Dr. D. Cory Hammond is a Psychologist, MFT, and Professor at the University of Utah School of Medicine. He is a past President and Fellow of the American Society of Clinical Hypnosis and of the International Society for Neurofeedback & Research, and is a fellow of the Society for Clinical & Experimental Hypnosis. He is board certified from the American Board of Psychological Hypnosis, as well as in both marital & sex therapy, in neurofeedback, and in EEG and quantitative EEG brain mapping from the EEG & Clinical Neuroscience Society. He has received two best book of the year awards, published 10 books (including the Handbook of Hypnotic Suggestions & Metaphors and Memory, Trauma Treatment and the Law), and more than 170 journal articles or chapters in books. He has received Lifetime Achievement Awards from two professional societies. Cory has also been a Consultant for the FBI, and Federal Bureau of Prisons and Justice Department, Salt Lake City Police Department, the National Center for Alcohol Education, and for U.S. Postal Service investigators. Dr. Hammond's presentation will include demonstrations and will involve techniques that produce powerful emotive experiences.
