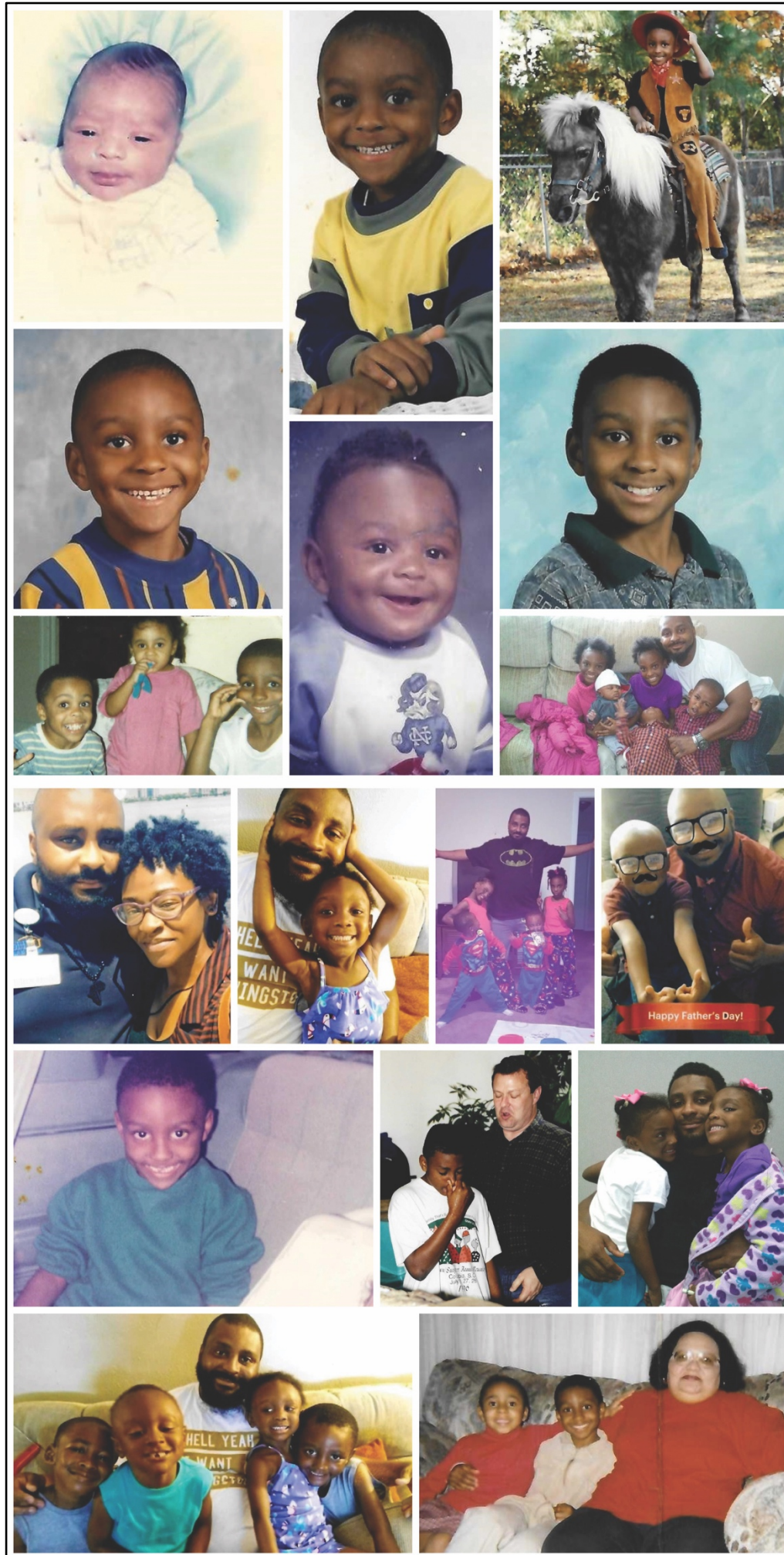
Jeffery was baptized at the age of thirteen at Christian Life Church by Pastor Stephen Chitty.
