As a brother Darrell was a jokester to his sister Tracey, always telling jokes. He was an all-around brother that made time to help with his sisters son. He posed trivia questions to his sister Tracey and expected her to have the answers whenever he called, in return, she would be serenaded wrong by him. As a brother to Michael, Darrell enjoyed discussions about their favorite sports teams as well as sharing their mechanical knowledge that they learned from their father. He was a PHENOMENAL BROTHER.

A LETTER TO MY HUBBY, AKA

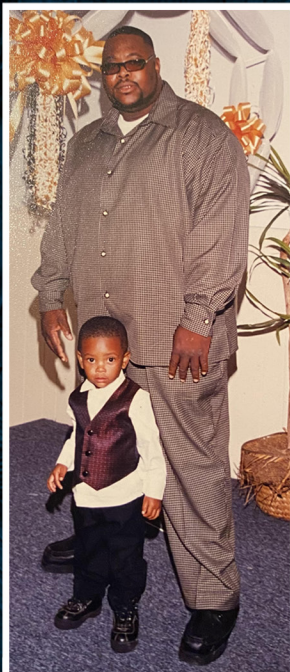
"The Love of my Life"

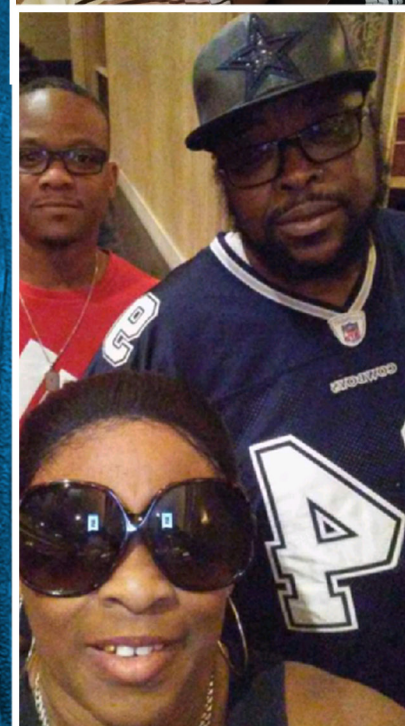
A LETTER TO MY FATHER
