

Guidelines for Glendora High School Athletic Participation and Eligibility

The following are regulations to which every participant in Glendora High School athletics must adhere:

1. Academic work must conform to CIF and school eligibility rules during the season of sport. Must be making satisfactory progress in all classes and have passed at least 20 semester periods on the previous report card with a 2.0 GPA.
Must be enrolled in a minimum of 5 classes on the GHS campus and pass a minimum of 4 classes.

Academic Probation:

A student who passed at least 20 semester credits but obtained less than a 2.0 grade point average on a 4.0 scale will be placed on probationary status. A probation period is limited to one quarter. Students may be on probation no more than two quarters during the student's entire high school experience. The second period of probation may only be used if eligibility is achieved at least once subsequent to prior probation.

2. Athletes are expected to attend all scheduled games and all practices called by the coach. Unexcused absence from practice may result in suspension from the team until reviewed by the Athletic Director and, if deemed necessary, the Advisory Committee.
3. Personal conduct must be maintained in a manner which will never bring discredit to the athlete, the team, or the school. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Conduct on or off campus
 - b. Conduct at home or away contests
 - c. Conduct on the bus
 - d. Proper handling of school and personal property

During the season, misconduct will result in immediate withdrawal of participation privileges for two (2) weeks. If misconduct occurs during the off-season, the athlete will not be allowed to participate in the first two (2) weeks of his/her next season of sport.

As soon as possible, each case will be subsequently reviewed by the Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee may, depending on the evidence, reverse the suspension or determine that more stringent action be taken including suspension from the team for the remainder of the season. The athlete will be placed on probation for one (1) calendar year. Continued misconduct during the probationary period may result in permanent exclusion from athletics at Glendora High School.

4. The use or possession of tobacco, alcohol, or drugs (categorized as controlled substances) or illegal performance enhancing drugs will be prohibited both on or off campus at any time or place. During the season, misconduct will result in immediate withdrawal of participation privileges for two (2) weeks. If misconduct occurs during the off-season, the athlete will not be allowed to participate in the first two (2) weeks of his/her next season of sport. Each case will be reviewed by the Advisory Committee and more stringent action may be taken including suspension from the team for the remainder of the season. (The same process as in #3 will be followed.) In each case, the athlete will be placed on probation for (1) calendar year. Continued misconduct during the probationary period may result in permanent exclusion from athletics at Glendora High School.
5. Personal misconduct of a more severe or unusual nature than #3 or #4 including, but not limited to, being charged with an inherently dangerous felony, may result in more stringent action being taken by recommendation of the Advisory Committee.
6. Unless administratively excused, an athlete must attend at least half of their classes on the day of an athletic contest to be eligible to play.
7. Athletes must be well groomed and clean in personal appearance. Athletes will adhere to school dress code. Failure to comply may result in suspension from the team until reviewed by the Athletic Director and, if necessary, the Advisory Committee.

8. Any athlete who quits a team after the first ten (10) days of practice will not be permitted to practice or participate in another sport until the end of the previous sport season. All athletes must turn in all equipment from previous sports before being allowed to participate in their next sport.

9. Any action which results in withdrawal of participation privileges may be appealed to the Principal.
