President's Message

It is an exciting year for tennis! At the national level there are two very exciting projects that will take place. First, there will be some major renovations taking place at the Billie-Jean King National Tennis Center at Flushing Meadows. The most significant project will be the construction of a roof over Arthur Ashe Stadium! Second, will be the construction of a mega tennis facility and new headquarters for the USTA in Orlando, Florida at Lake Nona. The project will be completed in late 2016 and will include offices, dormitory rooms for high performance players, a fitness center, and over 80 tennis courts including hard courts, clay courts, and indoor courts.

We had a strong year in growing tennis participation here at home in the Hawaii Pacific Section. Most President programs, activities, and events showed growth over the previous year. Although we have not conducted a formal tennis participation study in a couple of years, data from tennis racket sales and tennis balls sales indicate that tennis is growing and that approximately 10 % of the Hawaii population plays tennis.

We are working in cooperation with the National USTA to revamp and re-design some of our programs so they better serve the needs of our members and participants. For example, the Adult League program was totally redesigned for implementation in January 2014. We also redesigned the rules and regulations to Junior Competition ready for implementation January 2014 with the purpose of reducing traveling time and expenses for junior families and increasing the significance of playing competition at the local level.

Our success has been the result of a collective effort on behalf of the USTA Hawaii Pacific Section Board of Directors, volunteers, and staff. I would like to especially thank the Board of Directors for volunteering their personal time to serve the USTA Hawaii Pacific Section. Some Directors have served many years and have given countless time and energy to serve the organization.

Lastly, I would like to extend a heartfelt "Mahalo" to our 7,500 members for their continued support and dedication to our mission of promoting and developing the growth of tennis through participation in USTA programs and tournaments. We sincerely appreciate your support and patronage. See you on the courts!

Executive Director's Message

In 2013, the USTA Hawaii Pacific Section had an exciting year of growth, enhancements and increases in participation for most programs, leagues, community activities and events.

The year began with our signature Challenger event, the 2013 Maui Challenger at the Wailea Tennis Club on the island of Maui. USTA Hawaii Pacific is the only USTA section to run its own Pro Circuit event; it is a \$50,000 men's Pro Circuit event held during the second week of the Australian Open. USTA Hawaii Pacific has hosted six Futures and four Challengers in the past 10 years.

- Maui Challenger Wild Card Tournament at the Oahu Club The USTA Hawaii Pacific Section presented this singles tournament, with Petr Michney winning the singles main draw wild card and Gerald Moretti winning the singles qualifying draw wild card.
- Triple Crown of Tennis Hawaii's top men's doubles teams battled for the prestigious title of champion at three events hosted by the USTA Hawaii Pacific Seciton, the Oahu Club, and the Kailua Racquet Club. Players earned points for each round won. The winners were Jan Tribler and Mika Maatta.
- 2013 Oahu Club Open Championships More than 35 of Hawaii's open, collegiate and high-performance juniors competed in the 2013 Oahu Club Open Championships. The winner was Petr Michney, and the runner-up was Rong Ma. Adult tennis saw some significant changes in its offerings:
- A new four- part championship series called the Hawaii Masters Series
- A new 65 & Over League was piloted on Oahu with significant interest
- Player registration increased more than 3% for USTA leagues Junior Tennis continues to grow and evolve:
- Increase of Red/Orange/Green Ball Play Days and Tournaments
- 4th annual Family Fun Doubles Tournament saw huge success
- The 2013 Junior High Performance Training Sessions provided competitive training ground for Hawaii's top-ranked junior players and helped improve their overall development Community Tennis had many success stories:
- School Tennis, with the help of grants, is further developing fee-based school tennis programs at several schools in Hawaii
- The Play to Learn program is thriving, with programs at over 30 public parks, and over 8,000 participants this year The USTA Hawaii Pacific Section is striving to improve its governance and management through the concept of teamwork and continual improvment. We are excited about all of the opportunities to promote and develop tennis in 2014!

With determination, MDTA, its member clubs, and its many dedicated members, met the challenge of "Growing the Game," as well as managing those events that are popular and repeat year after year. Here are just a few of Maui's tennis highlights for this past year.

Our captains, tournament directors, players, coaches and parents continue to work on keeping player participation strong. In 2013, we had 115 league teams playing 1,541 matches on our fabulous resort and public courts. There were 6 Grand Prix tournaments with over 800 participants, along with 5 junior tournaments. We also sponsored an Adaptive Tennis program, School Days, Hyatt Tennis Festival, and the Wailea Fantasy Camp Jr. Tennis clinic that were all part of "Growing the Game." Our team successfully consolidated all of the District league rules into one reference document, making for quick and easy updates.

MDTA's "Save our Courts" campaign remains active and this year's testimony from the player community was instrumental in convincing the Maui County Council and Mayor to add \$435,000 to the 2014 Maui county budget for Parks & Recreation to repair the Lahaina Civic Center tennis courts.

MDTA was happy to sponsor 4 Adult League teams and 1 JTT team for their National Championships, funded the prize purse for the 11th annual Grand Prix tournaments, support the South Maui Tennis, the Hyatt and Wailea camps and festivals, awarded captain's gift cards, and provided assistance for juniors and their mainland tournament travel. Overall junior funding represented 40% of our annual budget.

In closing, those in the Maui tennis community should be proud of these accomplishments. "Thank You" to our board members, member clubs, LLC's, tournament directors, Parks & Recreation reps, Captains and to the resorts of Kapalua, Makena, Maui Country Club, Royal Lahaina and Wailea, for all their hard work, dedication and support of the sport. It's great to all be on the same team.


Oahu District Tennis Association promotes and supports HPS events that help the growth and enjoyment of tennis. ODTA is a volunteer-based, nonprofit organization. Mahalo to my directors and officers for their dedication and love of tennis! The Board now consists of the following Directors and Officers: Rodney Ching, Vice President; Dennis Leong, Secretary; Franklin Chee, District Delegate; Avis Tamura, Joann Hirata, Carol Goolsby, and Matthew Chun.

In 2013, ODTA held eight adult tennis leagues (5,506 players from 424 teams) and supported thirteen community tennis programs on Oahu. ODTA continued its tradition in recognizing all Oahu team captains during its annual Captains Appreciation Brunch in September 2013. More than 200 captains and guests enjoyed the scrumptious brunch while watching the U.S. Open Women's Final Championship.

ODTA adopted the Keehi Lagoon Park tennis courts where volunteers cleared the surrounding areas from debris and trash. These courts are used throughout the year by the USTA, JTT, and HTL leagues.

2013 Tennis Hall of Fame

Kahiau: A Tennis Foundation, is responsible for establishing the criteria and handling the selection of inductees to the USTA Hawaii Pacific Section Tennis Hall of Fame. There are two Tennis Hall of Fame awards recognized among the community: Service and Player. The Service Award honors a volunteer, official, coach or individual who has made outstanding contributions to tennis. The Player Award commemorates an individual that is recognized for outstanding competitive achievements with considerations of sportsmanship and character. In 2013, the USTA Hawaii Pacific Section proudly inducted two fine recipients for each category:



Sam Caldwell Service Recipient

Sam Caldwell began his tennis volunteer career in the mid-1960s when his two daughters began to play competitively. A social player himself, he saw the need for some additional organization and oversight to bring further structure to the tennis community – so he volunteered to help.

Over the next 30+ years, he was a fixture at local tournaments, assisting with draws, helping at the scheduling desk, and serving as tournament referee. He helped to develop the Hawaii Tennis Umpires Association that trained and supplied umpires for local and national tournament events. His volunteerism culminated with him serving as Hawaii Pacific Sectional Delegate for four years in the mid-90s.

Sam worked for tennis in Hawaii when "shorts were short" and t-shirts had collars. From the early days at the McKinley High School gym with Roscoe Tanner and Billie Jean King, to the stadium at Royal Lahaina Hotel with Jimmy Connors and John Newcombe, Sam was there as Tournament Referee. He remembers the "streaker" at the Hawaii Leis' World Team Tennis match at Blaisdell Center and how Lei's team member, Ross Case, was stopped at the door by security, insisting that he be let inside as "one of the ply-ers – Caise, Ross Caise" in his Aussie accent.

Now retired from the tennis scene, he's still recognized by generations of local players (with names such as Osborne, Somerville, Beamer, Tom, and Gusman) as their "Uncle Sam."

Bob Keaunui, Service Award Rick Fried, Player Award Jane Hirota Pang was raised in a quiet country town on Kauai and by the age eleven she won her first tennis tournament on Kauai. There were very few tennis players for her to play with and her tennis buddies were the men on the Lihue Plantation tennis team. Although she was not able to travel much for tennis tournaments, Jane was considered one of the top girls in the state. Jane contributed to the big upset of Kauai High School's team defeating powerhouse Punahou to win the State High School Team Title in 1958.

Jane played tennis for three years for the National College of Education in Evanston, Illinois and was the only player on the team! She competed in singles at the Intercollegiate Mid West Tournament by taking third place twice and first place once after beating the player from Northwestern University.

Jane has participated in many USTA league teams and many times she has competed with her teams at Nationals.

Since the age of 60, Jane has been playing in Open National age group tournaments. She has achieved success in both women's and mixed doubles and has won two gold balls, twelve silver balls, and eleven bronze balls, mostly in doubles.

2013 Maui Challenger





Wailea Tennis Club | Wailea, Hawaii January 20 - 27, 2013

The 2013 Maui Challenger brought the USTA Pro Circuit back to Maui for the first time since 2006. It is the only USTA Pro Circuit event held in Hawaii and the first \$50,000 Challenger of the 2013 season.

Several of Hawaii's own, current and former, collegiate players participated and earned singles and doubles Main Draw Wild Card entries by winning designated tournaments from Hawaii's own, Triple Crown of Tennis.

The tournament kicked off with a junior clinic featuring 10 and Under Tennis, a nationwide USTA initiative that scales the game to size for younger players. 10 and Under Tennis uses smaller courts, slower-moving and lower-bouncing balls, and smaller and lighter racquets designed specifically for kids.

After vigorous play, No.1 seed Go Soeda was crowned Singles champion. Soeda, of Japan, beat Zverev of Germany, 7-5, 7-5 to claim his second win in Hawaii.

"I feel great to win two times in Hawaii," said Soeda who was the 2012 Honolulu Challenger singles champion "I have good memories in Hawaii."

In doubles, the No.3 seeds Hsin-Han Lee and Hsien-Yin Peng of Taipei beat Americans Tennys Sandgren and Rhyne Williams, 6-7 (1), 6-2, 10-5.

Over 80 local businesses and individuals contributed cash, products and services to the 2013 Maui Challenger, including presenting sponsor, American Savings Bank.
