USTA Southern Announces Annual Awards

HONOREES WILL RECEIVE AWARDS IN JANUARY

ATLANTA – November 6, 2014 – United States Tennis Association (USTA) Southern has announced its recipients for its 2014 awards given for outstanding achievements in tennis both on and off the court. Twenty-three categories of winners will be recognized during the USTA Southern Annual Meeting at the Atlanta Perimeter Marriott Hotel. The awards presentation is scheduled for Saturday, Jan. 17, 2015.

Among the winners this year is Conner Stroud, of Rutherfordton, N.C. At 13 years, he is believed to be the youngest honoree (not including family members who won the Mickey McNulty Family of the Year award) since USTA Southern began giving awards in 1985. Stroud became a YouTube sensation when, with only small stubs for legs, he hit with well-known pros Andy Roddick and Jim Courier. In the last year, he transitioned to playing wheelchair tennis and was awarded the Wheelchair Excellence Award after compiling a 20-10 record with three tournament wins.

Selected winners were nominated as candidates by USTA staff and volunteers in the section's nine states: Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee. The winners were then selected from among the nominees by volunteer members of the Awards Committee and numerous other USTA Southern committees.

The winners of three prestigious awards – the Jacobs Bowl, the Charlie B. Morris Jr. Service Award and the President's Recognition Award – will be announced Saturday, Jan. 17.
