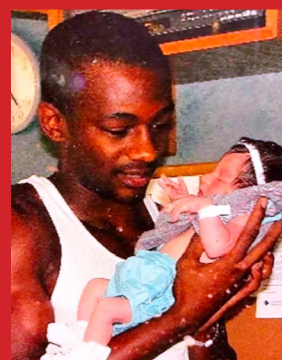
She worked as a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) for over fifty years and also held a position at the Crowell Cap Factory.
