CHARLIE "TIN MAN" LUCAS' STUDIO- SELMA

Known for his knack at recycling metal and other materials into 3-D works, Charlie Lucas turned a hobby into a profession. He has lectured at Yale and painted in Paris. His story and works also appear in more than 40 books.

EDMUND PETTUS BRIDGE- SELMA

The Edmund Pettus Bridge, now a National Historic Landmark, was the site of the brutal Bloody Sunday beatings of civil rights marchers during the first Selma march for voting rights. The televised attacks were seen all over the nation, prompting public support for the civil rights activists in Selma and for the voting rights campaign. After Bloody Sunday, protestors were granted the right to continue marching, and two more marches across the bridge for voting rights followed.

MILLER'S POTTERY BY ALLEN HAM- BRENT

Allen Ham is a sixth generation potter and the youngest member of the Ham-Miller family of potters. He was trained mainly in his grandfather Hendon Miller's shop in Brent and was one of the primary turners at Miller Pottery after Hendon's death. Often using ash glaze clay from Perry County, each piece is made by hand as it has been for 6 generations with the same local clay source.

MOORE-WEBB-HOLMES PLANTATION- MARION

Located just west of Marion, this is one of Alabama's last active plantations and has been in the same family since the early 1800s. Most of the buildings are original to the site and include the log seed house where the very first, and second, gin was put to use, a carriage house, smoke house, chicken coop, a potato house with a pit for vegetable storage, and a blacksmith shop along with many other essential buildings to sustain life during that period. A two-story Federal/Greek Revival style house with clapboards covering the original log structure is on site, as well.

OLD CAHAWBA ARCHEOLOGICAL PARK- ORRVILLE

Old Cahawba is Alabama's most famous ghost town. In 1819 the town was carved out of the wilderness to be the state's first capital. Although the state changed the location of the capital in 1826, Cahawba continued to grow into a thriving and wealthy river town.

PERRY LAKES PARK- MARION

The Perry Lakes Park and Wildlife Sanctuary contains about 600 acres available to the public for outdoor recreation, education, scientific and research. Walking through the woods is fairly easy and fun. The park features a unique birding tower, pavilion and restroom facilities designed and constructed by Auburn University's Rural Studio Program.

EUFULA NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE- EUFAULA

The Eufaula National Wildlife Refuge protects and provides a habitat for many of the areas threatened/endangered species while offering a host of recreational activities for visitors. You will find diverse wildlife and habitats at the refuge along the walking trails. Also a great fishing spot.

FENDALL HALL- EUFAULA

Fendall Hall is one of Eufaula's many historical sites. Visitors will be able to see one of the most outstanding examples of Italianate architecture in the entire state. The structure has amazing features such as its ornate exterior form as well as the elaborate wall and ceiling murals in the parlor, entrance hall, and dining room. Much of the interior has been restored to include pieces which reflect how the house was furnished in the late 1800s.

JOHNSON CENTER FOR THE ARTS- TROY

Housed in Troy's classic-revival style post office building which dates back to the early 1900s, Johnson Center for the Arts is home to several galleries which showcase artworks from Alabama creatives. This relaxed space, set over two floors, allows visitors to browse artwork from local artists at their own pace. Exhibitions change frequently, around every six weeks, so you can visit more than once and never see the same art.

PIONEER MUSEUM OF ALABAMA- TROY

The interactive museum opened in 1971, when hundreds of locals came together to try and preserve a disappearing heritage. You can walk around the perimeter to explore sugar cane processing mills, a grist mill, rustic church and a covered bridge, and if you're into old trains, there's even an 1800s steam locomotive lying around. Inside demonstration cabins you can experience old country store shopping, visit a working blacksmith's shop, and a pioneering kitchen where cornbread is made.

THE RED DOOR THEATRE- UNION SPRINGS

The Red Door Theatre offers an enchanting opportunity to visit a small Southern town while taking in a professional theatrical performance. The Red Door quickly established an outstanding reputation as a quality regional theatre, offering audiences the opportunity to experience entertaining productions in an intimate 144-seat setting. Four productions with optional dinners are presented annually.

WE PIDDLE AROUND THEATER- BRUNDIDGE

The We Piddle Around Theater is housed in the former Brundidge City Hall which was built in 1940 as a Works Project Administration project. The WPA workers gained the reputation, rightly or wrongly so, of folks just "piddling around". The theater is home to Alabama's Official Folklife Play, 'Come Home, It's Suppertime' and the annual Pike Piddlers Storytelling Festival.

What started more than four decades ago as a record book for free range Alabama Whitetails, is now a show and tell museum.

CHOCTAW COUNTY HISTORICAL MUSEUM- GILBERTOWN

This is an interpretative museum that's located beside the Town Park at downtown Gilbertown. The main building of the museum contains artifacts that illustrate life in Choctaw County during earlier times. Behind the main museum is another building that contains the larger items including old farming equipment. There is also an old country store that was relocated to the museum site and a small log cabin that was constructed with logs from Choctaw County's first courthouse at Barrytown. Next door to the museum is the Town Park which has an old caboose and an old Hunt oil rig that's similar to the rig at Gilbertown that was the first in Alabama to strike oil.

GAINESWOOD NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK- DEMOPOLIS

Constructed over an 18 year period (1843-1861), this Greek Revival style mansion contains much of its original furnishings. Here's what a recent visitor posted:
"Gaineswood is a fabulous vision of loveliness inside and out. The people of Alabama do not know what an incredible treasure stands in their midst. Having lived in Charleston I can tell you this is better than any museum house there."

There's the two-headed ducklings, a large gallstone attached to poems (art he calls "intertwangleism"), drawings of skeletons and bones superimposed on old photographic portraits, and found-object art mixed with taxidermy animals.
