

MAUSOLEUM CASKET REQUIREMENTS

If a casket is to be entombed (or placed) in a crypt, then we require the person to be embalmed. There are restrictions on the type of casket allowed within the mausoleum.

Any casket in the eco-friendly, biodegradable, or green burial category is not permitted within the mausoleum including wood pine box, wicker basket caskets. Homemade caskets are also not permitted.

Caskets exceeding exterior measurements of 83" L x 28" W x 24" H will not be permitted. Oversize caskets are not acceptable within the mausoleum.

Caskets made of hardwood, 18-gauge steel, 20-gauge steel, copper, bronze, and stainless steel are permitted for entombment within the mausoleum.

MAUSOLEUM URN REQUIREMENTS

An urn is required when cremated remains are placed in the mausoleum. There are restrictions on the size and type of urns allowed based on the size of niche that is purchased.

Types of urns are also restricted, especially in the glass front niches. Please confirm with families whether they purchased a glass or granite niche.

<u>Granite Front Niches</u> – Bronze, Copper, Cultured Marble, Wood, Natural Marble, Natural Granite, Glass, and Ceramic urns will be permitted. *No temporary containers are allowed in a niche.*

<u>Glass Front Niches</u> – Bronze, Natural Marble (not cultured marble), Ceramic, Natural Granite, and Glass urns will be permitted. *No temporary containers are allowed in a niche.*

Note: We want to ensure 100 years from now, the urns that are placed in a glass front niche today will remain intact. Wood and Cultured Marble will not last long.
