## 2000 Hall of Fame Inductees: Dona Boyden, Sissy Kelly, and Maxine King

**Dona Boyden:** Dona began playing tennis at a young age and continued to play in high school and college. Dona took active interest in the Tennis Club of Albuquerque and later she and Paige Shunny started the first "all-city" league in Albuquerque. Furthermore, she continued her dedication to the game by helping with the establishment of the Northern New Mexico Tennis Association as she served as the first President, then Vice President for 6 more years and lastly serving on Southwest Section committees. She has been a "good-will ambassador for the sport".

Sissy B. Kelly: Sissy has contributed to the world of tennis since she was 14. She was very active in adult competitive tennis earning top 10 national rankings in every category from 30s to 45s, and a #1 sectional ranking for the same categories. Her volunteer work includes directing tournaments, raising funds for the Special Olympics, as well as being the co-founder of the Albuquerque Wheelchair Foundation. Sissy served 4 years as President of the Southwest Tennis Association, 2 years as a delegate, and 4 years as the USTA Player Development Committee Chair and Vice Chair. She is known to her peers as a true champion.

**Maxine King:** Maxine's tennis career began in 1933. From 1966 on, she was ranked in the Southwest Section in every age group and went on to earn many national victories. She has served as a section ranker and as Phoenix District Secretary, as well as Southwest Section Historian. Maxine has devoted much time, energy, and passion to tennis and is known as the "Grand Dame" of tennis.
