



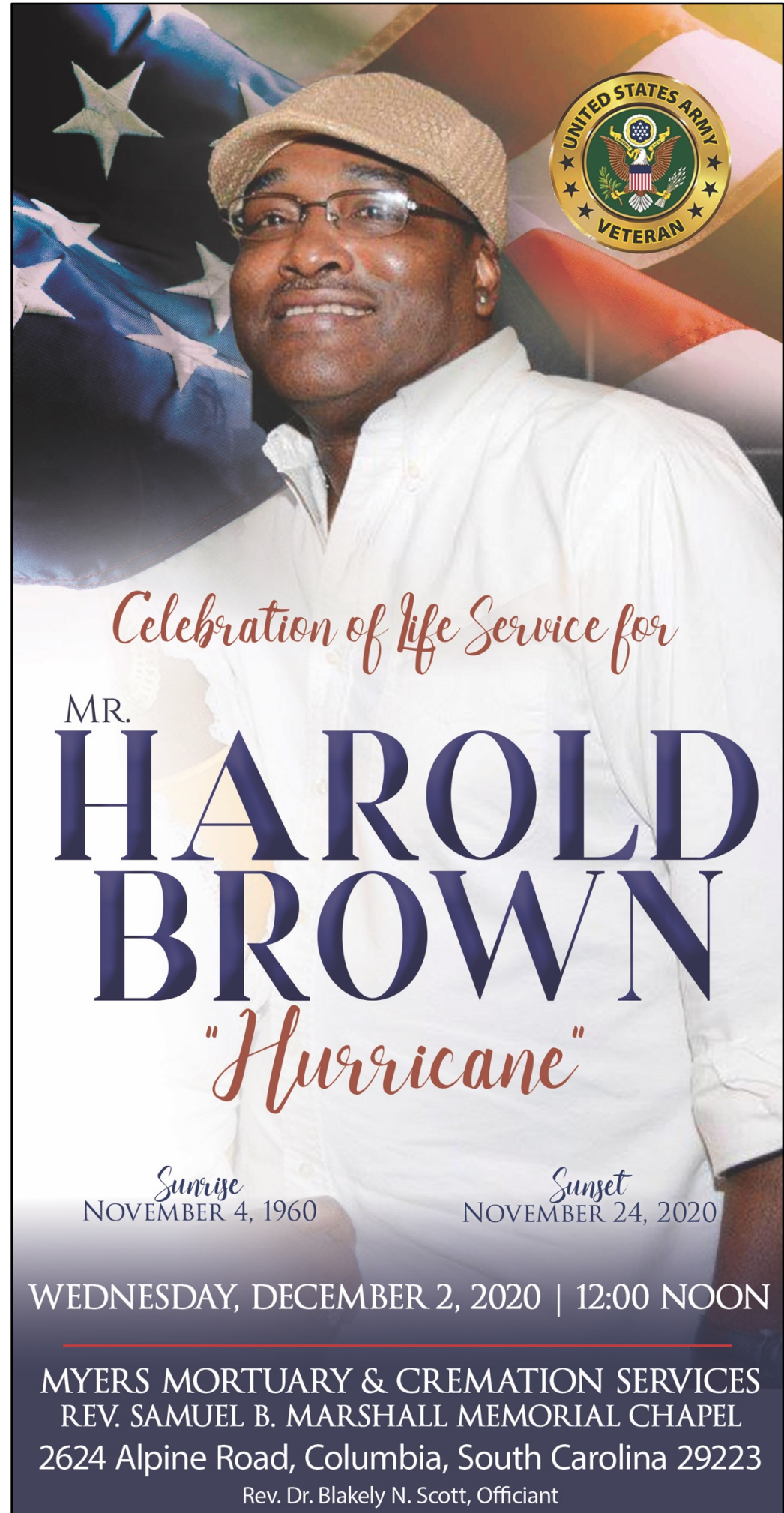

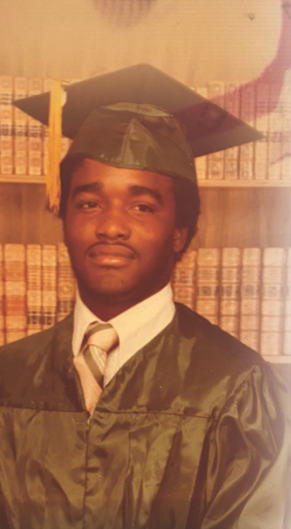
After his years of service in the Army, he was employed for years as an engineer at Michelin, Colonial Life, Solectron/Flextronics, and Dorn VA Medical Center.
