1995 Hall of Fame Inductees: Dr. Anne Pittman and Margaret Varner Bloss

Dr. Anne Pittman: Anne's tennis career and dedicated hard work began back in the 1960s. She was a member of different Southwestern Tennis Association committees, she coached and directed many tennis programs across the nation, and she coached the US Women's Tennis team that played and won the bronze medal in the World University Games in Moscow. She was also very involved with college tennis programs and competitions across the nation during the 1970s. She was selected as the Intermountain Conference Coach of the year in 1976 and later received the USTA National Service Award in 1983. Finally, in 1995, she was inducted into the Intercollegiate Tennis Association Hall of Fame.

Margaret Varner Bloss: Margaret was a 3-sport champion that led a remarkable career as a player, educator and international goodwill ambassador. She could win with any racket, becoming the first person to represent the US in world competition in tennis, squash, and badminton. She was the US girls' 18 doubles champion in 1944 and 1945, a Wimbledon Doubles Finalist in 1958, Squash Champion in the 1960s and Badminton Champion in many world competitions. She is the author of *Badminton* and co-author of *Table Tennis, Squash Racquets*.
