Hurd in the Halls.....

It's a common practice to give something up for the season of Lent. Most often, we give up things like chocolate, or alcohol, or soda, or cursing --- some kind of vice that we know is bad for us but in which we indulge all the same. We deprive ourselves of something we don't need in order to help us learn to live without it and become a better person. Recently, there have been movements to give up social media like Facebook, or even mobile phones and the internet all together, in order to help people reconnect to the people and things around them.

Giving up these unnecessary, and sometimes unhealthy, distractions from the real world can be very good practice for living better and more focused lives. A healthier body or a clearer mind are goods in themselves and they can help us in our efforts to lead better lives. Money not spent on unnecessary or frivolous purchases gives our families a safer financial future. There's much to be gained by giving something up for Lent.

All of that is great, and I encourage you to find something to give up for lent that you hope to give up forever, in order to live a healthier, simpler, or cleaner life. But I also encourage you to take on something new, that you hope to carry with you as you continue to live and grow in Christ.

When we celebrate Lent, we celebrate Jesus' ministry: his devotion to God's people, the giving up of his life for the sins of many, and his triumph over death as signaled by the resurrection on Easter morning. When we deprive ourselves of a luxury, we remember in some sense what Jesus gave up to serve God and God's people. Yet, during Lent we are also called to remember what Jesus took on, what he offered to the world, in that service.

There are several opportunities during Lent to learn more about ourselves and our congregation: Faith Conversations before church; Adult Discussion group on Wednesday evenings; workshops and worship on the first Saturday of the month. All of these can be opportunities for us to grow in Christ and gain a deeper understanding of our faith, our church and our mission. And if there is nothing that speaks to you currently, speak up yourself! Perhaps you'll be surprised to find others who share your particular interests and passions.

As always, there are a number of service opportunities as well, from the small to the great. The congregation is always looking for new ushers, for folks to assist in fellowship hour, to work with the youth and to participate in outreach to the world around us, from the John St. Soup Kitchen to the Food Pantry to the Thrift Shop. And we need not limit ourselves to what we know and already do, but to reach out further and find the greater need. While we walk these days of Lent together and remember what Christ gave up for us, and as we give things up ourselves, let us also remember the gift Christ gave to us, and give in the same spirit to the world he saved.



Together, we can end family homelessness! Food Cards are available for purchase each Sunday following worship.

Checks are accepted for payment

- You purchase food cards- value from \$10 \$100
- You receive the full face value of the card you purchase.
- What you don't spend remains on your card for later use.
- The store donates 5% of what you spend to prevent family homelessness.



- Dismas House: Their mission "is to reconcile former prisoners to society, and society to former prisoners." Through Dismas House, the Dismas Family Farm, and the Father John Brooks House, former prisoners are engaged in the hard work of rebuilding lives.
- Edward M. Kennedy Community Health Center (CHC): An organization providing health services to the community regardless of individual's ability to pay. Currently over 28,000 patients of all ages receive care and service through Kennedy CHC's medical home model of care.
- Rainbow Child Development Center: Provides care, education and therapeutic services for children. Rainbow provides high-quality education to nearly 300 children daily that helps to eliminate barriers and lower the achievement gap between low-income children and children with more academic, social and economic opportunities.
- CMHA, Hope for Housing (HFH) Gift Cards: HFH retailers donate 2-10% of all sales to the Hope for Housing program to assist families at risk of homelessness. By purchasing gift cards for local retailers, you help to stabilize families and keep them in their homes.

Please join us for these informative updates during and after worship in the month of March and learn how our Outreach efforts and funding are helping to fulfill our congregation's mission to *Serve Others*.
