



On Sunday, April 24, we will transition to two morning services and move from the Sanctuary to the Upper Room for worship. This is a significant change in the rhythm of our church life together, and we want to prepare ourselves to enjoy a smooth transition so that our joy in worship will not be disrupted.

There's nothing more wonderful than a sanctuary filled with men, women, boys, and girls of all ages and backgrounds, worshiping God with one heart and one voice. Having two services and a single Sunday School hour for all ages at 9:30 a.m. will allow us to see and sit beside one another more, providing greater opportunity to enjoy fellowship and grow together as a church family.

We also have the opportunity to see a love for worshiping God formed in our children as they participate in services with their parents and learn as older saints sing, pray, and receive the preaching of the Word and administration of the sacraments.

This is an exciting time for our church. Because it is a time of change, it may also be a time of discomfort. Some of us will need to shift our Sunday morning routines. Others may sacrifice their place in a beloved class. So we pray that God will give us grace to demonstrate humble flexibility in these days, to lovingly serve one another, and to joyfully build up the body of Christ together.

## What initiated the plan to renew the Sanctuary?

The conversation began with the 1956 HVAC system in the attic of the Sanctuary, which requires complete replacement to avoid emergency repairs and provide greater reliability, more even climate control, and far better energy efficiency. As that project was contemplated, additional signs of age, wear, and tear came into focus — wall cracks, dingy paint, scratched and water-stained pews, worn flooring and carpet — and the need for lighting and electrical improvements based on the age of the building.


Our goal as a church family is to have a fully functioning Sanctuary that is comfortable in different seasons and inviting to new families and guests from varied backgrounds. As a church, we want to draw people to the grace and beauty of Jesus Christ, and part of that is making God's House a place that will be welcoming to coming generations.

## What will change and when will work wrap up?


The scope of work in the Sanctuary includes substantial modifications to the chancel, refinishing the pews, new flooring, replacement of windows, remodeling of the Narthex including two new windows on the front of the church, new moldings and trim, new lighting, and more.

The restrooms in Halverson are being remodeled and an Information Center is being carved out of the Media Center space. We expect work in the Sanctuary to conclude in early December 2022. We will continue to hold Sunday worship services in the Upper Room until the Sanctuary is completed.





## **Accessibility**

While work is underway on the Sanctuary, the accessible entrances will be the Upper and Lower Porticos, both with ramps and automatic doors. Accessible and visitor spaces will be designated in the lower lot (see map on pages 4–5).

## **Parking**

Additional accessible spaces are being added in the lower parking lot and six accessible spaces will remain in the upper lot. See the map on pages 4–5 for entrances and best paths to each.

Visitor parking spaces will move to the lower lot for easy access to the Upper Room. We do not anticipate that contractor vehicles or materials staging will affect the number of parking spaces available on Sundays.

## **Adult Sunday School**

Note that when services return to the Sanctuary, we will be able to resume holding one large Sunday School class in the Upper Room.

## Children and Youth During Worship Services

Children and youth are a vital part of the covenant community of our church. As they grow and mature, we want them to learn how to participate in the most important part of the life of our church — worshiping God. We recognize that this will be an adjustment for some families, and we will provide

recommendations on how to help your children as they learn to participate in the worship service. The corporate worship service is designed for all ages and the pastors will continue to keep children in mind in planning services.

#### Music

First Service at **8:00 A.M.** will include special music by soloists and ensembles, vocal and/or instrumental.

Second Service at 11:00 A.M. will continue to include the Sanctuary Choir. At special services such as Easter or when a brass ensemble is present, the Choir will sing at both services. Both organ and piano will be utilized for worship services in the Upper Room.

Hymnals and Bibles will be available in the Upper Room on a self-service basis. Please pick up your hymnal from the racks at the sides of the room on your way in and return it on your way out. Bring your own Bible if possible, or pick one up from the racks to share as needed.

## The Family Room (Room 210)

We welcome and encourage parents and children to attend services and worship together. If you should need to take your children out, you may take them to the Family Room to care for them and continue to follow the service via the TV in the room. To get to *Room 210*, exit the Upper Room via either stairwell near the restrooms and follow the signs. Ushers will be happy to direct you.
