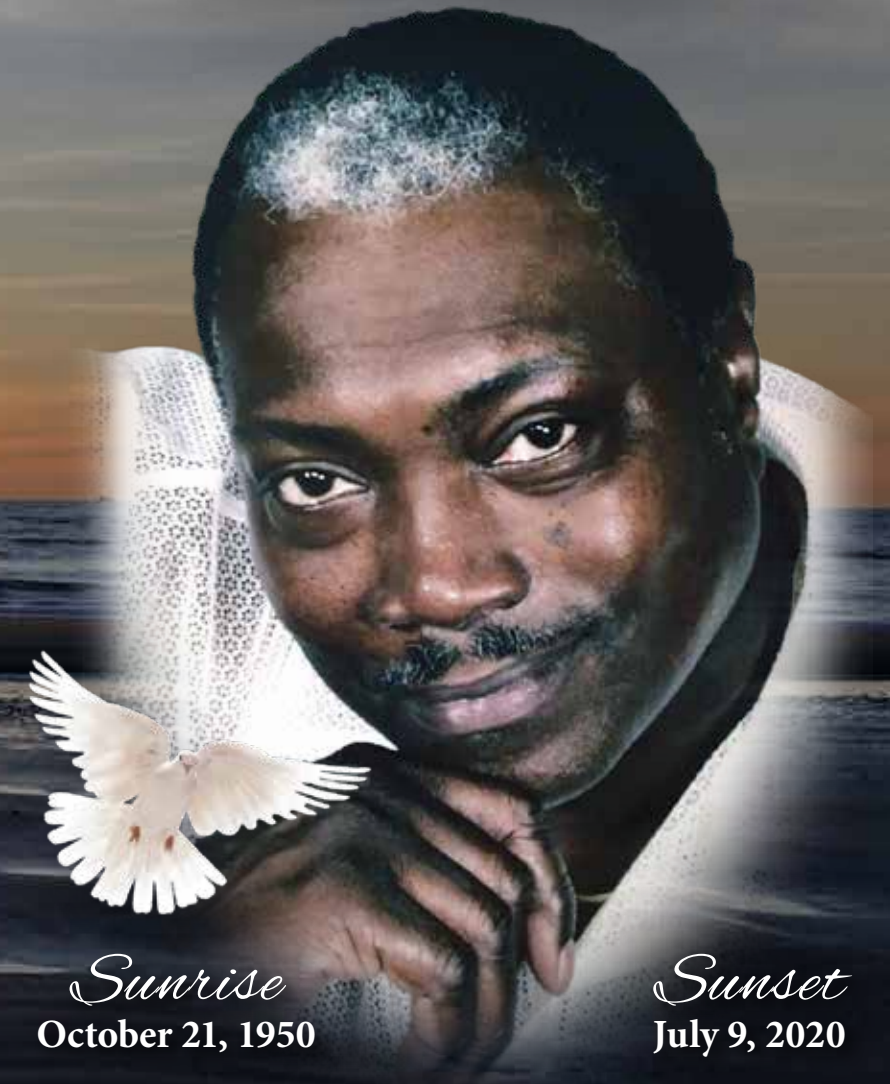

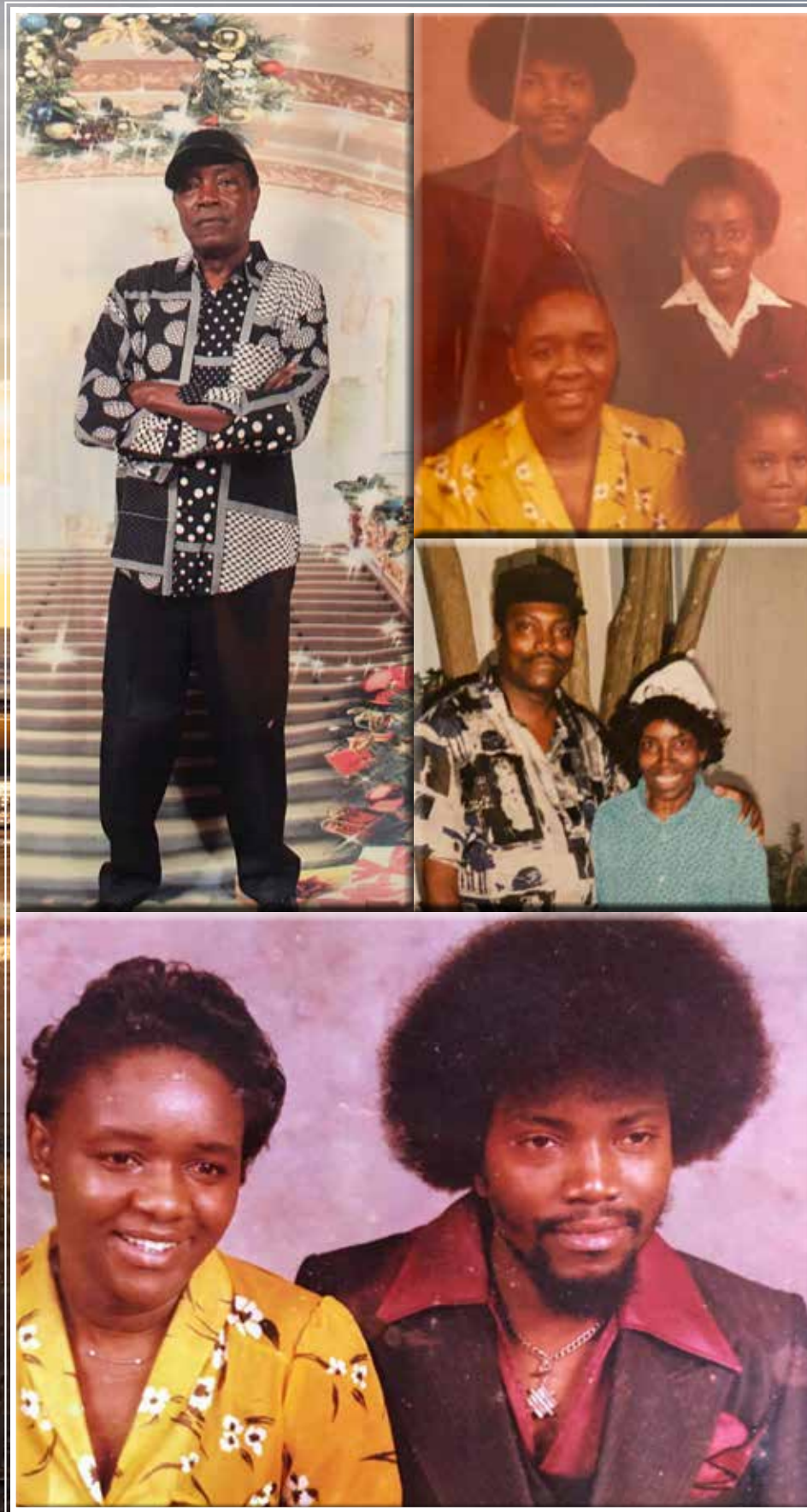
Lamar was preceded in death by his brother, James Inman, mother, Ruby Lee Freeman, and his grandparents.
