Youth Ministry Summit

This past March, I was able to join over 100 people who work with teenagers in Ligonier, PA. It was the first training that I have been on in a long time. There were three areas in which I was challenged to think and pray about changes in the youth ministry at Trinity.

I am not their primary influencer, but parents are. I want to pray for parents more regularly and help them know how they can connect with their teens and disciple them.

I want the leadership team that is involved in the lives of the teenagers to be connected better. We have wonderful people teaching and discipling the teenagers of Trinity. The great thing about an awesome team is you trust each other and can let things go on cruise control. Over some chaotic years we got away from connecting with each other. I am thinking of ways in which I can pray for and encourage our adult leadership team and also give them the resources to connect with and disciple our teenagers.

I want to think through how we develop a student leadership team. One of the challenges of ministry is to treat all students who are following Christ as leaders, and not to form a smaller team as much as train all the students to lead. I am not sure what that will look like at Trinity but it starts with prayer and equipping our adults to encourage and challenge our students to lead.

Lastly, I am an old dog and I like the tricks I do. We made a lot of changes this year in youth group to freshen things up. I know there are other things that could change to provide a better environment for our youth to connect with each other, bring their friends and most importantly be challenged in what it means to follow Jesus with their lives.

I am not sure what all this will look like but I am excited because I know the Lord is at work in our church and in the youth ministry. I know He wanted me at this summit because I needed to be refreshed and to see new ministry opportunities from a different angle. Pray for the youth ministry and that God will continue to lead us and that we would follow Him.




