DEAR CHURCH FAMILY,

My childhood home was heated with a wood stove. In late summer or autumn, we'd arrive home from school and a load of wood would be piled at the street. Several afternoons were spent hauling it up the driveway and stacking it for the arrival of winter. At the first cold snap of the year, we laid a fire and enjoyed its aroma, sound and warmth.

In long stretches of cold we kept the stove fed and our house was always toasty. It was someone's nightly duty to fill the stove one last time before bed. Each morning the fire died down to a bed of gray ashes. The long stretch between bedtime and breakfast consumed the fuel. Pushing aside the top layer of ash, however, revealed a bed of orange-hot embers. Adding kindling and wood to the fire box soon made for a roaring 600-degree fire.

I tell you this childhood memory to illustrate what remaining sin in the life of the believer is like. Remaining sin, also commonly called "the flesh" or the "sin nature" or "indwelling sin" in the Scriptures (Romans 7), is one of the enemies of the Christian. There are remnants of sin in every Christian and in some way, the hot embers that hide under the ash show us the potential for danger in our lives.

When we become Christians, God pardons our sins because of Jesus' life, obedience, and death (Romans 3). We receive His righteousness by faith. Sin no longer rules us though it does remain in us until we go to heaven. The Holy Spirit subdues in us our sinful desires, making us able and ready to forsake the flesh, devil, and world. These enemies come at us constantly, relentlessly, and from every direction. God's sufficient grace for the Christian life helps us to live by the Spirit and not according to the flesh (Romans 8, Galatians 5).

Air, kindling, and wood will quickly build up a fire from embers. Yielding to worldly desires, falling for Satan's snares, and indulging in personal temptations will set our lives on fire with dangerous sin. Feeding our lusts for things contrary to Scripture will build a raging fire, one that can consume, burn, and destroy our lives and hurt those close to us. King David's life tragically went this way (2 Samuel 11-12, Psalm 51).

Perhaps you struggle with a particular sin. God knows this. Scottish Theologian Thomas Boston (1676-1732) noted that God uses sin to humble us, stir us to prayer, make us watchful, and lean on Christ. Your whole lifelong struggle with sin keeps you looking to Jesus. If He pardoned us at the get-go, why then didn't Jesus rid us of this great trouble? So that His word, grace, and comfort would be ours by faith and that He would be glorfied in giving us the battle-gear and the victory (Ephesians 6).

God is always ready to help those who ask! Pray to the Lord that you would be rescued from interest and opportunity (1 Corinthians 10:13). Cut off, remove
