The term "WINNER" may apply to Greg Petru more than to any other Milford athlete. He won 11 varsity letters on teams that won 14 team championships, and a State Class "A" Runner up baseball trophy in 1989.

Greg was an important part of cross country teams that won three KVC, two Oakland County, and one Regional championship. His teams recorded a 34-3 record and finished 3rd in the State Finals three consecutive times.

In basketball, as a three year starter, he led his team to a 65-6 record including two league and two district championships. He holds school records for career assists (408), single season assists (178), and single game assists (14). Generally acknowledged as the best point guard ever to play for Milford, he was awarded Honorable Mention "All State" as a senior.

A three year starter in baseball, Greg was an outstanding infielder. In 1989, he led his team to the State Class "A" Baseball Finals where Milford dropped a one run decision to DeLaSalle in the championship game. He was a second team "All State" selection in baseball, batting .500 despite a serious knee injury.

Greg Petru was perhaps the best team player ever to wear the cardinal and white uniform. His presence and leadership on a team made that team better. He led his teams to an unbelievable 185-54 won/lost record. Unselfish and a fierce competitor, Greg will always be remembered for his lack of ego.
