Eligibility

- Grade-level counselors can answer some questions

Step 1

Register with the Eligibility Center at: www.eligibilitycenter.org

School Code: 430-070

Registration is recommended by NCAA at the end of the sophomore year in high school

Steps 2, 3, 4, and 5

- Send transcript to NCAA after six semesters
- Send ACT or SAT scores directly to NCAA (use code 9999)
- Take all of the core courses you need and do well! A list of Bartlett's approved core courses is available on the Eligibility Center's website
- Send final transcript directly to NCAA after graduation
- \$5.00 per transcript fee still applies!

Things to Know...

- What is a core course according to NCAA?
- How is a core course GPA calculated?
- What is a sliding scale for test scores and GPA?
- Who is responsible? Parents/ student athletes....

New to NCAA for August 2016 Entering Freshmen

- D-I and D-II both require 16 core courses (as of 2013)
- D-I athletes can qualify for Aid and Practice only OR for Competition (see sliding scale)
- GPA minimum for competition clearance will be a 2.3!
- Students enrolling in college August, 2016 or after MUST complete 10 of the 16 core courses BEFORE their senior year!
- A "repeat" of any of the 10 courses (above) may NOT be used for GPA calculation if taken in the senior year.

A Review: 6 Requirements!

- Register with NCAA Clearinghouse
- Graduate from high school
- Complete a minimum of 16 core courses (Division I and Division II)
- Have the required GPA for Division I (based on sliding scale) or a minimum 2.0 GPA for Division II
- Have a qualifying test score on the ACT or SAT
- Complete the amateurism questionnaire and request final amateurism certification (found on the NCAA website)

Additional Thoughts...

Eligibility is an individual process – no two student-athletes are alike – YOU are the experts!
