# Celebrating The Life of A True Woman of God

**Constnola Jones**, affectionately known as “Nola”, was born June 10, 1932 in Shuqualak, Mississippi to Tommie Lee and Zeddie Causley Poe. They later relocated to Mound Bayou, MS. where she and nine other siblings were raised. Both parents, her three brothers Tommie, James, Myles and her four sisters Fannie, Christine, Lucille, and Ora D., and her daughter Linda Pacheco preceded her in death.

In 1959, she was united in holy matrimony to Edward Jones Sr. who also preceded her in death.

During her childhood years, Nola attended Mound Bayou Elementary and Mound Bayou High School. After graduating, she moved to Chicago and soon after arriving, she attended cosmetology college where she became a licensed beautician. In addition to her career as a beautician, she also worked for Maywood School District for many years. Later on in life, and her desire to help others, led to a career as a Certified Nurses Assistant with LaGrange Community Services where she remained a dedicated employee until her retirement.
