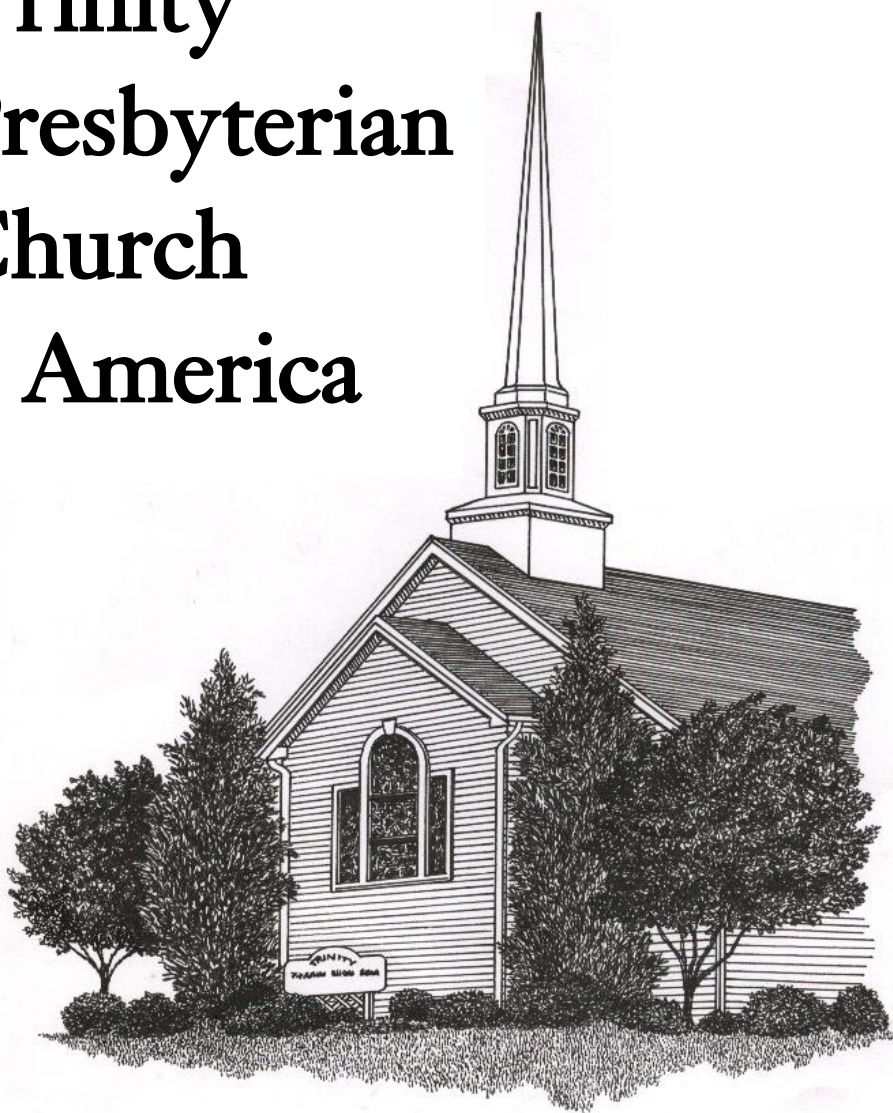

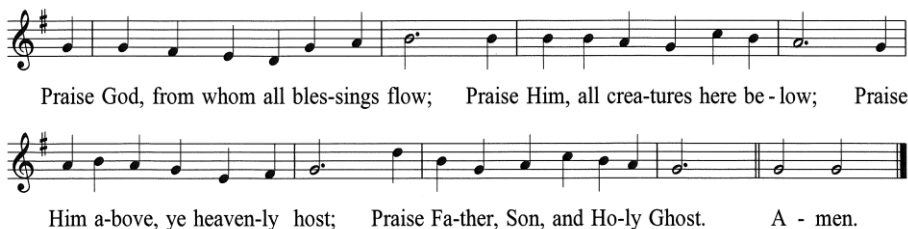

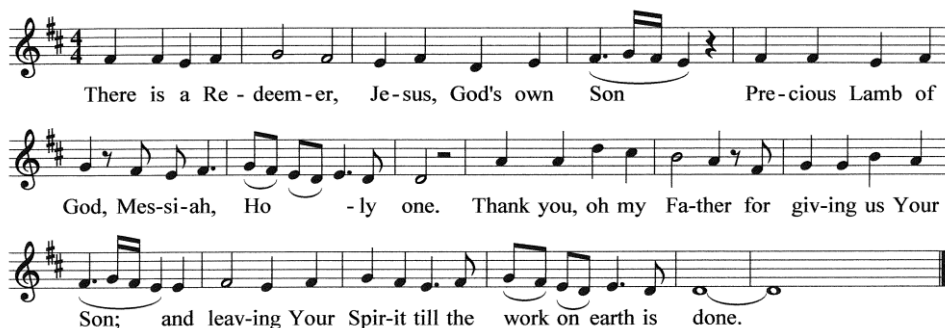

FAMILY WORSHIP HELPS

WEEK 97

THIS WEEK'S FOCUS

QUESTION 101: *What do we pray for in the first petition?*

ANSWER: In the first petition (which is, Hallowed be thy name) we pray, that God would enable us and others to glorify him in all that whereby he maketh himself known; and that he would dispose all things to his own glory.



MONDAY



Praise: Sing Psalm 111B

Scripture: Read Psalm 89:1-6

Key Thought: *The first petition of the Lord's Prayer is the best petition.*

Questions:

- ☪ Why is this the first petition of the Lord's Prayer?
- ☪ Why is this the best petition of the Lord's Prayer?
- ☪ Why is this the only petition of the Lord's Prayer that will still be prayed in eternity?

Prayer

Notes: Watson writes: "This petition is set in the forefront, to show that the hallowing of God's name is to be preferred before all things. It is to be preferred before life. We pray 'Hallowed be your name' before we pray, 'Give us this day our daily bread.' It is to be preferred before salvation. God's glory is worth more than the salvation of all men's souls. As Christ said of love in Matt. 22:38 'This is the first and great commandment;' so I may say of this petition, 'Hallowed be Thy name;' it is the first and great petition; it contains the most weighty thing in religion, which is God's glory. When some of the other petitions shall be useless and out of date, as we shall not need to pray in heaven, 'Give us our daily bread,' because there shall be no hunger; nor 'Forgive us our trespasses,' because there shall be no sin; nor, 'Lead us not into temptation,' because the old serpent is not there to tempt; yet the hallowing of God's name will be of great use and request in heaven" (commentary on the *Catechism*). When we begin our prayers with this petition, we are reminded that God's glory is to be sought above everything else—and in everything else—that we might ask of Him. The first petition of the Lord's Prayer, then, provides a framework for all that we pray and all that we do. We want to see His kingdom advanced, His people blessed, our sins forgiven, and our lives sanctified—not for our benefit alone but, above all, so that the matchless name of God, and all that He is, might be magnified in heaven, on earth, and under the earth. Is this the foremost desire of your heart when you draw near to God in prayer? Does the desire for His glory overshadow and shape all that you ask of Him?



TUESDAY



Praise: Sing Psalm 111B

Scripture: Read Acts 19:13-17; Psalm 75:1

Key Thought: *We pray that God's name will be hallowed in the world.*

Questions:

☪ What is meant by the “name” of God? How many names does He have? Why?

☪ How does God glorify His name among unbelievers?

Prayer

Notes: The *Larger Catechism* says that in the first petition “we pray, that God would by his grace enable and incline us and others to know, to acknowledge, and highly to esteem him, his titles, attributes, ordinances, word, works, and whatsoever he is pleased to make himself known by,” and so we pray that He would “by his overruling providence, direct and dispose of all things to his own glory.” When we pray for God’s “name” to be hallowed, we are asking Him to demonstrate His character. God reveals Himself through many names. He is Father, Son and Spirit, Creator, Sustainer, Redeemer, Judge, King of kings, Mighty God, Lord of hosts, the Holy One of Israel, and the eternal “I AM.” Each name by which the Lord reveals Himself to men conveys a particular aspect of who He is. Even if we knew God by ten million names, we would still be infinitely far from comprehending all that can be known about Him. In the first petition of the Lord’s Prayer we ask Him to declare His glory in the world, to make Himself known by His works of Creation and Providence. We are asking Him to demonstrate His power so that all will know that He is God, and will tremble before Him. We are asking Him to show His power by casting down “every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God” (2 Cor. 10:5). We are calling upon Him to rise up in judgment upon the wicked and to expose their foolishness. We are joining in the prayer of Isaiah: “Make Your name known to Your adversaries, that the nations may tremble at Your presence!” (Isa. 64:2). We are praying with David, “All nations whom You have made shall come and worship before You, O LORD, and shall glorify Your name. For You are great, and do wondrous things; You alone are God” (Ps. 86:9-10).



WEDNESDAY



Praise: Sing Psalm 111B

Scripture: Read Psalm 22:22-31

Key Thought: *We pray that God's name will be hallowed in the church.*

Questions:

☪ For what purpose do God’s people gather in worship?

☪ How should this affect our preparation for worship?

☪ How should this affect our participation in worship?

☪ How should this affect our application of worship?

Prayer

Notes: When God chose Israel as His special possession, He instructed that a central place of worship be constructed, first a tabernacle and later a temple. God described the temple as “the place which I have chosen as a dwelling for My name” (Deut. 12:5; Neh. 1:9). When Israel committed idolatry, they were judged for defiling the dwelling place of the Lord’s name through their false worship. God is omnipresent, and yet His particular presence is manifested when His people gather together to worship Him according to His appointed ordinances. This is why the *Larger Catechism* mentions knowing, acknowledging, and highly esteeming His ordinances as part of what we pray for in the first petition of the Lord’s Prayer. We are to call upon the Lord, asking Him to bring honor to Himself by keeping His worship pure and undefiled. Corporate worship is not an option for the people of God. It is the very essence of their identity. Contrary to popular thinking, faith is not individualistic, but corporate. Throughout the Bible, God speaks in the plural when He speaks of salvation (2 Sam. 7:23-24; 1 Pet. 2:9-10). David said that God redeemed a people “to make for Himself a name.” Therefore, the name of God is hallowed and set apart in a special way when the people He has redeemed gather together to worship Him. The first petition of the Lord’s Prayer is a request that God would be glorified in the worship of His church. As we prepare to gather for worship, we should pray “Hallowed be Thy name.” As we participate in worship, our prayer should be that God’s name would be sanctified in our hearts. As we leave the worship assembly, this petition should also be on our lips, that God’s glory would be seen as His Word takes root in our lives.



THURSDAY



Praise: Sing Psalm 111B

Scripture: Read Acts 9:1-16

Key Thought: *We pray that God’s name will be hallowed in our lives.*

Questions:

- ☞ How do the actions of a child reflect on the name of his father?
- ☞ How is God’s name hallowed in our thoughts, words, and deeds?

Prayer

Notes: While we must never lose sight of our corporate identity as the body of Christ, it is also true that the body is comprised of individual members. Each member has a function, and the working of those members in their particular roles brings glory to the Head, which is God. So, another aspect of praying, “Hallowed be Thy name” is that of seeking the Lord’s grace to reflect His glory in our individual lives and callings. This has important applications for personal holiness as well as vocation and service. Every child bears the name of his father, and his actions reflect upon that name, whether positively or negatively. To pray for God’s name to be hallowed, then, is to seek grace to bear His name in such a way—in personal and public conduct—that He is honored in your life.



Praise: Sing Psalm 111B

Scripture: Read Acts 15:6-18

Key Thought: *We pray that God's name will be hallowed in evangelism.*

Questions:

☞ Why did God visit the Gentiles, according to Peter (Acts 15:14)?

☞ What is the main goal in evangelism?

Prayer

Notes: In Acts 15, James reminded the apostles and elders of Peter's testimony that God "visited the Gentiles to take out of them a people for His name." The main goal in evangelism is not "winning souls"—which is a man-centered purpose—but hallowing the name of God. Thomas Watson writes: "We hallow God's name . . . when, by all holy expedients, counsel, prayer, example, we endeavor the salvation of others. How did Monica, Augustine's mother, labor for his conversion! She had sorer pangs in travail for his new birth than for his natural birth. It is hallowing God's name when we diffuse the sweet savour of godliness, and propagate religion to others; when not only we ourselves honor God, but are instruments to make others honor Him. Certainly when the heart is seasoned with grace, there will be an endeavor to season others. God's glory is as dear to a saint as his own salvation; and that this glory may be promoted he endeavors the conversion of souls. Every convert is a new member added to Christ" (commentary on the *Catechism*). The chief field of labor for each of us in this pursuit is the sphere of influence that is closest to us. Watson continues: "Let us then hallow God's name by laboring to advance piety in others; especially let us endeavor that those who are nearly related to us, or are under our roof, may honor God (Josh. 24:15). Let us make our houses Bethels, places where God's name is called upon. Let the parent endeavor that his children may honor God, and the master that his servants may honor Him. Read the Word, drop holy instruction, perfume your houses with prayer. . . . This is hallowing God's name when we make proselytes to Him, and endeavor that all under our charge should honor and sanctify His name."



Note: Only five lessons per week are included. You are encouraged to lead your family in worship seven days a week. On weekends, you may want to review or build upon the lessons from the previous week, discuss the sermon from Sunday morning, or work on questions from the Catechism or memory verses. These lesson suggestions are intended to provide a simple framework for parents to build upon. You are not limited to this content. The habit of morning and evening family worship is the biblical ideal. We hope you can use these lessons as a starting point for the development of a blessed practice of family worship in your home.
