


Congratulations Class of 2014!

City of Promise graduated its highest proportion of Seniors to date – all with advanced or standard diplomas.



All 7 of the City of Promise 2014 Senior class plan on continuing their education, compared with 80% of the 2013 Senior class.




City of Promise elementary students are on their way to closing the achievement gap, especially in math.




City of Promise upper elementary students closed the achievement gap in math, and are on their way to closing it in reading.



City of Promise middle students made big improvements over last year; they are on their way to closing the achievement gap in math.




City of Promise high school students outperformed other students in reading, and need more support in improving math scores.

Focus on the Youngest Kids


Overall, Spring rates of City of Promise students <u>not</u> meeting Kindergarten benchmarks is increasing – combining CCS PreK and Other PreK: 9% in 2012, 20% in 2013, 33% in 2014.

Focus on the Youngest Kids


45% of City of Promise 1st graders did <u>not</u> meet Fall benchmarks, compared to 15% of other students; and 50% did <u>not</u> meet Spring benchmarks, compared to 27% of other students.


Understanding Discipline

On average, City of Promise students receive at least one referral more often than their peers (especially in 7th and 8th grades).




Understanding Discipline

In 7th – 12th grades, City of Promise students receive proportionally more suspensions than their peers.



Understanding Discipline

On average, in SY 13-14, City of Promise students are kept out of school a little bit than their peers; however, City of Promise elementary school students are kept out of school substantially more than their peers.
