DIVISION II ACADEMIC STANDARDS

1. Complete 16 core courses:

- (3) Three years of English;
 - (2) Two years of math (Algebra 1 or higher);
 - (2) Two years of natural or physical science (including one year of lab science if your high school offers it);
 - (2) Two years of social science;
 - (3) Three additional years of English, math or natural or physical science; and
 - (4) Four additional years of English, math, natural or physical science, social science, foreign language, comparative religion or philosophy.
2. Earn at least a 2.0 GPA in your core courses.
3. Earn an SAT combined score of 820 or an ACT sum score of 68.

DIVISION III ACADEMIC STANDARDS

Division III school, you do not need to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. Division III schools set their own admissions and eligibility standards. You can visit NCAA.org/d3 or contact the Division III school you are planning to attend. No athletic scholarships offered although, 75 percent of Division III student-athletes receive some form of merit or need-based financial aid.

3. Earn a SAT combined score or ACT sum score that matches your core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale

Initial Eligibility

Grade 9

- Understand the NCAA-approved core courses
- Ask counselor or visit **eligibilitycenter.org** for approved courses (find COHS list of classes on website)

Grade 10

- Register with NCAA eligibility center at **eligibilitycenter.org**
- Know what programs & courses you can take if you veer off course momentarily

Grade 11

- Check in with counselor to make sure you are on track to graduate with required number of NCAA-approved courses
- Take ACT or SAT and submit scores to NCAA using code **9999**
- At the end of the year, ask your counselor to send/upload official transcripts to NCAA Eligibility Center
- Double check to make sure you're on track to graduate with your class

Grade 12

- Finish strong in ***all*** courses
- If needed, take ACT/SAT again and submit scores as directed earlier
- Make sure to answer questions on amateurism and request certificate through account at **eligibilitycenter.org**
- Prior to graduation, make sure final scores/transcripts are sent to Eligibility Center
