BECOMING A USTA OFFICIAL: THE CERTIFICATION PROCESS

Welcome ... You are needed ...

to ensure that a tennis match is conducted under the fairest possible conditions!

To become a certified USTA Tennis Official please review the following **Requirements**, **Steps**, and **Resources**

Listed are the *REQUIREMENTS* for becoming a Tennis Official:

- United States Tennis Association: Be a current member in good standing
- Safe Play Training/Background Check: Pass (verified every 2 years in even years)
- Provisional USTA Umpire: Complete the required online training modules
- Nucula Account: Requested and established online (personal tennis officiating account)
- Vision Testing: 20/20 vision either corrected or uncorrected (every 2 years in odd years)

Follow these *STEPS*:

- CONTACT: Prior to completing the steps below, contact your District Chair of
 Officials. Contact information for District Chairs in the Midwest Section can be found at
 www.midwesttennisofficials.org. Provide your District Chair with your legal name
 (used on your USTA Membership and Nucula Account), birth date (if less than 18 years
 of age), mailing address, phone number(s) and USTA membership number and expiration
 date. Your District Chair will instruct you on how to proceed and answer any questions
 you might have. They will stay in contact with you throughout the process.
- 2. **SAFE PLAY TRAINING/BACKGROUND CHECK:** Complete Safe Play Training online, which will include submitting and passing a criminal background check. Both can be done at: www.usta.com/About-USTA/background screening program/
- 3. **PROVISIONAL UMPIRE TRAINING**: Complete the required online training modules found at: www.usta.com/About-USTA/Officials/schools and training/
- 4. **NUCULA ACCOUNT:** Upon completing the previous steps you will need to apply for a Nucula Account at: https://tumps.usta.com/nucula/. Just click "Request Account" and provide the required information. This will be your tennis officiating data account.
- 5. **GETTING ON COURT:** Contact your District Chair of Officials for specific details.
