Sherian Shyann Coley Hunter passed peacefully in her sleep on Sunday, May 3, 2020.

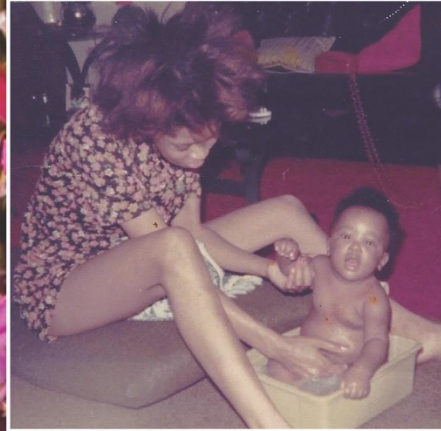

In September 2006, she suffered a major stroke which would render her wheel-chair bound for the next 13 years. She was very symbolic and often told you she did everything in 3's since she had three children. If you bought her ice cream, she asked that you buy 3. Her affinity for the number 3 even passed on to her children, with Andre and Brittney both having 3 children as well.

On Sunday, May 3rd she danced to her resting place in the sweet by and by. Not one to be outdone even by death, Mrs. Sherian Hunter departed this life on the 3rd day of the month with 3 letters: May.
