**FUNERAL HOME IDENTIFICATION DISCLOSURE**

Our Funeral Home “Professional Code of Conduct” which states we will interact with the families we serve in a compassionate, honest and responsible manner is the basis for our funeral home identification policy.

Our Funeral Home Identification Policy requires absolute positive physical identification of the deceased in every case where identification by viewing is possible. This identification must be signed by the next of kin of the deceased or the deceased families designated legal representative. This signed statement is acknowledging absolute positive identification of the deceased by the identifying next of kin family member or the families designated legal representative.

The next of kin or their representative acknowledges that they may be exposing themselves to unprepared remains of a deceased family member. They will also hold harmless the funeral home and any of its officers, directors or employees as a result of the identification. The funeral home takes no responsibility for any physical, biological or anatomical abnormalities in regards to the deceased. Universal precautions will be taken at all times in regards to the handling of human remains. If the death is a result of a contagious disease, Federal, State and local Town Health officials may prohibit the physical identification process to control the exposure and reduce the possibility of an epidemic.
