Johnny Wayne Harris, 70, of Lonoke passed from this life on October 9, 2021, at his home. He was born May 7, 1951, in North Little Rock to the late John R. and Jewell K. (DuVall) Harris. Mr. Harris served his country in the United States Army and attended Cornerstone Worship Center. He was a true cowboy at heart. He loved his Lord, his family, his county, and his animals. Johnny was a hard-working man who took vacation from his job to work on his farm. In August 1998 he was involved in a hay baling accident.
