About the Cover ... Celtic Cross

The distinctive "Celtic Cross" is generally identified with that form of Christianity which thrived in the British Isles from the first to the seventh centuries (A.D.). Among the best known representatives of this branch of the church are St. Patrick (389-461 A.D.) who Christianized the Irish, and St. Columba (521-597 A.D.) who evangelized the Scots.

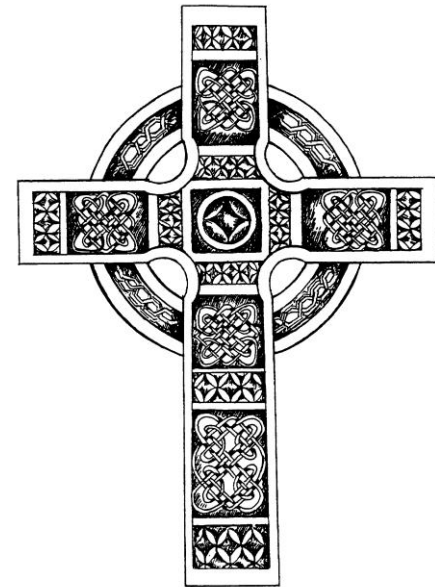
