Hurd in the Halls.....

The story of Pentecost is one of my favorite New Testament stories. I look forward to hearing the passage read during worship and singing songs about the Spirit and the foundation of the Church. Yet, it's not only the importance of Pentecost in the Church history, but also the way in which the story is told that causes me to love it as much as I do. It is the story of a joyful celebration at the end of an anxious and uncertain time, and as it unfolds in the telling, we feel that fear turn into hope.

The Gospels are written as narratives. They chronologically tell the story of Jesus' life, and of his impact on the people with whom he comes into contact. They are stories, or collections of stories, that show us who Jesus was and what he did during his too-short ministry. The Gospels give accounts of miracles and wonders, of conversations and commandments, of prayer and patience. When we read the Gospels, we see the whole person of Jesus come to life --- and hope to come to new life with him and through him.

Yet, outside of the Gospels, much of the New Testament is a collection of Epistles or letters. These letters are written by different people, to different audiences, in different situations. They are, to use the academic word for them, occasional; the letters are responses to something that happened or to someone who asked for advice or assistance. Though we believe they are inspired by the Holy Spirit, and so they can and do inspire us even today, it can sometimes feel a bit like reading someone else's mail. It might be good advice. It might make our faith stronger and bring us courage and wisdom. But we often feel a distance from them.

The Book of Acts, however, acts as a bridge between the Gospels and the Epistles. It tells the story of the Church as it told the story of Jesus Christ in those first years, as it spread from a cramped upper room in Jerusalem to Damascus, Antioch, Athens and even Rome itself. Acts shows us how the Holy Spirit worked on the disciples and guided the Early Church through many trials and tribulations, through debates and disagreements. It shows us struggles just like our own, in finding our way to be God's presence in the world, in allowing the Holy Spirit to guide us, in bringing God's Kingdom to all God's people.

The Pentecost story, in which the disciples are gathered, uncertain in their future, when the Holy Spirit descends upon them, is only the beginning of the story. It moves on from there, carried in the sermons of Peter, the acts of Philip, the journeys of Paul and the power of the Holy Spirit. And it continues today. As we read the Acts of the Apostles, we remember that we are also Christ's disciples, and that we have the same call to bring the Good News to the ends of the Earth. With trust in God, faith in Christ, and hope in the Holy Spirit, we can live out that call. The Pentecost story is only the beginning of Acts, and we are still ever adding to it when we live in love as Christ loves us.

We will resume Church school classes on Homecoming Sunday, we will not be offering church school classes during the summer.

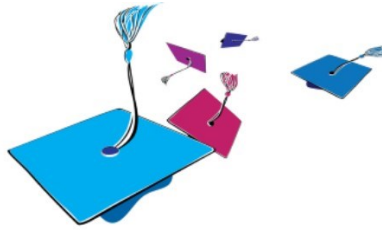
