Wolverines on the road for opening round...

The real season has started as the GHSA State Playoffs are officially underway. Everyone's record is essentially back to 0-0, and it's win or go home. All three Forsyth County schools competing tonight are playing in games that are predicted to be decided by less than two touchdowns. West Forsyth will be on the road tonight at Brookwood High School in Snellville, GA. The Broncos (7-3, 4-1) are coming off several intense Region 7-7A matchups, not including last week's blowout over Lakeside. In the three games prior to Lakeside, Brookwood lost 21-0 to Norcross (eventual region champions), won in overtime against big-time rival Parkview, and came away with a victory in a 55-45 shootout at Central Gwinnett. The story couldn't be more different for the Wolverines. West suffered another heartbreaker last week at South, the first time ever losing to the Eagles, pushing the Wolverines down to the #3 slot in Region 5-7A for the second straight season.

The senior leaders look to turn that around tonight, though, and we have prepared all week to go into Bronco stadium and end another team's season so that we can extend ours. In order to do that, West must play better in the areas that cost the Wolverines last week. It all starts up front for the offense, and protecting #9 is an absolute must. The defense is looking to rebound as well, and we must tackle better and fly to the football if we intend to shut down the Brookwood offense.

A win tonight would likely put the Wolverines at defending State Champs Colquitt County next week, while a loss means planning winter workouts sooner than expected. While we look toward this game tonight, we are reminded of the sacrifice that so many have made that allows us to play such a great game. We would like to thank everyone who has served, and those who may have friends or family who have served, and put their life on the line for our freedom. We are forever indebted to them.
