaults for failure to arrive on time. After considering all relevant circumstances, the Referee may elect not to default a player or to reverse a default for failure to arrive within 15 minutes of the time when the match was scheduled and called.
 - b. Appeal of default. If the Referee defaults a player for failure to arrive within 15 minutes of the time when the match was scheduled and called, the player may appeal the default to the Tournament Appeals Committee. The Committee may reverse the default after consideration of all relevant circumstances. If the Committee reverses the default and if an alternate already has been placed in the draw, the Committee may not reinstate the defaulted player in the main draw or add the player to the consolation unless an opening becomes available.
 - c. Penalties assessed before default. If the Referee elects not to declare a default, or if a declared default is reversed by either the Referee or the Tournament Appeals Committee, any penalties for lateness assessed before the default shall stand unless the lateness was caused by an error of a tournament official. For example, if player A, after having been assessed a penalty of loss of toss plus 3 games, is defaulted for failure to arrive within 15 minutes of the time when the match was scheduled and called, and the default is subsequently reversed, the penalty of loss of toss plus 3 games shall stand, and player A begins play with the score 0-3. The player who received the benefit of the default shall have no right to appeal the reversal of the default.
- 21. USTA/Midwest Section Suspension Point System
 - See USTA Friend at Court for USTA Suspension Point System.
 - a. Application. The Suspension Point System shall apply to all singles and doubles matches (main draw, consolation, and qualifying) in a District Qualifier for the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Closed Outdoor



Championships, USTA/Midwest Section Championships, Designated tournaments, USTA/Midwest Section Level 4 and 5 events for the USTA National Rankings, and USTA National Junior Scheduled events. Suspension points will not be assessed against a player for the action of that player's doubles partner.

c. Persons authorized to file suspension point reports with the Referee. The following persons are authorized to file suspension point reports with the referee for offenses they personally witness:

- Tournament Committee members;
- · Chief Umpire;
- · Deputy Referees;
- on-court officials (including Roving Officials);
- · Court Monitors, is specifically authorized by the Referee;
- club or facility managers;
- hotel or dormitory managers
- · families housing players; and
- player development staff.
- d. Reporting of suspension points assessed. The tournament director or

- tournament referee of a District Qualifier for the USTA/Midwest Section Junior Closed Outdoor Championships, USTA/Midwest Section Championships, Designated tournaments, USTA/Midwest Section Level 4 and 5 events for the USTA National Rankings, and USTA National Junior Scheduled events shall, within three days after the end of the tournament, promptly submit to the USTA/Midwest Section copies of any USTA/Midwest Section Code of Conduct Reports assessing suspension points against any player.
- e. Notice to player and request for reconsideration. The USTA/Midwest Section shall forward a copy of the Code of Conduct Report to each player assessed suspension points and written notice of the player's right to request reconsideration of the assessment by the Officials Committee. This notice shall be sent to the player's parent or guardian, by certified mail, return receipt requested or by any other means capable of providing proof of receipt of the notice. The assessment of the suspension points shall become final unless a written request for reconsideration, is received at the USTA/Midwest Section within ten (10) days after notice of the assessment of suspension points. The player shall state the grounds for rescinding the decision to assess the suspension points.
- f. Reconsideration decision. Upon receipt of a timely request for reconsideration, the Officials Committee shall review the decision to assess the suspension points. If the Officials Committee disagrees with the decision to assess the suspension points, the assessment of suspension points shall be rescinded. The USTA/Midwest Section shall notify the player's parent or guardian of the rescission of the decision to assess suspension points. The decision of the Officials Committee to rescind the assessment of suspension points is final and cannot be appealed. If the Officials Committee agrees with the decision to assess the suspension points, the USTA/Midwest Section shall finalize the assessment of the suspension points against the player.
- g. Assessing suspension points and notice of right to appeal. After the denial of a player's request for reconsideration, the USTA/Midwest Section shall notify the player's parent or guardian, in writing of the reconsideration decision and that the suspension points will be assessed, The player may appeal the matter to the Grievance Committee of the USTA/Midwest Section. The notice shall be sent to the player's parent or guardian, by certified mail, return receipt requested or by any other means capable of providing proof of receipt of notice. The notice shall also state that the assessment of the suspension points shall become final unless the player's written appeal is received at the USTA/Midwest Section within ten (10) days.
- h. Appeal process. After a timely appeal is filed, the Grievance Committee shall hear the appeal in accordance with Article VI, Section 5(d), of the Bylaws of the USTA/Midwest Section and render a decision. The player may submit any additional information concerning the assessment of the suspension points to the Grievance Committee. The Grievance Committee shall not be bound by the Officials Committee's decision on reconsideration.
 - The player may appeal the decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee, to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors in accordance with Article VI, Section 5(e) of the Bylaws. The player's appeal, addressed to the President of the USTA/Midwest Section, must be received at the USTA/Midwest Section within ten (10) days after receipt of the written notice of the decision of the Grievance Committee. The appeal to the Board of Directors shall be accompanied by the filing fee of \$225.00. The filing fee shall be refunded if the player wins the appeal. The decision of the Board of Directors as to the appeal shall be final.
- Suspension of Player. Any player who receives 10 or more suspension points (the assessment of each has become final) within a 12- month period shall be suspended for 12 consecutive weeks from competing in any USTA sanctioned events. As a consequence of being suspended:
 - If, during the period of a player's suspension, no USTA/Midwest Section Championship or Designated Tournaments are held, the player shall not be eligible to play in the next USTA/Midwest Section Championship or Designated Tournament that is held following the



- expiration of the suspension period.
- ii. During the period of the suspension a player shall not be endorsed, and any prior endorsement shall be withdrawn, to any or all USTA National Championships that require USTA/Midwest Section endorsement and occur during the suspension period.
- iii. If no USTA National Championship requiring USTA/Midwest Section endorsement is held during the period of a player's suspension, the player shall not be eligible for endorsement to the next USTA National Championship that is held following the expiration of the suspension period.
 - At the conclusion of the suspension period, 10 suspension points shall be removed from the player's suspension point record. IT SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH PLAYER TO BE AWARE OF THE NUMBER OF SUSPENSION POINTS THE PLAYER HAS ACCUMULATED.
- j. Notification of suspension. When the USTA /Midwest Section has verified that a player has accumulated 10 or more suspension points within a 12-month period, it shall notify the player's parent and/or guardian of the suspension. This notice shall be sent to the player's parent and/or guardian by certified mail, return receipt requested or by any other means capable of providing proof of receipt of notice. The notice shall also inform the player of rights to appeal the suspension.
- k. Right to appeal suspension. The player may appeal the decision of suspension to the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee only if the appeal, is received at the USTA/Midwest Section within ten (10) days of receipt of the notice of suspension. The player shall not be permitted to raise in the appeal any issue in connection with the suspension decision that the player previously waived or that the player did timely challenge but that was previously decided. The Grievance Committee shall hear the appeal in accordance with Article VI, Section 5(d) of the Bylaws, and shall notify the player in writing of its decision and of the player's further appeal rights.

The player may appeal the decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors in accordance with Article VI, Section 5(e) of the Bylaws. The player's appeal, addressed to the President of the USTA/Midwest Section, must be received at the USTA/Midwest Section office within ten (10) days of the player's receipt of the notice of the decision of the Grievance Committee. Only those issues that were the subject of the appeal before the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee may be appealed to the Board of Directors. The appeal to the Board of Directors shall be accompanied by the filing fee of \$225.00. The filing fee shall be refunded if the player wins the appeal. The decision of the Board of Directors as to the suspension is final.

- I. Effective date of suspension:
 - If an appeal to the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee is not requested, the suspension will begin on the day following the ten (10) day period within which the player had the right to appeal.
 - ii. If an appeal to the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee is requested, and if the Grievance Committee affirms the suspension, then the suspension will begin one day after the date of the decision of the Grievance Committee affirming the suspension. However, the suspension will be stayed if the player timely files an appeal of the decision to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors.
 - iii. If any appeal from a decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Grievance Committee is made to the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors, and if the Board of Directors affirms the suspension, then the suspension will begin on the date of the decision of the USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors affirming the suspension.
 - All District Associations in the USTA/Midwest Section will also be notified in writing when the suspension becomes effective. The USTA will be notified of the suspension and other Sections may be notified of the suspension.
- m. No Suspension Points assessed for withdrawals due to illness, injury, or personal emergency. No suspension points shall be assessed for a default or withdrawal that is due to illness, injury or personal emergency.

- n. The USTA/Midwest Section Board of Directors shall adopt such rules as may be appropriate for the implementation of the Suspension Point System.
- 22. USTA/Midwest Section Recognition of Suspended Players. The USTA/ Midwest Section shall maintain a record of suspended players. The sharing of information regarding player suspensions includes, but it is not limited to, tournament directors, tournament referees, tournament committees, districts, sections, and the USTA.
- 23. USTA/Midwest Section Recognition of a Suspension From Another Section. The USTA/Midwest Section shall recognize a suspension of a player from another section provided that the affected player has exhausted all appeals in connection with the suspension.

A single flagrant unsportsmanlike act may be penalized by defaulting the player. See **USTA Regulation**

A game penalty assessed during a set tiebreak results in loss of the set. If assessed during a 10-point Match Tiebreak, this results in the loss of the match.

Conduct

- Visible or audible profanity or obscenity
- · Abuse of racket, balls, or equipment
- Verbal or physical abuse of a player or official
- · Receipt of coaching
- Abusive conduct by a player or a person associated with a player (USTA Regulation IV.C.10. refers to this situation)
- Retaliatory calls (obviously bad calls made in retaliation for the opponent's calls)



- Unsportsmanlike conduct (any other conduct that is abusive or detrimental to the sport)
- Failure to follow the instructions of an official
- Violation of any USTA Tournament Regulation (USTA Regulation IV.C.20.)

When a player is late in arriving for the player's scheduled match time and any court is available, the Referee shall start the lateness penalty clock. TheReferee is not required to keep a court open while waiting for a player.

A player is not deemed to have arrived until the player checks in at the place designated for checking in for matches and is properly clothed, equipped, and ready to play. A team is not deemed to have arrived until both partners have arrived.

B. Grievances

Any official, volunteer, player, or person associated with a player (including, but not limited to, a parent or coach) who observes a violation of **USTA Regulations**, Tournament Regulations for the USTA/Midwest Section, standards of conduct, fair play, or good sportsmanship in any tournament sanctioned by the USTA/Midwest Section may file a written grievance with the Chairman of the Grievance (or comparable) Committee of the USTA/Midwest Section.


If the grievance involves conduct arising out of any of the following tournaments, the grievance shall be filed with the Chairperson of the USTA Grievance Committee, c/o USTA Executive Director, 70 West Red Oak Lane, White Plains, New York 10604:

- · Junior tournaments on the National Junior Tournament Schedule;
- Adult, Senior, and Family tournaments on the National Adult, Senior, and Family Tournament Schedule;
- USTA National Intersectional Team events;
- · Category I USTA Wheelchair National Championships, or
- International competitions in which USTA players participate. (See USTA Bylaw 43 for procedures and time frames for the filing of grievances and appeals.)



C. Suspensions by Sectional Associations

A Sectional Association that imposes a suspension from participation in tournaments as the result of a grievance arising out of a sectional matter or as a result of a suspension imposed under its Suspension Point System shall report the suspension to the USTA National office within seven days of the suspension becoming final under the Sectional Association's procedures. If the suspension involves Adult, Senior, Family, or Wheelchair tournaments, the Sectional Association shall forward a copy of the notice of suspension to the USTA National Competitive Play Department. If the suspension involves Junior tournaments, the Sectional Association shall forward a copy of the notice of suspension to the USTA Junior and Collegiate Competition Department. The failure to forward the notice of suspension within seven days after the suspension becomes final shall not invalidate the suspension.


