- Bill Belichick won his 251st regular season game to move past Tom Landry for third all-time, behind Don Shula (328) and George Halas (318).
- QB Tom Brady already has the most passing yards and the most wins in a single season by a quarterback at the age of 40, and his 14 wins overall since turning 40 (13 in 2017 and 1 in 2018) are now the most wins overall ever by a quarterback over the age of 40 or more
- WR Phillip Dorsett finished the game with seven receptions, a single-game high. His previous high was five receptions vs. Kansas City on Oct. 30, 2016 when he played for Indianapolis. He also added his first-career touchdown reception as a Patriot.
- RB James White scored on a 12-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the second quarter. It marked his 13th receiving touchdown since 2015, the most by a running back in the NFL during that time. It is the third-most by a Patriots running back, behind Larry Garron (26) and Kevin Faulk (15).

- QB Tom Brady threw two touchdown passes and now has 37 total touchdowns at age 40-plus, tied with Warren Moon, who had 37 total touchdowns in his 40s. Brett Favre is second with 36 touchdowns in his 40s. Brady had 32 touchdowns in 2017 and has five touchdowns in two weeks of action in 2018.
- WR Chris Hogan had two receiving touchdowns in a game for the second time in his career. He scored on a 7-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter and a 29-yard pass in the fourth quarter. He also scored two touchdowns vs. Houston on Sept. 24, 2017.
- TE Jacob Hollister hauled in a 23-yard pass from QB Tom Brady during the first drive of the game, the longest reception of his career. He had a 19-yard reception vs. Houston on Sept. 24, 2017.
- First-round draft pick RB Sony Michel made his NFL debut. On his first offensive play in the first quarter he caught a 7-yard pass from QB Tom Brady.

- QB Tom Brady now has 38 touchdown passes in his 40s, with 32 touchdown passes in 2017 and 6 in 2018 to move past Warren Moon (37). Brett Favre is next in line with 36 touchdowns in his 40s. Brady reached the milestone on a 10-yard touchdown pass to RB James White in the third quarter.
- TE Rob Gronkowski and Tom Brady have connected for 7,293 yards after connecting on 51 yards against Detroit, to move past Tony Romo and Jason Witten (7,287) for the second-most yards between a quarterback and a tight end in NFL history. Gronkowski and Brady entered the game needing 46 yards to move into second place.
- RB James White scored on a 10-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the third quarter. It marked his 14th receiving touchdown since 2015 and second of the 2018 season, the most by a running back in the NFL during that time. It is the third-most by a Patriots running back overall, behind Larry Garron (26) and Kevin Faulk (15).
- WR Cordarrelle Patterson returned the opening kickoff 45 yards. He has returned 29 kickoffs for at least 40 yards during his career. His 29 kickoff returns of 40 or more yards are the most among all active players. Darren Sproles is second with 27 kickoff returns of 40 or more yards among active players.

- Robert Kraft won his 300th game overall as owner of the New England Patriots against Miami. Mr. Kraft reached the milestone in his 25th NFL season and in his 432nd game, the fastest an owner has reached the milestone. Al Davis of Oakland accomplished the feat in 495 games (31 seasons) while Pat Bowlen of Denver reached 300 career wins in 501 games (30 seasons).
- Tom Brady connected with WR Cordarrelle Patterson on a 55-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. Brady has thrown a touchdown pass to 70 different players in the regular season, to tie Vinny Testaverde for the most touchdown targets by a quarterback.
- TE Rob Gronkowski moved past Ben Coates to become the all-time receptions leader for a Patriots tight end. He entered the Miami game needing four receptions to move past Coates and accomplished the feat on a 9-yard pass in the third quarter for his fourth reception of the game.
- RB James White scored in the second quarter on a career-long 22-yard run. His previous long was a 16-yard run vs. Miami On Sept. 18, 16. He had a 26-yard touchdown run in Super Bowl LII vs. Philadelphia on Feb. 4, 2018.
- First-round draft pick RB Sony Michel had his first NFL 100-yard rushing game after finishing with 112 yards on 25 carries for a 4.5-yard average. He is the first Patriots rookie to reach 100 yards rushing in a game since RB Brandon Bolden gained 137 yards at Buffalo on Sept. 30, 2012, exactly six years ago.

- QB Tom Brady won his 226th career game to tie Adam Vinatieri for the most career wins ever by an NFL player. Brady has 199 regular season wins and 27 postseason wins. His 199 regular season wins trail George Blanda (209), Adam Vinatieri (206) and Gary Anderson (201).
- Brady became just the third player in NFL history to reach the milestone of 500 career touchdown passes (regular season). He joins Peyton Manning (539) and Brett Favre (508). Brady entered the game with 497 touchdown completions and reached the milestone on a 34-yard touchdown pass to WR Josh Gordon in the fourth quarter, Brady's third touchdown of the night.
- Tom Brady connected with WR Josh Gordon on a 34-yard touchdown pass in the fourth quarter. Brady has thrown a touchdown pass to 71 different players in the regular season, the most touchdown targets by a quarterback in NFL history.
- TE Rob Gronkowski moved past Wes Welker into second place on the Patriots all-time receiving list after finishing with 75 yards against Indianapolis to push his career numbers to 7,487 yards. He accomplished the feat on a 15-yard pass from QB Tom Brady in the third quarter. He entered the game needing 48 yards to move past Welker.
- WR Julian Edelman caught 7 passes for 57 yards and moved past Gino Cappelletti into 9th place on the Patriots all-time receiving yards list. His 7 receptions also moved him past Kevin Faulk into sixth place on the Patriots all-time reception list.
- RB James White tied a career high with 10 receptions against the Colts. He also had 10 receptions vs. Carolina on Oct. 1, 2017 and 10 vs. Philadelphia on Dec. 6, 2015. He set a Super Bowl record with 14 receptions in Super Bowl LI.

- The Patriots finished the game without punting and were not charged with a penalty. It is the first time in the Super Bowl era that an NFL team played an entire game without punting or being charged a penalty. It was the sixth time in franchise history that the Patriots were not charged with a penalty and the fifth time in franchise history that the Patriots did not punt in a regular season game.
- QB Tom Brady won his 227th career game to move past Adam Vinatieri for the most career wins ever by an NFL player. Brady has 200 regular season wins and 27 postseason wins.
- TE Rob Gronkowski reached 500 career receptions after finishing with three receptions for 97 yards against Kansas City. He became the 15th NFL tight end to reach 500 career receptions. He reached 500 career receptions in his 108th NFL game, the fourth-fastest in NFL history among tight ends.
- Gostkowski tied a career-high with five field goals (48, 24, 39, 50 and 28). He also had five field goals vs. Cincinnati on Oct. 5, 2014.
- With his 106-yard performance, Michel became just the fifth running back in Patriots history and first since Robert Edwards in 1998 to have three or more 90-yard rushing games in his rookie season. In addition to Edwards (six times, 1998), Curtis Martin (nine times, 1995), John Stephens (five times, 1988) and Tony Collins (three times, 1981) have tallied three or more 90-yard games. Michel ran for 112 yards against the Dolphins and 98 yards against the Colts.

- FB James Develin scored on a 2-yard rushing touchdown to finish the opening drive. He had his first NFL two-touchdown game the week before vs. Minnesota. It marks the first time that he has had back-to-back games with a touchdown. He now has four touchdowns in his last four games. He had one in his first 74 games.

He passed for 279 yards and now has 70,138 passing yards. He reached 70,000 on an 8-yard pass to RB Rex Burkhead in the third quarter.
- RB James White caught five passes to push his 2018 total to 81 receptions, the most by a New England running back in a single season.
- RB James White had 25 receiving yards to push his 2018 total to 699, the most by a Patriots running back in a single season.
- DB Duron Harmon intercepted a Pittsburgh pass in the second quarter and one in the fourth quarter and now has five picks in five regular season games against Pittsburgh.
- WR Chris Hogan scored on a 63-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the first quarter for the longest play from scrimmage in 2018. - WR Julian Edelman moved past Ben Coates into fifth place on New England's all-time receptions list on a 4-yard reception in the third quarter. He entered the game needing three receptions to move past Coates.

- RB James White scored on a 17-yard touchdown pass from QB Tom Brady in the first quarter. It marked his 19th receiving touchdown since 2015, the most by a running back in the NFL during that time.
- DL Trey Flowers sacked QB Sam Darnold for an 8-yard loss in the third quarter to give him 7 1/2 sacks for the season, a new career high. His previous best was 7 sacks in 2016.
- LB Kyle Van Noy recovered a fumble that was forced by DL Adam Butler on a sack and returned 46 yards for a touchdown. It marked his second touchdown of the season. He returned a blocked punt 29-yards for a touchdown at Chicago Oct. 21. He is the first Patriots player with two non-offensive touchdowns since DB Kyle Arrington scored two touchdowns in 2014 when he returned a fumble for a touchdown on Oct. 5 vs. Cincinnati and a blocked field goal for a touchdown on Dec. 14 vs. Miami.
