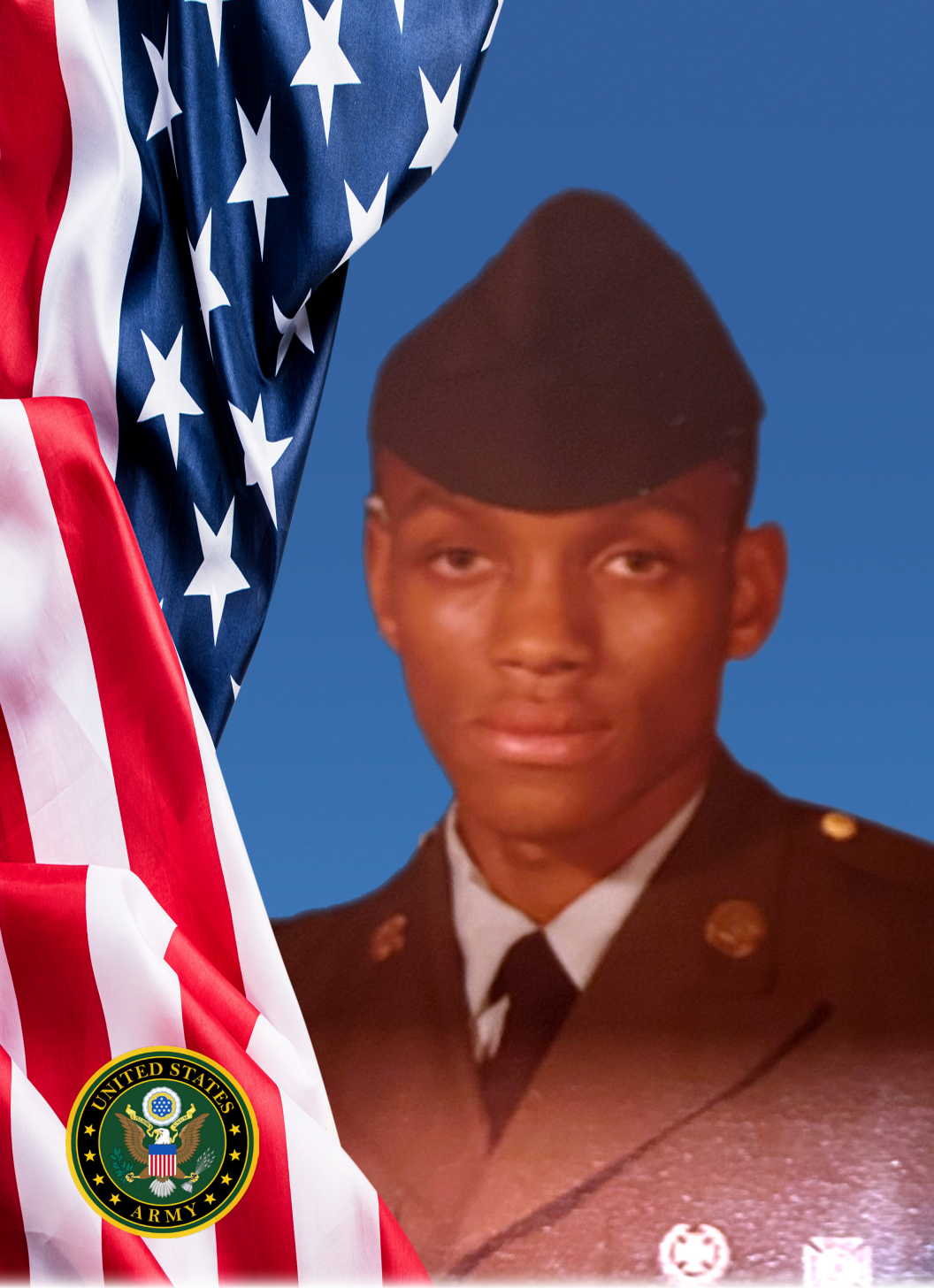




Lawrence Edward Calloway
