To help address this developing public health concern, we have instituted specific precautionary measures to help lessen the spread of the virus by:

- Increasing the frequency of deep cleaning our entire facility per CDC guidelines.
- Working with our families to adjust service times and following limitations to attendees as directed by state and local authorities.
- Offering expanded arrangement planning options through online, phone, and email while continuing to meet the needs of the families we serve.

For now, here are some things you should know:
