It's hard to believe that it's already been six months since I moved into the corner office! It feels like it was only yesterday, and the days have flown by. Yet, we've done so much together as a congregation, and so much has changed for me over the last half-year. Together, we've both been trying to discern God's call to us and God's vision for us.

It's been a joy and a blessing to be on that walk with you, and to be the recipient of so much love and care, support and encouragement, on that path. I hope that you've also felt loved and cared for, and that my ministry has supported you and encouraged you on your faith journeys. As I'm fond of saying, there is so much more that we can do together than we can by ourselves.

For instance, this year we introduced with a Saturday afternoon service. And though it might not have had the results that we'd hoped to see, we did learn more about our faith community, our faith practice, and ourselves. We also experimented with a Month of Mission throughout Lent, in which we heard from representatives from several of our Outreach ministries during the service, and then discussions with them during Fellowship. Our Faith Conversations group is still going strong every Sunday before church. For Holy Week and Easter, we took advantage of our curb appeal to announce the resurrection, with a home-made cross and beautiful flowers. By listening to God's vision for us, we have expanded what we think is possible in our congregation, and we have enlarged our vision for ourselves as a congregation.

As you read this, I'll have completed all of the academic work necessary to receive my Masters of Divinity, a degree I started early in George W Bush's second term. My Clinical Pastoral Education program at St. Vincent's is over, and my final paper for my final course has been turned in. Next month, in our sanctuary, I'll become an ordained minister in the United Church of Christ. It's strange to come to the end of a long journey. Especially when the end isn't an end at all, but a new beginning.

I'm so grateful to all of you for your role in my reaching this achievement, which I surely could not have done without you. You have taught me and helped me to teach. You have spoken to me and shown me how to listen. You have loved me and allowed me to love each of you. You have taken my hand in yours and allowed me to walk with you. I am always humbled at how much you have all given me, in faith and love, and look forward to continuing to walk with you all.

## Adult Discussion Group May 2017

Greetings from the Adult Discussion Group!

The Adult Discussion Group has just finished a four week study on the critical subject of Forgiveness. 
## News from the Board of Church Life




## JOHN STREET SOUP KITCHEN


