18 bed telemetry/medicine unit with an increased focus on the needs of patients with psychiatric comorbidities

Team Members:

Problem

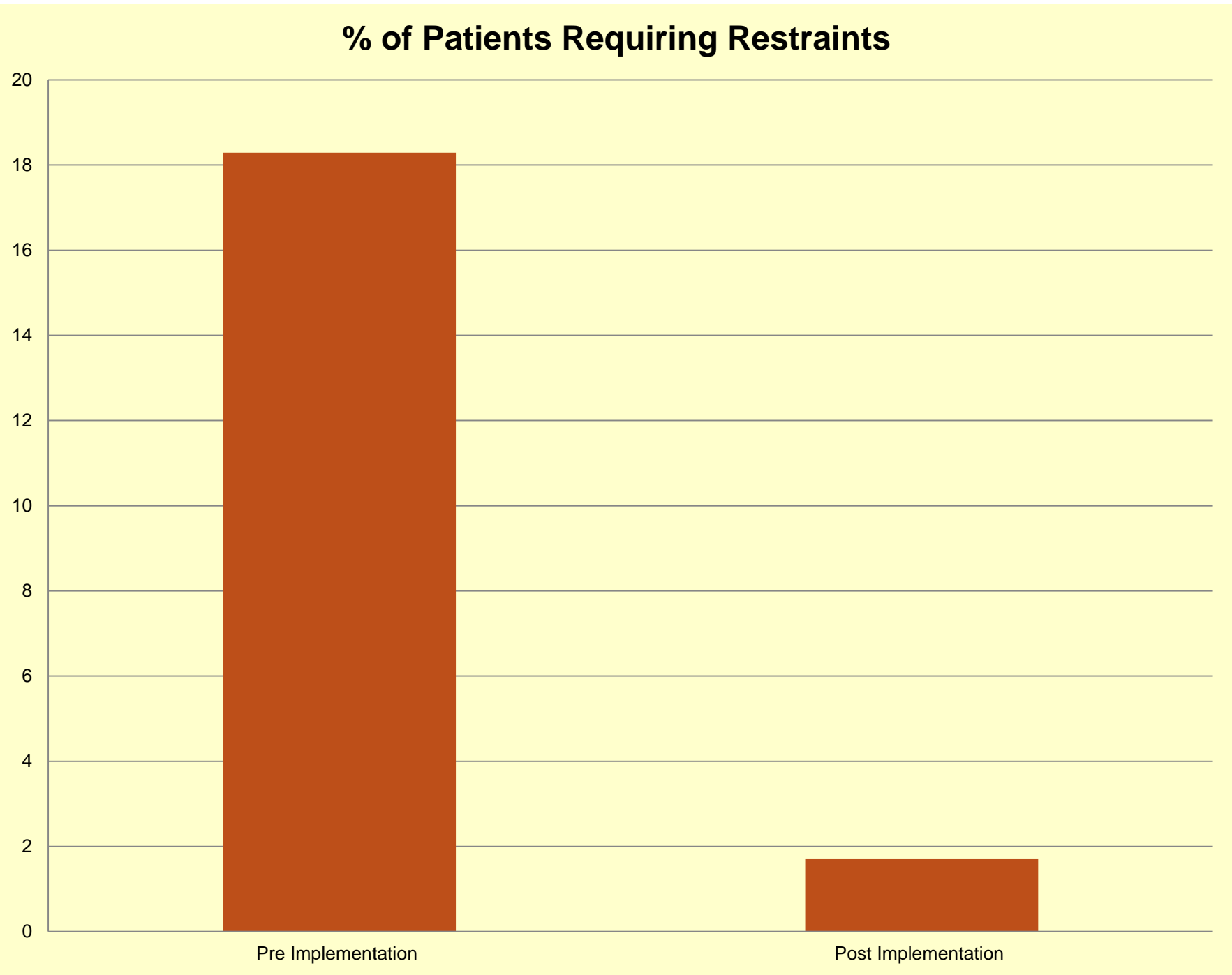
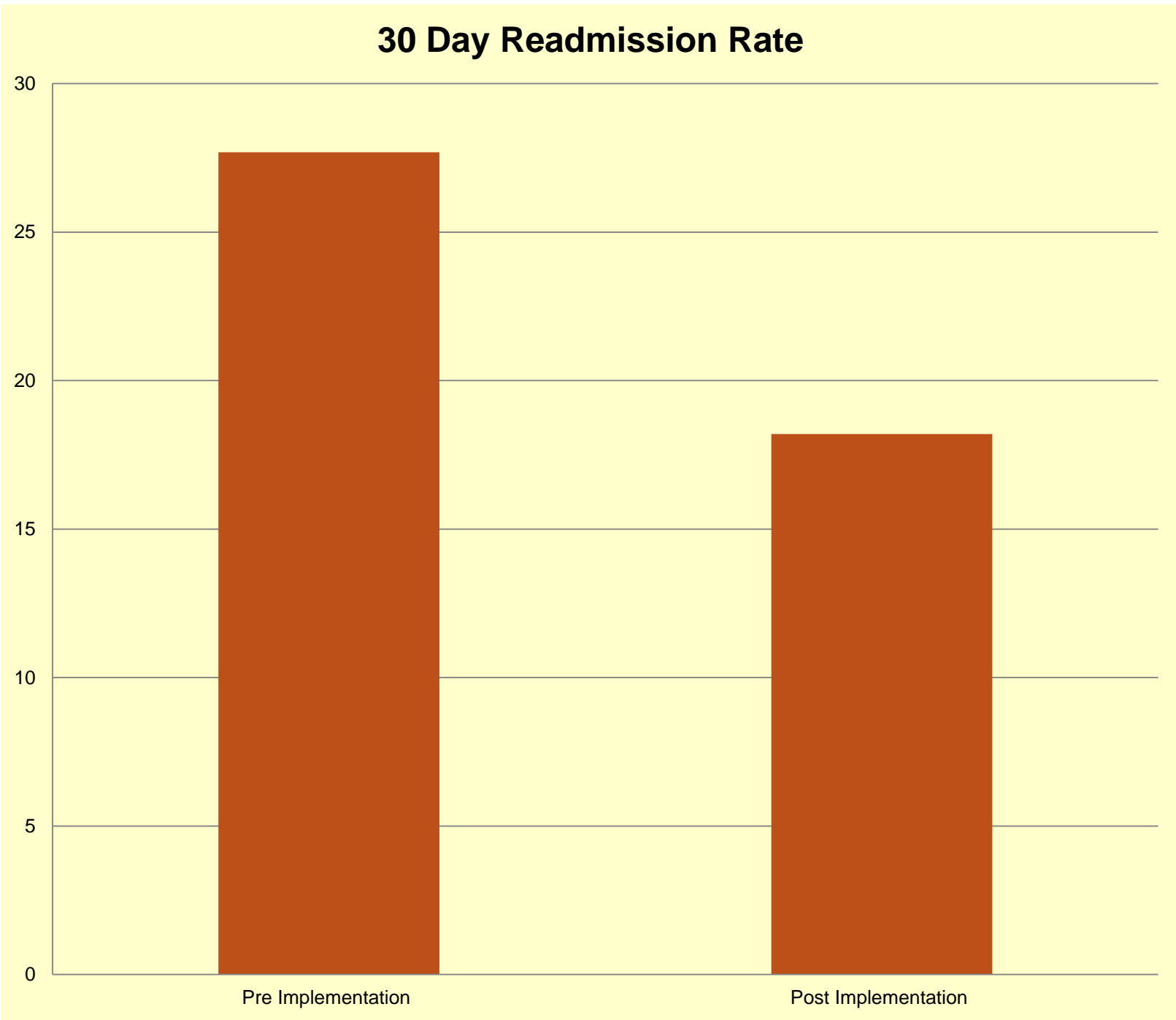
- Elderly population is accounting for more than 46% of hospital days on average
- Health care organizations have to provide comprehensive care at an efficient clip
- The existing process for geriatric care is less than efficient
- Those that exhibited challenging behaviors like delirium were placed on constant observation. Staff members selected for these assignments were unable to provide holistic, evidence-based care due to the complexity of patient needs
- A lack of a "geriatric-friendly environment"

Methods, Design, & Intervention

Unit Challenges

- Expanded and redesigned an existing unit to improve care for the elderly population with dementia and/or delirium co-morbid conditions
 - Soft color palettes
 - Televisions
 - Common area to foster socialization
- Fewer walls to facilitate a borderless environment
- Additional PES’s to facilitate a Restraint free environment, Decrease risk of deconditioning, Decrease use of behavioral medications
- Weekly education sessions by content experts
- Unit layout
- Culture change
- Challenging patient population
- Education to ancillary departments of changing patient population
