Confession of Sin

For our iniquities have gone over our heads; they weigh like burdens too heavy for us. Forgive our sins, pardon our iniquities, and restore our communion with You, we ask through our Blessed Lord Jesus, Who for a little while was made lower than the angels, and is now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, Who by your grace tasted death for everyone. Amen.

Westminster Larger Catechism Question 52

How was Christ exalted in his resurrection?

Christ was exalted in his resurrection, in that,
not having seen corruption in death,
(of which it was not possible for him to be held,)
and having the very same body in which he suffered,
really united to his soul,
he rose again from the dead the third day
by his own power;
whereby he declared himself
to be the Son of God,
to have satisfied divine justice,
to have vanquished death,
and to be Lord of the living and dead:
all which he did
as the head of his church,
for their justification,
for their growing in grace,
for their support against enemies,
and to assure them of their resurrection from the dead
at the last day.
