







Bishop Simeon Watson Sr. was born on May 23, 1950, to the late Willie and Audrey Watson in South Miami Hospital. Raised in Ojus, Florida and better known as "Butch", he attended Rainbow Park Elementary School, integrated Ojus Elementary School, John F. Kennedy Junior High School and graduated from North Miami Senior High School in 1968. He became a Certified Master Auto Mechanic at Sheridan Technical College in 1971. He accepted the Lord as his Savior and was called by God in 1974 to preach the Gospel. In October of 1975 he was ordained as a Minister at Welcome Missionary Baptist Church in Ojus and was anointed Evangelist at the Pentecostal Church of God under the late Bishop Charles Harris. In September of 1979 he established the Pentecostal Church of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in Perrine, Florida. He Earned his Master of Theology Degree in 1982 and Doctor of Divinity Degree in 1986 from the Follow Peace Seminary of Shelby, North Carolina. He founded an orphanage, school, and church in Piyon, Haiti in 1989.

On Tuesday, June 14, 2022, Bishop Simeon Watson Sr. transitioned into eternity. He will be greatly missed by his wife of 51 years, Minister Elaine Thaggard Watson. Of this union they have two sons: Deacon Simeon Watson Jr. (Deaconess Jacquelyne Watson) and Minister Jonathan Watson; three grandchildren: Bailey Chelan Watson, Simeon Watson III, and Simone Faith Watson; Brother: Willie Watson Jr.; Dear Cousin: Florene Roma; God Son: Michael Anesto, and a host of other relatives, church family and friends.
